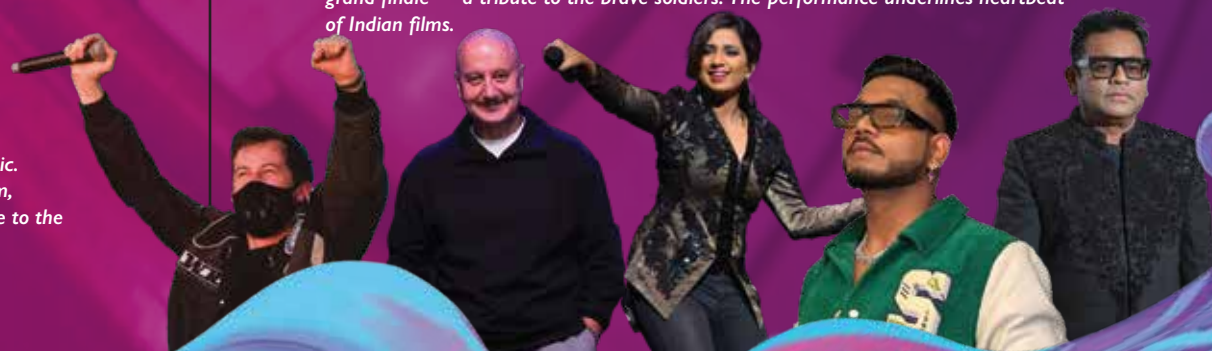

Choliya from Uttarakhand adds vigour to wedding rituals, Gudum Baja from Madhya Pradesh accompanies the Karma dance with rhythmic beats, and Siddhi Dhamal from Gujarat elevates the vibrant heritage of the Siddhi community. Together, these performances offer a powerful glimpse into the depth and richness of India's cultural traditions.

This dance is a key cultural tradition, honoring deities and seeking blessings.

SRI LANKA

MOHINIATTAM PRESENTATION

Mohiniattam, the classical dance form of Kerala, is the dance of Mohini, the female enchantress avatar of Vishnu, who helps the devas or gods to prevail over the asuras or demons, using her feminine charm. Presented by Nalanda Dance Research Centre, Mumbai.

SACRED STEPS OF SOUTHERN INDIA

Jasmine Hall 2, 9.30 am, 25 min

Experience the spiritual vibrance of Pooja Kunitha from Karnataka, a ritual dance featuring symbolic offerings to Shakti, accompanied by expressive props and movements. In contrast, Thiruvathirakali from Kerala enchants with its graceful women's circle dance around a lamp, showcasing the spirit of Onam. Together, these dances beautifully blend devotion, tradition, and the power of community.

THE SOUL OF ODISHA

Jasmine Hall 3, 9.30 am, 25 min

Immerse yourself in the beauty of one of the iconic Indian classical dance forms. Odissi, from Odisha, takes you through ancient temple rituals and Hindu mythology with its fluid movements, intricate footwork, and expressive hand gestures, beautifully presented by Swapnaloka Dasgupta.

THE DIVINE AND THE LIVING

Jasmine Hall 2, 10:55 am, 25 min

Step into the divine world of Sattriya Dance, a classical art form from Assam, established by the Vaishnava saint Mahapurush Sankaradeva and meticulously preserved by the Vaishnava community, known as Sattras. Known for its religious depth and intricate movements, this dance invites you to experience its spiritual essence. Adi School of Dance, Pune, brings this ancient tradition to life with grace and precision.

THE SACRED AND THE CHERISHED

Jasmine Hall 3, 11:40 am, 10 min

Experience the vibrant energy of two unique Indian dance traditions. Waghya Murali from Maharashtra is a devotional dance that pays tribute to Lord Khandoba, with powerful movements and deep spiritual expression. In contrast, Gussadi from Telangana captivates with its dynamic feathered costumes, as Raj Gond men perform this lively dance during Diwali.

TRADITION IN MOTION

Jasmine Hall 2, 12.15 am, 10 min

A vibrant glimpse into India's rich and diverse folk traditions, this segment begins with the rhythms of Tamang Selo from Sikkim — a high-spirited exploration brought alive through traditional instruments and vibrant attire. It transitions to the graceful elegance of Bhavai from Rajasthan, where women perform astonishing feats of balance by dancing with multiple pots on their heads. The segment culminates with the fierce and powerful Dandpatta from Maharashtra, a martial art dance showcasing the warrior spirit of the Marathas through the use of a flexible sword. Moving seamlessly from festivity to finesse and finally to fierce valour, these performances together reflect the depth and dynamism of India's living heritage.

FROM MASKS TO FLAMES

Jasmine Hall 2, 1:15 pm, 10 min

Singh Chham is the dance of the mythical snow lion, performed by the men of the Bhutia tribe, in the white costume of the snow lion, with a mane hued in turquoise. The dance was introduced by the third Chogyal of Sikkim, in the 18th century. Nzanta is a vibrant folk dance, usually performed by women of the Lotha Naga tribe of Nagaland. This post-harvest dance is a thanksgiving to the gods for blessings through the year. The sequence concludes with Jhijiyi, a powerful ritual dance from Bihar and Jharkhand, a ritualistic dance invoking divine protection through mesmerizing movements and fire-lit pots. Together, these performances offer a spiritual and cultural immersion into India's deeply rooted storytelling traditions.

FESTIVE FOOTSTEPS OF WESTERN INDIA

Jasmine Hall 1, 4:00 pm, 10 min

Embrace the vibrant spirit of western India with two captivating dance forms. The mesmerising Kalbelia of Rajasthan enchants with its intricate twirls and graceful movements. At the same time, Garba from Gujarat brings festive energy through rhythmic circle dances, colourful attire, and synchronised steps during Navratri. Together, they offer an expression of tradition, rhythm, and community.

SPIRITED STEPS, MARTIAL MIGHT
