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# Improving the reporting system of the WHO FCTC

# **Report by the Convention Secretariat**

### **Purpose of the document**

The present report describes the work carried out under the guidance of the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties (COP) to the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (WHO FCTC) to improve the reporting system of the WHO FCTC. The present report contains a proposal to improve the reporting system, including in relation to the reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC (which would apply as of the next reporting cycle).

#### **Action by the Conference of the Parties**

The COP is invited to note the present report, consider the proposed revised reporting instrument for the WHO FCTC contained in Annex 2 and adopt the draft decision contained in Annex 3 of the present report.

#### **BACKGROUND**

- 1. Article 21 of the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (WHO FCTC) requires that Parties submit to the Conference of the Parties (COP) to the WHO FCTC, through the Convention Secretariat, periodic reports on their implementation of the Convention. The article provides a list of items that should be included in the periodic reports of Parties. It also stipulates that "the frequency and format of such reports by all Parties shall be determined by the Conference of the Parties".
- 2. The reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC was established in 2006, following decision FCTC/COP1(14), which described the proposed approach to reporting by Parties, including data collection and the analysis of data. The first global progress report on the implementation of the Convention, based on the first set of reports submitted by the Parties, was published by the Convention Secretariat in 2007.
- 3. Since 2006, the reporting system of the Convention has evolved significantly in format, content and process, based on feedback from Parties, a series of COP decisions, and guidance from the Bureau of the COP.
- 4. In 2019, an external audit of the Convention Secretariat operations encouraged the Convention Secretariat to consider the integration of a quality assurance framework in the reporting system of the WHO FCTC, with a view to improving the quality of the collected data.
- 5. Further to the Ninth session of the COP (COP9), the Bureau of the COP requested the Convention Secretariat to review the reporting system of the WHO FCTC, with the aim of:
  - (a) decreasing the reporting burden on the Parties;
  - (b) implementing a quality assurance framework for the WHO FCTC to improve the quality of data collected;
  - (c) better tailoring the collection of data to the current needs of the COP and its subsidiary bodies;
  - (d) exploiting synergies with other relevant official public data sources; and
  - (e) increasing the focus on the monitoring the indicators in the Global Strategy to *Accelerate Tobacco Control: Advancing Sustainable Development through the Implementation of the WHO FCTC 2019–2025*.
- 6. The present report contains a description of the experience with reporting under the WHO FCTC and a summary of the work carried out by the Convention Secretariat under the guidance of the Bureau to review the reporting system of the WHO FCTC, with a view to improving it. The present report also includes a proposed revised reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC and a corresponding reporting process.

#### EXPERIENCE WITH REPORTING UNDER THE WHO FCTC

- 7. The current reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC consists of a core questionnaire and a voluntary module called "additional questions".
- 8. The core questionnaire of the WHO FCTC consists of more than 300 questions and 11 tables. Since 2012, the percentage of Parties reporting within each cycle has stabilized, ranging from 72% in 2014 to 84% in 2016 and 2018, 77% in 2020, and 74% in 2023.
- 9. In addition to the fact that some Parties have not submitted the full core questionnaire in some reporting cycles, there are sections and specific questions in the core questionnaire that consistently elicit a low number of responses, (for example, tobacco use by ethnic groups, the percentage of illicit tobacco products in the market and prices of tobacco products). In addition, in some cases, there are concerns with the quality of reported data or data are provided in different formats or are quantified differently. Such data do not provide a reliable basis for analysis to inform COP decision-making.
- 10. The "additional questions" were added in 2014 pursuant to decision FCTC/COP5(11) and include over 275 questions. In successive reporting cycles since 2014, the percentage of Parties that completed the "additional questions" ranged from 1.7% to 12%.

#### REVIEW OF THE REPORTING SYSTEM OF THE WHO FCTC

- 11. The Convention Secretariat identified several areas of work to be undertaken in reviewing the reporting system of the WHO FCTC, including: (a) an internal review of the reporting system, including a comparison to explore overlapping items and potential for synergies with the data collection process for the World Health Organization (WHO) report on the global tobacco epidemic; (b) a review of potential official external sources of data that could be used to assess global progress in the implementation of the Convention; (c) the organization of a stakeholder consultation; and (d) the development of a revised reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC and a corresponding reporting process.
- 12. Should the proposed revised reporting instrument (questionnaire) and reporting process be adopted at the Tenth session of the COP, the Convention Secretariat would: (a) develop a new online reporting platform, incorporating the reporting questionnaire and features to make the platform as user-friendly as possible; (b) conduct pilot testing of the updated platform with a few interested Parties; and (c) further adjust and finalize the questionnaire and platform for use in the next reporting cycle.

#### Internal review of the reporting system of the WHO FCTC

13. The Convention Secretariat conducted the internal review of the reporting system of the WHO FCTC. The review consolidated observations on the reporting instrument and process from the Convention Secretariat, WHO colleagues with technical and data collection expertise, and WHO FCTC Knowledge Hubs, as well as comments submitted by Parties as part of their regular implementation reports. During the review, the Convention Secretariat engaged closely with WHO colleagues, as one of the aims of the review was to further harmonize the WHO FCTC and WHO data collection processes. The review also explored possible improvements to the reporting process and the requirements of an updated online reporting platform.

- 14. The review resulted in several findings: many questions in the reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC could be edited to improve clarity; several open-ended questions could be deleted; out-of-date questions (due to an evolution in evidence and tobacco control policies) could be deleted or replaced; some sections of the reporting instrument could be reordered; indicators from the Global Strategy could be better captured; key questions from the "additional questions" could be integrated into the core questionnaire and the use of "additional questions" discontinued; and the reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC could be better harmonized with data collected for the WHO report on the global tobacco epidemic.
- 15. The Convention Secretariat draws attention to the fact that, since the transition to the COP session-bound reporting cycles in 2012, the reporting cycles for the WHO FCTC (and the publication of global progress reports) as well as WHO reports on the global tobacco epidemic, were scheduled on alternating years even years for WHO FCTC and odd years for WHO. The postponement of COP9 from 2020 to 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic resulted in a change in these cycles, meaning that Parties respond to two major data collection systems in the same year. This provides an opportunity to further harmonize the two data collection processes.

#### Review of official external sources of data

- 16. The Convention Secretariat has engaged with several entities collecting data relevant to tobacco control from official sources. WHO is a major source of data on tobacco use and tobacco control policies. Other sources of data, including databases, within the United Nations system identified as having some relevant data include the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO), the International Labour Organization (ILO), the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD), the United Nations Commodity Trade Statistics Database (UN Comtrade), the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO), the World Bank and the World Customs Organization (WCO). The Convention Secretariat held discussions with relevant entities to understand what data they collect and what is the potential for using these data in assessing global progress in implementation of the WHO FCTC. A table listing the entities that hold data that may be relevant to sections of the reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC is contained in Annex 1 of the present report.
- 17. During the review it was observed that data collected by WHO for its report on the global tobacco epidemic could be used to assess progress in implementation of the WHO FCTC in respect of a number of Convention articles. Considering that Parties to the WHO FCTC contribute to that report and validate the data sheets prepared by WHO, it may not be necessary to collect the same information through the reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC. The Convention Secretariat could obtain those data through collaboration with WHO. Such approach would reduce the reporting burden of Parties, as Parties would not need to input in the WHO FCTC reporting instrument data that had been collected by WHO. In addition, it would improve the quality of data used to assess global progress in implementation of the WHO FCTC.

#### Organization of stakeholder consultation

18. The Convention Secretariat organized a meeting on 20–21 June in Geneva, Switzerland, to consult a group of stakeholders with expertise and relevant experience in collecting data, as well as a good understanding of reporting under the WHO FCTC, on the proposal to improve the reporting system of the WHO FCTC. The outcome of the meeting contributed to further refining the proposed revised reporting instrument and process.

#### Proposed revised reporting instrument and reporting process of the WHO FCTC

- 19. In light of the above considerations, a proposed revised reporting system of the WHO FCTC would accommodate the following amendments.
- 20. In relation to the reporting instrument, it is proposed that:
  - (a) a revised reporting instrument (questionnaire) be adopted to collect data from the Parties on their progress in implementation of the Convention, in accordance with Article 21 of the Convention, as presented in Annex 2 of the present report;
  - (b) the use of "additional questions", as a separate questionnaire, be discontinued;
  - (c) data from official external sources, as presented in Annex 1 of the present report, with special regard to those collected by WHO, be used for assessing global progress in implementation of the WHO FCTC;
  - (d) information that is collected by WHO during the data collection process for the biennial WHO reports on the global tobacco epidemic should not be collected in the WHO FCTC reporting instrument but obtained by the Convention Secretariat for analysis from WHO; and
  - (e) Parties continue to report on information that is not collected by WHO.
- 21. The reporting instrument contained in Annex 2 presents the proposed revised questions that would be included in the new online reporting platform to be completed by the Parties in the successive reporting cycles. In addition, Annex 2 contains a list of items/questions/indicators for which information is collected by WHO as part of the data collection process for WHO reports on the global tobacco epidemic; it is proposed that this information also be used to assess global progress in implementation of the Convention, thus ensuring that the same information is not collected twice from the Parties.
- 22. In relation to the reporting process, should the COP adopt the proposed revised reporting instrument, it is proposed that the revised questionnaire be built into a new online reporting platform, which is more user-friendly and responds better to the needs of Parties with unstable internet connectivity. Interested Parties would be invited to test the platform in 2024, with a view to adjusting it as necessary and making it available for Parties to use in the next reporting cycle.

### ACTION BY THE CONFERENCE OF THE PARTIES

23. The COP is invited to note the present report, consider the list of official external data sources that could be relevant to the reporting system of the WHO FCTC contained in Annex 1, as well the proposed revised reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC contained in Annex 2, and adopt the draft decision contained in Annex 3 of the present report.

  - Closed system disposables: tax inclusive retail sales price (TIRSP) factory (gate)/ CIF price, specific excise, ad valorem excise, value added tax, import duty, other tax, total tax
  - Open system refillable: tax inclusive retail sales price (TIRSP); factory (gate)/CIF price, specific excise, ad valorem excise, value added tax, import duty, other tax, total tax

## Supplementary tax information

- Is the excise tax applied uniformly (not tiered)?
- If an ad valorem or mixed excise tax system is applied, is there a minimum specific tax?
- Do you have automatic adjustments to your excise tax rate on regular intervals?
- A minimum price is applied

- Is tax revenue data for all tobacco products or cigarettes only?
- Year, total excise (specific and ad valorem), value added tax (VAT) and other sales taxes, import duties, other taxes, total, currency

## **Article 8 (Protection from exposure to tobacco smoke)**

#### Smoke-free environments

- Complete smoke-free laws exist in the following places:
  - Health-care facilities (indoor and outdoor)
  - Educational facilities except universities (indoor and outdoor)
  - Universities (indoor and outdoor)
  - Government facilities (indoor and outdoor)
  - Offices and workplaces (indoor and outdoor)
  - Restaurants (indoor and outdoor)
  - Cafés, pubs and bars (indoor and outdoor)
  - Public transport: land transport (trains, taxis, buses, metros and trams), air transport (planes), water transport (boats, ferries and vessels), airports (indoor), indoor waiting areas of public transport (stations, platforms, etc.), outdoor waiting areas of public transport (stations, platforms and bus stops, etc.)
  - Other indoor public places: hotels (main areas and rooms), prisons, shops (supermarkets, other shops, etc.), cultural facilities (museums, libraries and cinemas etc.), private vehicles with children under 18, any other indoor areas
  - Outdoor areas where people cannot choose to change their location (stadiums, seated events and queues)
  - National laws ban tobacco smoking in areas in order to protect children (playgrounds, amusement parks, etc.)

## **Enforcement**

- Funds dedicated for enforcement

- How many health warnings are approved by the law?
- Does the law require or establish fines for violations regarding health warnings on packages?
- Are there any laws requiring that tobacco packaging and labelling do not use misleading terms which imply the product is less harmful than other similar products, such as "low tar", "light", "ultra-light", or "mild"?

Are there any laws requiring that tobacco packaging and labelling do not use figurative or other signs, including colours or numbers, as substitutes for prohibited misleading terms and descriptors?

- Are there any laws requiring that tobacco packaging and labelling do not use descriptors depicting flavours?
- Does the law ban the display of quantitative information on emission yields (such as tar, nicotine and carbon monoxide) on tobacco packaging, including when used as part of a brand name or trademark?
- Does the law mandate the display of qualitative information on relevant constituents and emissions of tobacco products on tobacco packaging?
  - Does the law mandate that this information is displayed on one or more of the principal display areas (front, rear) of the package?
- Does the law prevent the display of expiry dates on tobacco packaging?
- Is it mandatory for the quit line number to appear on packaging or labelling?
- Does the law mandate plain packaging?

## Anti-tobacco mass media campaigns

- Name of mass media campaign
- Was this campaign national?
- Was the campaign aired on television and/or radio?
- Before the campaign, was any research about the target audience conducted or used to develop the campaign messages/materials?
- Were the campaign materials tested with the target audience before the campaign was run?
- Did you obtain air time (radio, television) and/or placement (billboards, print advertising, etc.) by purchasing or securing them using either your organization/institution's internal resources or an external media planner or agency?
- Did you, or your media planner/agency, use a monitor to confirm that the campaign materials were used as planned/scheduled on television, radio, print, billboards, internet, etc.?
- Did you work with journalists to gain publicity or coverage in the news for the campaign?
- Was an evaluation done to assess the impact of the campaign?
- Was this campaign part of a comprehensive government tobacco control programme?

## Bans on direct tobacco advertising

- National TV and radio

# DRAFT DECISION: IMPROVING THE REPORTING SYSTEM OF THE WHO FCTC

The Conference of the Parties (COP),

Recalling Article 21 of the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control which stipulates that "each Party shall submit to the Conference of the Parties, through the Secretariat, periodic reports on its implementation of this Convention";

Further recalling decision FCTC/COP1(14), which provided the basis for the reporting arrangements under the WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control (WHO FCTC), as well as decisions FCTC/COP2(9), FCTC/COP3(17), FCTC/COP4(16), FCTC/COP5(11) and FCTC/COP6(15) concerning further development of the reporting instrument;

Noting document FCTC/COP/10/13, which describes experience with the reporting under the Convention and contains a proposal, developed under the guidance of the Bureau, to improve the reporting system of the WHO FCTC;

Noting also document FCTC/COP/10/4, which describes global progress in implementation of the WHO FCTC,

- 1. DECIDES: to adopt the revised reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC, contained in Annex 2 of document FCTC/COP/10/13;
- 2. REQUESTS the Convention Secretariat:
  - (a) to develop a new online reporting platform by incorporating the revised reporting instrument and features to make the platform as user-friendly as possible, and further testing it with the Parties, so that it may be used as of the next reporting cycle;
  - (b) to invite Parties to complete and submit their implementation reports, accordingly, in the period announced by the Convention Secretariat;
  - (c) to collaborate with the World Health Organization (WHO) to obtain data collected for the biennial WHO reports on the global tobacco epidemic to complement the information collected through the reporting instrument of the WHO FCTC in the assessment of progress in implementation of the WHO FCTC by the Parties;
  - (d) to continue reviewing official external sources of data that are relevant to tobacco control, with a view to exploring how such data may best inform the assessment of progress in the implementation of the WHO FCTC by the Parties.
