The Oxbridge Research Project has been designed to develop the intellectual qualities Oxford and Cambridge actively assess: depth of subject engagement, intellectual curiosity beyond the syllabus, and the ability to think critically under challenge. These are the habits of mind that distinguish outstanding candidates when grades alone are no longer enough.

Throughout the programme, students work closely with leading Oxbridge academics in a supervision-style model that mirrors university teaching. Mentors provide personalised guidance, sustained academic challenge, and detailed critique as students design and complete an original independent research project. Participants are supported in preparing their work for submission to an appropriate academic journal, gaining first-hand experience of academic standards and expectations.

The programme culminates in our annual Research Symposium, where students present and defend their findings before an audience of senior academics and subject specialists. This experience develops clarity of thought, intellectual confidence, and the ability to articulate complex ideas — skills that translate directly to Oxbridge interviews and undergraduate study.

# The Oxbridge Research Scholars Programme includes:

## An original research project

With guidance from our Oxbridge academics and mentors, you will define a focused research question and develop it into a rigorous and independent project. Whether you are exploring the ethics of climate impact in surgical services or analysing the role of conspiracy narratives in modern political speech, we will help you shape a topic into a piece of work that is both personal and genuinely scholarly.

## Oxbridge-style academic supervision

We work exclusively with academics and mentors from Oxford and Cambridge. Your programme includes two dedicated supervision sessions with a senior academic, one at the beginning, to set direction and ensure your project meets the standard expected of competitive applicants, and one at the end, to provide a rigorous viva modelled on a real Oxbridge tutorial.

Across the full duration of the project you will work closely with your assigned Oxbridge mentor, who will provide intellectual challenge, structured guidance, and detailed feedback as your research develops.

## Support to prepare your work for publication

For students who wish to take their project further, we can recommend a select group of reputable journals and publications, and provide guidance on formatting, structure, and submission expectations.

## Present at our annual Research Symposium

Hosted in the Crown Theatre at Dukes House in central London, the Scholars' Research Symposium is an opportunity to present your work to the wider Oxbridge Scholars community, alongside academics and guests from the field.

Each year, we also recognise an Academic of the Year award for an exceptional piece of research.

## The Programme at a glance:

<b>Students:</b>	Ambitious students aged 14-18
<b>Tutors:</b>	Oxford or Cambridge academics or professors, as well as Oxbridge-graduate mentors
<b>Programme duration:</b>	2 hours of individual research guidance meetings with a senior Oxbridge researcher as well as 7 hours of tuition with an Oxbridge-graduate mentor to refine your work, plus offline marking. Sessions are delivered from April to August 2026 (students can join the programme until 31st July 2026)
<b>Class size:</b>	One-to-one, plus a research symposium in London, August 2026
<b>Availability:</b>	Anywhere in the world
<b>Programme Start:</b>	From April 2026
<b>Outcome:</b>	A truly original research project in an area of personal interest

# Frequently asked questions

## How long is the programme?

We are taking enrolment now for our 2026 programme which begins in April and our symposium for candidates will be held at the end of August. You will be able to use your 9 hours of mentoring however you would like between that time.

## Are the sessions online or in person?

The sessions are held online.

## How will you help me identify a subject?

You will pick a broad subject area initially, which will allow us to match you to an appropriate tutor. During your first sessions you will be working with the tutors to hone in on a specific research area unique to you.

## What subjects/pathways are available?

We can support with any academic subject, from Physics to History. However, we cannot support more practical subjects such as art or design.

## How are tutors matched?

Our tutors are matched by us to ensure that we select the most experienced and relevant tutor for you.

## What does “publication support” include?

We support you during the writing of the project to ensure that you are formatting your project in alignment of any publication requirements. We will also provide a general training session on how to submit projects for publication. We will not submit the project for you.

## What does the final output look like?

The final output is a 5,000 word essay.

## Can students outside the UK attend the symposium / is it optional?

Students outside the UK are more than welcome to attend the symposium, and we hope that they do! However it is entirely optional.

## What happens after purchase?

After your purchase you will be sent a reading list for your stated area of interest and we will begin the process of matching you with a tutor. The research programme will begin on April 1st.
