- 3. PUT BAND AROUND YOUR HEAD TO MEASURE. TAPE OVERLAPPING ENDS TOGETHER.

Meet the 'ākohekohe

- The 'ākohekohe is also known as Palmeria dolei by those who study birds.
- They live on Maui and are found nowhere else in the world!
- Their body is black-gray, with silver flecks on the face and upper breast, orange flecks on the back and flanks, white-tipped tails, wingtips and crest, and bright orange napes and eye patches. They have a prominent silver-gray crest.
- 'Ākohekohe fiercely defend nectar sources and are often seen chasing other birds out of 'ōhi'a trees.
- Their most common song is an upslurred two-note whistle. Other calls include the low, guttural, "peter-peter gluk gluk" and "AH-kohay-kohay."
