To attend, your school must pre-register for Education Day by Wednesday, November 24th.

LOGISTICS

Pre-Registration: All schools wishing to attend must pre-register in advance by Wednesday, November 24th.

Each school must provide the number of attendees that will be present. Attendee numbers may be updated up until the registration deadline. Beyond the deadline, Vanderbilt Athletics will not be able to accommodate additional attendees. Please be sure to include teachers and chaperones in the registration number. Parking: Free bus and car parking will be available for all schools. For schools that are bringing buses, please make sure buses are properly labeled for your specific school. Free car parking will be available in the 25th Ave Garage (2401 Highland Ave, Nashville, TN 37212). Buses will enter Natchez Trace from the 31st St/Blakemore and Natchez Trace intersection and will travel north on Natchez Trace, where buses will be directed by VUPD and Vanderbilt staff members.

Bus Drop Off: Any school providing bus transportation for their students will be required to sign up for a specific drop off time. Drop off times will be organized into 15-minute intervals from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. Drop off times are important for ease of drop off and entry into the venue. If there are students coming on their own, additional accommodations will need to be made. Please be sure to indicate on the registration form any additional accommodations. At the bus drop off location, a Vanderbilt liaison will meet with each school and walk the school from the bus to their assigned seating location in the venue.

Bus Pick Up: Please specify on the sign-up form what time your school will need to leave the venue. The game will conclude approximately at 1 p.m. Schools will be dismissed 15 minutes before your indicated time to ensure your school has enough time to return to your buses. Further pick up details will be communicated closer to the game date.

Seating: Each school will have specific assigned seating locations. Seat locations will be communicated with each school in advance, along with additional details for the day. COVID-19 protocols will be considered while creating the seat map. Please be sure the numbers registered for schools are accurate for seating map purposes. If any student, teacher, or chaperone needs accommodations, please be sure to communicate that in advance and indicate on the registration form.

Tickets: There is no physical ticket required to gain entry into Education Day for registered schools. By registering, schools confirm their number of admittees. A Vanderbilt liaison will meet each school upon arrival and lead them to their assigned seating locations inside Memorial Gymnasium. All students must be accompanied by chaperones and adhere to the proper chaperone to student ratio set by Vanderbilt University of 1 adult per 8 students ages 6-8, and 1 adult per 10 students, ages 9-14.

Lunches: As a special exception for Education Day, attendees will be permitted to bring in one lunch per person. Lunches must be stored at your seat location and refrigerators are not available. In addition, concession stands will be open on the concourse for fans wishing to purchase concessions items. If additional accommodations are needed, please specify in the special accommodations section on the registration form.

School Identification: Attendees are encouraged to wear school specific shirts or nametags so that Vanderbilt staff can properly identify attendees from each school.

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

Vanderbilt Athletics will adhere to all COVID-19 protocols set by Vanderbilt University that are current on the day of the event. When updates are available, Vanderbilt Athletics will communicate all necessary information to the primary contacts for each school.

Currently, as of October 1, 2021, Vanderbilt University has the following COVID-19 protocols:
In accordance with the CDC and specific k-12 guidance, all visitors and Vanderbilt University students, faculty, and staff engaging with minors are required to wear a face mask all times when indoors. Masks may be taken off temporarily to consume food or drink.

Vanderbilt University requires the following student-to-chaperone ratios for Education Day:

Ages 6-8 years – 1 adult per 8 students

Ages 9-14 – 1 adult per 10 students
