


Meelup Reserve Trail










Starting from the car park on Hurford Street, Dunsborough, this walk takes you past Curtis Bay, Castle Rock, Castle Bay, Meelup Beach, Point Picquet, and Eagle Bay via the Meelup Reserve Trail. Linking Dunsborough to Eagle Bay, the 7.8km Meelup Reserve Trail leads walkers along the coast to beautiful secluded beaches and impressive granite rock formations. Almost all of the beaches here are well-known, and their crystal clear waters are one of the main reasons for that. Small reefs and rocky outcrops provide good snorkelling opportunities. In spring, there are heaps of wildflowers and animals. Numerous vantage points along the way allow you to view whales, mainly from September to December. There are multiple turn-offs in the first kilometres of the walk that take you to small and relatively secluded beaches. One of the main highlights of the walk is the imposing Castle Rock. Further on the trail lies Castle Bay, with Sail Rock to the west and Castle Rock to the east. Those features combined with the panoramic ocean view makes this place quite picturesque. Have a picnic or a swim, and enjoy the refreshing ambience. From Castle Bay onwards, the beaches are larger; however, there are still some rugged sections that divide up the beaches. Meelup Beach is ideal for swimming due to the bay being protected. There are BBQs, picnic tables under trees and big grassy areas for family picnics as well. Another nice feature of Meelup Beach is that it is also where Meelup Brook runs into the ocean. The track from Meelup to Eagle Bay is relatively a bit more challenging, yet the ocean views get better as you get higher. This section features the only real ascent of the trail, although it isn't very long or difficult. After a downhill wander, stunning Eagle Bay looms in the distance. The trail continues through Reidle Park to the Eagle Bay Carpark, with a well-shaded boardwalk leading down to the beach. This is a fairly easy walk along a mostly flat trail with very little change in elevation. The trail is clear, well maintained and reasonably well signed. There are large panels at the start of the trail and markers all along the way. From Dunsborough, the track to Point Piquet is quite straightforward, but it can get a bit hard to follow after Point Piquet. You can either return to your vehicle via Meelup Reserve Trail, get a cab or do some car shuffling. Let us begin by acknowledging the Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.

Getting to the start: From Bussell Highway, 10


- Turn on to Causeway Road then drive for 1.5 km
- At roundabout, take exit 2 onto Causeway Road and drive for another 360 m
- At roundabout, take exit 2 onto Queen Street and drive for another 135 m
- Turn left onto Albert Street and drive for another 8 km
- At roundabout, take exit 2 onto Caves Road and drive for another 13.4 km
- At roundabout, take exit 2 onto Caves Road and drive for another 120 m



Getting started: From the carpark on Hurford Street, Dunsborough, head along the dirt trail that starts next to the 'Meelup Regional Park Trails' sign near the carpark. Follow the dirt trail ahead to continue the Meelup Reserve Trail.

At the intersection of Hurford Street & Meelup-Dunsborough Trail **Start** heading along *Meelup-Dunsborough Trail* (a walking track).

After another 35 m (from the Meelup-Dunsborough Trail) continue straight, to head along Meelup-Dunsborough Trail.

Start of an optional side trip: This little side trip takes you to Curtis Bay Beach.

To start this optional side trip turn right here. from the Meelup-Dunsborough Trail **Start** heading along Meelup-Dunsborough Trail (a footpath).

After another 30 m come to the end.

Turn around and retrace your steps back the 30 m to the main route.

Back at the main route turn right and follow on from the 460 m waypoint.

After another 420 m (from the Meelup-Dunsborough Trail) **continue straight**, to head along Meelup-Dunsborough Trail. After another 135 m (from the Meelup-Dunsborough Trail) **continue straight**, to head along Meelup-Dunsborough Trail.

After another 630 m (from the Meelup-Dunsborough Trail) **turn right**, to head along Meelup-Dunsborough Trail (a footpath).

After another 80 m (from the Meelup-Dunsborough Trail) **turn right**, to head along Meelup-Dunsborough Trail (a walking track).

After another 260 m (from the Meelup-Dunsborough Trail) **turn left**, to head along Meelup-Dunsborough Trail.

After another 320 m (from the Meelup-Dunsborough Trail) **continue straight**, to head along Meelup-Dunsborough Trail.

Start of an optional side trip: This little side trip takes you to Castle Bay Beach.

To start this optional side trip veer right here. from the Meelup-Dunsborough Trail **Start** (a walking track).


About 105 m past the end is a viewpoint.

The end.

Turn around and retrace your steps back the 25 m to the main route.

Back at the main route ERROR >360 and follow on from the 2.4 km waypoint.

After another 510 m (from the Meelup-Dunsborough Trail) **veer left**, to head along Meelup-Dunsborough Trail.



After another 45 m pass the toilet (45 m on your left).

Then come to the viewpoint (30 m on your right).

After another 1.2 km to find the "Meelup Beach".

From the Meelup-Dunsborough Trail turn left (a service road).

After another 95 m pass the "Toilet" (15 m on your right).

From the Meelup Carpark Road **turn right**, to head along Meelup Carpark Road (a vehicle track).

After another 110 m (at the intersection of Meelup Carpark Road & Look Out Rock Circuit) **turn right**, to head along Look Out Rock Circuit (a walking track).



After another 80 m (from the Look Out Rock Circuit) **veer left**.



After another 530 m continue straight.



After another 10 m pass the "Gannet Rock" (10 m on your right).



After another 530 m veer left.
