


## **Bobbin Head Track**

(Darug Country)











This walk from the Turramurra entry to Ku-ring-gai Chase National Park, this is an alternative way to get down to Bobbin Head. This walk mostly follows the old road down to Bobbin Head, starting along the flat management trail with its red dirt and high heath. About halfway along, the track becomes steeper as it winds down the hill, and then joins up with a bush track leading through the rocks to Warrimoo Track, which you then follow to Bobbin Head. Let us begin by acknowledging the Darug people, Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.

Gradient	Short steep hills (3/6)
Signage	Directional signs along the way (3/6)
Infrastructure	Limited facilities, not all cliffs are fenced (3/6)
Experience Required	Some bushwalking experience recommended (3/6)
Weather	Weather generally has little impact on safety (1/6)

Getting to the start: From Ku-Ring-Gai Chase Road Offramp

- Turn on to Ku-Ring-Gai Chase Road Offramp then drive for 10.5 km
- Turn sharp left onto Bobbin Head Trail and drive for another 4 m


## Before you start any journey ensure you;


- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning

- · Are healthy and fit enough for this journey


If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.














**Getting started:** From Bobbin Head Road, about 100 north of the toll booth, the walk follows the 'Bobbin Head Track' sign up through the metal gate and along the dirt management trail for a short while to the signposted intersection of the 'Sphinx track' (a management trail).







After another 85 m (at the intersection of Bobbin Head Trail & Sphinx Trail) **continue straight**, to head along Bobbin Head Trail.

After another 550 m (at the intersection of Jacombs Trail & Bobbin Head Trail) **continue straight**, to head along Bobbin Head Trail.

After another 335 m (from the Bobbin Head Trail) **continue straight**, to head along Bobbin Head Trail.

After another 225 m (from the Bobbin Head Trail) **continue straight**, to head along Bobbin Head Trail.

After another 250 m (from the Bobbin Head Trail) **continue straight**, to head along Bobbin Head Trail.

After another 160 m find the "Bobbin Head Track Aboriginal Engraving Site" (15 m on your left).



The Bobbin Head Track Aboriginal Engraving Site, is signposted off the side of the old Bobbin Head Road and is home to a series of engravings on a sandstone rock platform. The engravings are behind a series timber log barriers designed to reduce further wear on these faint engravings, please stay off the engravings area. If you look carefully you may see the engravings of a wallaby, gliding possum, bird, goanna the Information board also shows there are two emus.

After another 1.4 km (from the Bobbin Head Trail) **veer left** (a walking track).

After another 105 m (from the Bobbin Head Trail) continue straight.

After another 160 m (from the Bobbin Head Trail) veer left (a walking track).

After another 45 m (from the Bobbin Head Trail) **turn left**, to head along Bobbin Head Trail (a vehicle track).

After another 55 m (from the Bobbin Head Trail) **turn right**.

After another 20 m (from the Bobbin Head Trail) **turn right**, to head along Bobbin Head Trail.

After another 180 m (from the Bobbin Head Trail) **veer right** (a walking track).





After another 40 m find the "Empire Marina - Galley Foods cafe" (20 m on your right).



Empire Marina, in Ku-Ring-Gai Chase National Park, provides facilities and services for people on boats and on foot. The marina is home to "Galley Foods" kiosk and restaurant. The kiosk provides a variety of food priced between \$4-\$16, and is open from 8:30am to 5pm seven days. The restaurant requires reservations, and is open for lunch Thurs-Mon, breakfast on the weekend, and in dinner on Fridays and Saturdays in summer. Phone 9457 0477 Then pass the toilet (10 m on your right).







About 35 m past the end is "Bobbin Inn Cafe".



At the centre of Bobbin Head picnic area, in the old 'Bobbin Inn' building, is a cafe offering inside and outdoor dining, and a range of foods and drinks. Food includes fish and chips, wraps, focaccia, sandwiches and snack foods. Tea, coffee and cold drinks are also on offer. Opening hours are 9 - 4pm Mon to Fri (closed Tuesdays) & 9 - 5pm weekends. For more information, phone the cafe on 9457 7170. The NPWS Bobbin Head Information Centre is open 7 days a week (closed Christmas Day) 10 - 4pm (closed 12 - 12:30pm lunch). Ramp access available on the southwestern corner of the building. Ramp access to the information centre through the cafe.
