



# Solitary Restaurant to Jamieson Lookout

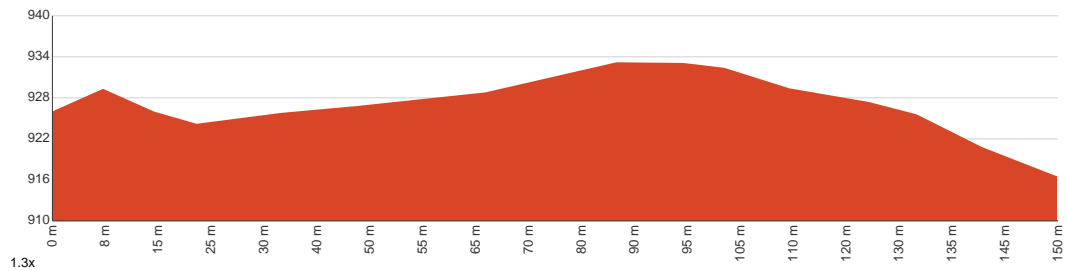

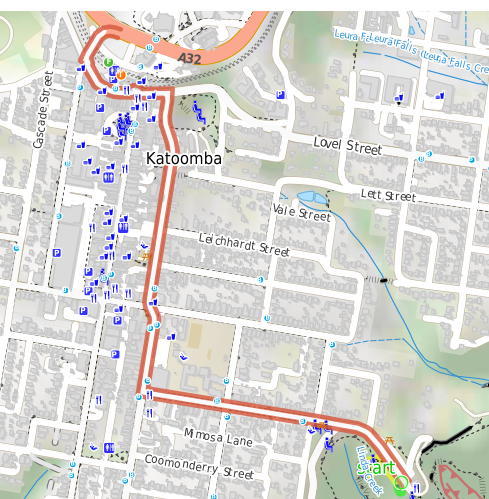

Starting near Solitary Restaurant in Leura, this walk heads into the bush passing Echo Tree Lookout. The track follows the Prince Henry track to Federal Pass, soon coming to Jamiesons Lookout. Jamiesons Lookout provides a great view across the valley, with a bench seat to help you rest and take it in. Consider starting or ending the walk with a snack at Solitary Restaurant. Let us begin by acknowledging the Dharug & Gundungurra people, Traditional Custodians of the land on which we travel today, and pay our respects to their Elders past and present.



Class 3 of 6	
Formed track, with some branches and other obstacles	
<b>Quality of track</b>	Clear and well formed track or trail (2/6)
<b>Gradient</b>	Short steep hills (3/6)
<b>Signage</b>	Clearly signposted (1/6)
<b>Infrastructure</b>	Generally useful facilities (such as fenced cliffs and seats) (1/6)

<b>Weather</b>	Weather generally has little impact on safety (1/6)



**Getting to the start:** From

- Turn on to Bathurst Road, BMD then drive for 165 m
- At roundabout, take exit 1 onto Gang Gang Street, BMD and drive for another 105 m
- Turn right onto Lurline Street, BMD and drive for another 800 m
- Turn left onto Merriwa Street and drive for another 530 m
- Continue onto Cliff Drive, BMD and drive for another 240 m

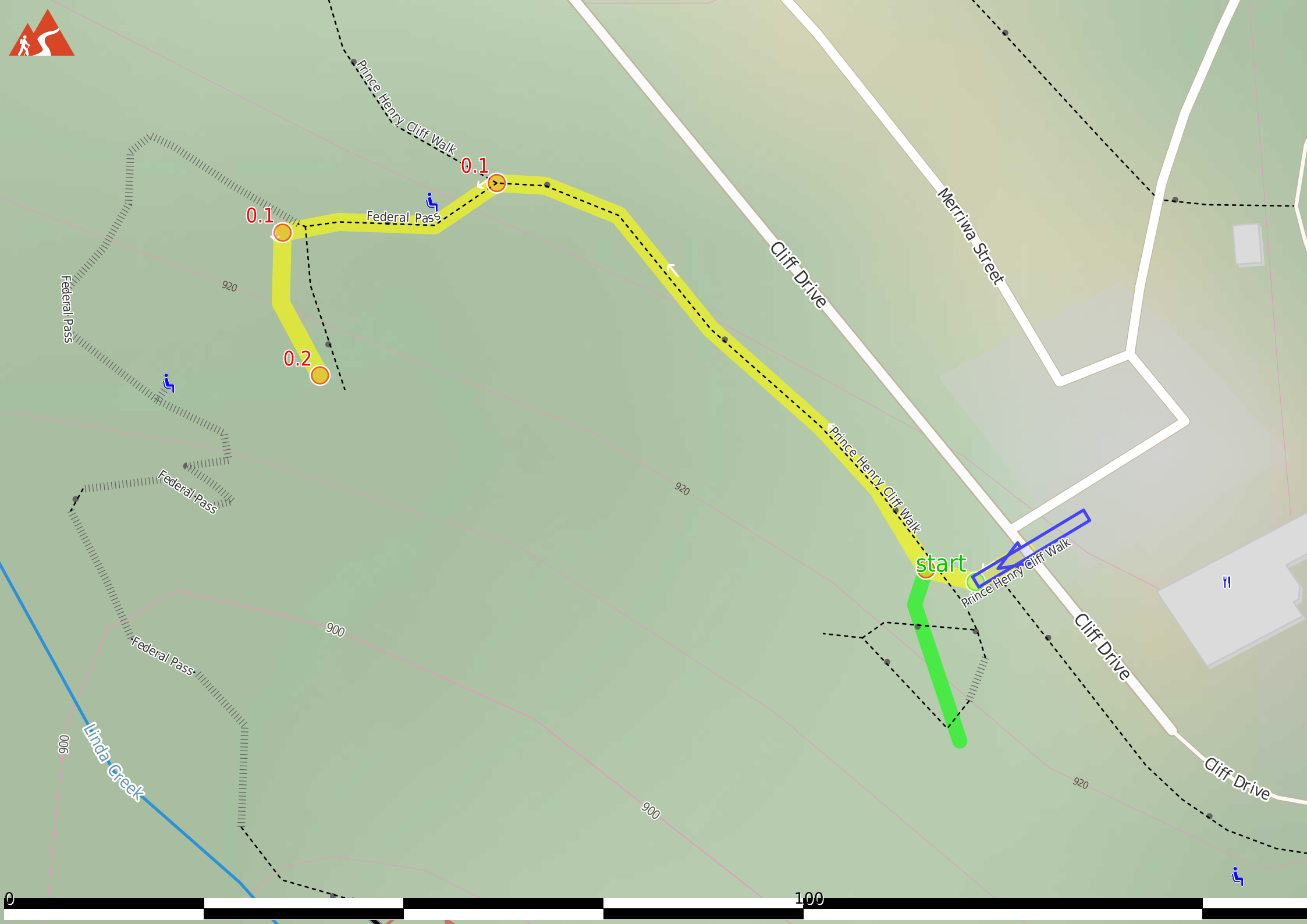
**Before you start any journey ensure you;**

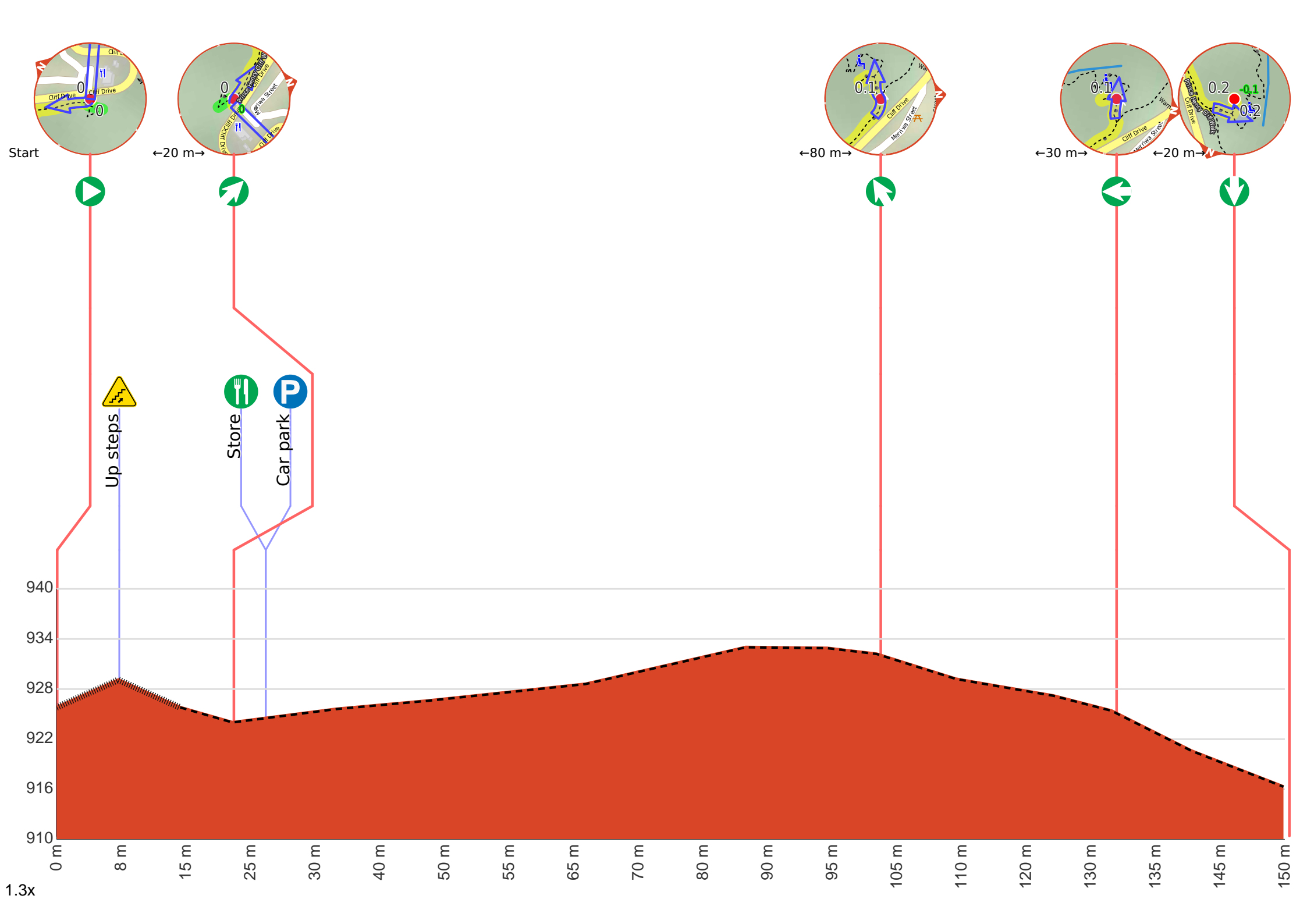
- Tell someone you trust where you are going and what to do if you are late returning

If not, change plans and stay safe. It is okay to delay and ask people for help.

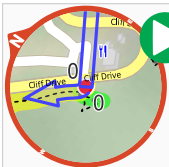

**Getting started:** From Cliff Drive, opposite the car park behind Solitary Restaurant, this walk follows the 'Prince Henry Cliff Walk to Federal Pass' sign, down the short set of wooden steps to the intersection with the Echo Tree Lookout track.



**Start.**



After another 8 m head up the steps (about 8 m long)



Find the Solitary Kiosk and Restaurant at the start.



Solitary Restaurant offers fine dining in a heritage-listed building overlooking the beautiful Jamison Valley, as well as housing a kiosk for a more casual lunch. The kiosk is open for lunch 7 days a week, from 10am to 4pm (opens 11am weekdays in winter). The kiosk provides a casual dining experience, with breakfast foods from \$10 and lunches around \$15 per dish. The restaurant is open for lunch 7 days from 12-4.30pm, and dinner on Fridays and Saturdays from 6pm. Light lunches start from \$14, and dinners from \$55 for a mouth-watering 2 course meal. Find the Leura parking at the start.

**Start of an optional side trip:** An optional side trip to Echo Tree Lookout.



To start this optional side trip turn left here. **Start.**



After another 5 m **continue straight.**



Continue another 20 m to find Echo Tree Lookout at the end.



"Echo Tree Lookout".



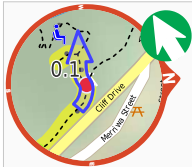
Turn around and retrace your steps back the 25 m to the main route.



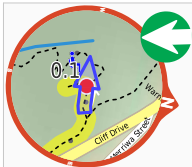
Back at the main route continue straight and follow on from the 20 m waypoint.



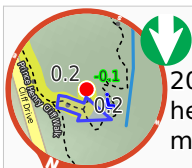
**Veer right,** to head along Prince Henry Cliff Walk.



After another 80 m **veer left.**



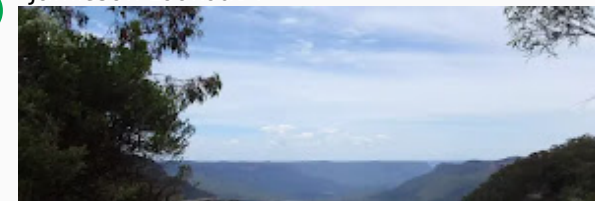
After another 30 m **turn left.**



(Jamieson Lookout) Continue another 20 m to find the end. Then turn around here and retrace the main route for 150 m to get back to the start.



"Jamieson Lookout".



Jamieson Lookout is a fenced lookout at the east end of the Federal Pass track, and just off Prince Henry Cliff Walk. The lookout has a bench seat and provides great views up the Jamison Valley, along Kings Tableland escarpment and past Mount Solitary. The lookout is perched up on a large rock buttress, giving views unobscured by trees.
