Rte. 7 Liquor:

Please note that Route 7 Liquor deliveries will now take place on Mondays and Wednesdays.

Resident gatherings in lounges:

Do all participants need to be residents of that building?

Answer: No. Any residents from any neighborhoods can use lounges. They are not restricted on only residents from that neighborhood.

Leaving campus to walk/bike but campus is closed? Which is it?

It's actually both. The campus is closed to visitors and we are asking residents to stay on campus with the exceptions of walking down to Meach Cove (not driving there) and biking along back country roads (but no stopping at the local creemee stand or roadside vegetable stand). If you'd like to drive down to the end of Wake Robin Drive and park in the staging area to walk over to Meach Cove, that would be fine. But no driving off campus unless you are going to a preauthorized appointment (Meagan is the person to contact to get permission to leave).

Tennis Court status:

Someone asked if the tennis courts could be opened. We first need to do the spring maintenance on them. We don't have a date from the contractor yet, but will share with you as soon as we do.
