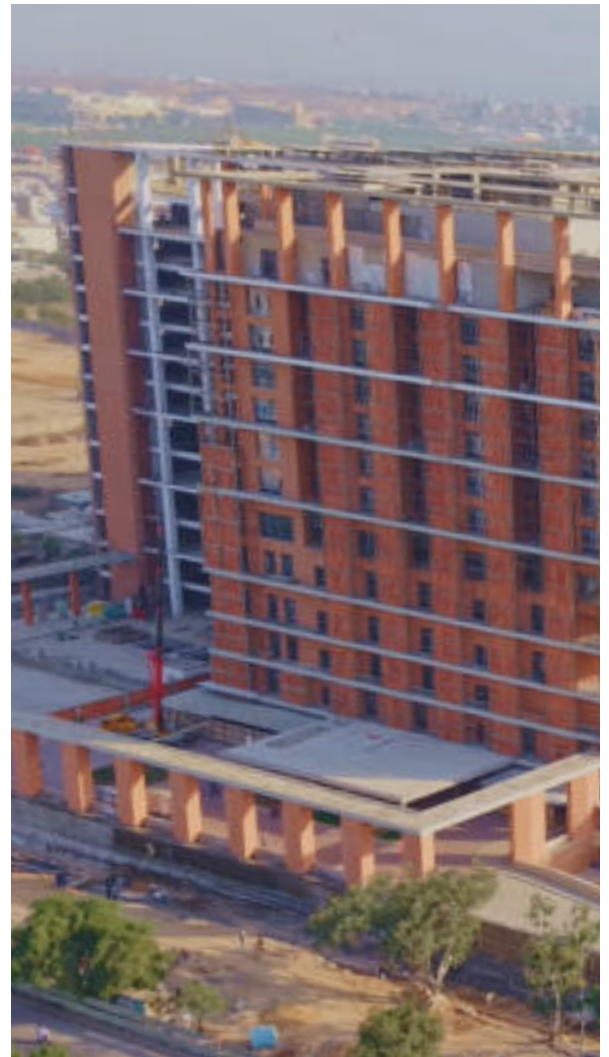
SDG 10

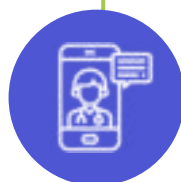

Success Story



Mushtaq Ahmed had been struggling with his lifestyle for many months, as he battled an infection in his lungs. What made things tougher was the lack of access to affordable healthcare in his small village in rural Sindh.

Mushtaq's livelihood depended on selling samosas he made by hand. With standing long hours and traveling long distances to sell his savouries, it became difficult to maintain his earnings. As the sole breadwinner, he was forced to sacrifice his health for survival, a heartbreaking reality shared by thousands.

That was until Indus Hospital & Health Network's (IHHN) Al-Ghazi Hospital and Community Engagement Centre came into the picture. With their outreach programmes and free-of-cost treatment, Mushtaq finally felt a sense of hope. **"I used to think that visiting a doctor was a luxury I couldn't afford," Mushtaq recalls. "But now, I can get treatment without worrying about the cost. It's a huge relief."**

Today, Mushtaq can breathe a little easier, thanks to the care he received, and can support his family with confidence.
