The Animal By-Products (Enforcement) (Scotland) Regulations 2013

Approval of Incineration Plants

1. In accordance with regulation 14 of the Animal By-Products (Enforcement) (Scotland) Regulations 2013 and Article 24 and 44 of Regulation (EC) No 1069/2009, the Scottish Ministers approve:



2. to operate an incinerator – Make: SA50/2 at less than 50 kilos per hour on the premises to incinerate category 1 pet carcasses only, may include “pet” Livestock.
3. Low capacity Non – SRM Incinerator.
4. For at least 10% of burn cycles the temperature reading shall be manually recorded every hour during the burn cycle.
5. The incinerator must be operated in accordance with the manufacturer’s instructions.
6. The Incinerator must be subject to an annual service by the manufacturer or an independent service engineer who should be able to confirm that the incinerator is still capable of meeting the requirements of Regulations (EC) No. 142/2011. The service must include verification of the calibration of temperature monitoring equipment.
