Devastating Flood in Pakistan: 2022

The monsoon season in Pakistan triggered the most severe flooding in the region and thus was categorized as the worst **humanitarian crisis** that had hit the country in over a decade. Tens of millions of innocent lives were affected while thousands of villages were swept away. As the floodwaters slowly receded, they left a major healthcare crisis in their wake.

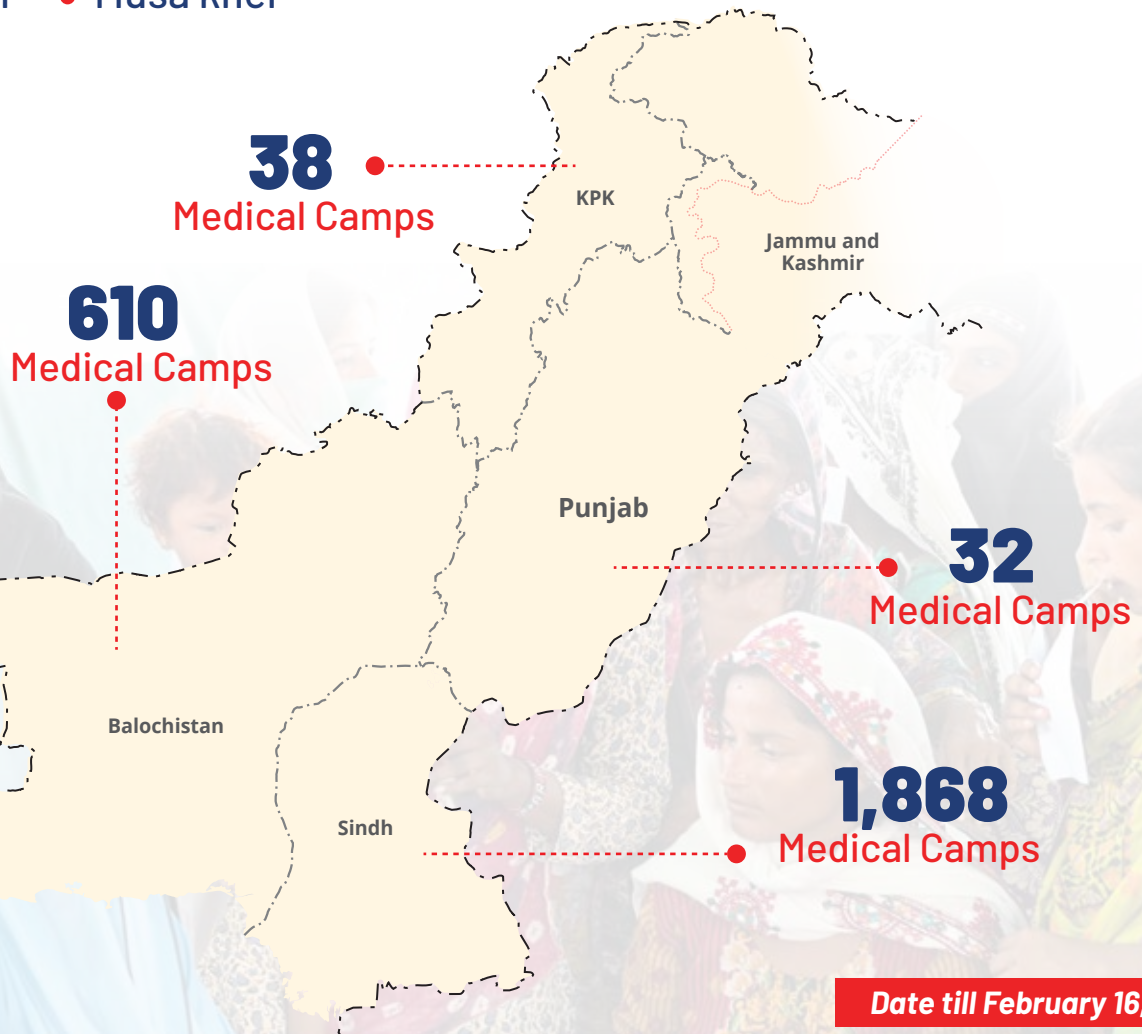

I NOT ONLY LOST MY HOME, BUT I ALSO LOST MY BABY!



It was past midnight when the announcements started in the local village mosque of Shikarpur. Sakina Bibi's newborn son, Ibrahim, was becoming restless with every passing second. The villagers were banging on the broken doors of her house to evacuate it as the area was under high alert.

Sakina and her husband were alarmed and gathered all their family members in the courtyard and started packing everything they could find. While Sakina was busy packing some food for her kids, a massive surge of water hit their house and completely destroyed everything in her courtyard. All her belongings, her livestock, and above all, Ibrahim; her newborn son, were swept away in a blink of an eye. Sakina couldn't comprehend what had happened in some mere seconds. She was dragged out of the house by her husband with the rest of her family.

Making their way through the water, they were able to reach a local mosque where they stayed on the roof for 2 days.

The family along with other villagers were rescued by the local government. Injured and shocked, Sakina was still unable to comprehend the loss she had to bear at the hands of the flood. The injured families were brought to IHHN's flood relief camps in Thatta where they were provided with food, shelter, hygiene kits, and primary medical care.

"They not only treated me and the rest of my family for their injuries but the community health worker also helped me cope with my distress. I wish there were more camps like these in my village."

The Medical Relief Units by IHHN are focused on not only providing free medical care and medicines to men, women, and children but also are conducting mental health sessions and community awareness sessions amongst the displaced communities to help them cope with their loss and begin to take care of themselves.
