


2.2 Billion People

Access to clean water is important to our health, a sustainable economy, and a basic life necessity.



Economic Growth

Improved water supply and better management of water resources will contribute greatly to countries' economic growth and reducing poverty.



Prevention of sickness

Contaminated water can transmit diseases like diarrhoea, cholera, typhoid and polio. Each year, contaminated drinking water is estimated to cause 485,000 deaths.

•/ COMMUNITY WATER WELLS



A Community Water Well (CWW) is equipped with 6 taps, a generous washing area, a water tank and an electrical pump to draw the water from under the ground. Each well can provide 5 to 10 families with clean water and an estimated 40-50 people will benefit from each CWW.

Our community water wells are built mostly in Cambodia, where most families in rural areas have no access to clean water. They usually take around 3 to 6 months to complete.

Your charity will change lives and give sadagah in return.

Allow the underprivileged to perform ablution for their prayers. In more rural areas, these ablution places are a vital lifeline for the locals. It is more than just a means for prayer - an ablution place also provides reliable access to clean water for everyone in the vicinity.

You can either build an ablution place in your name, or in the name of a loved one. Alternatively, you can also provide two names on each ablution place.

Providing water through this means is a good way to offer Sadagah Jariyah (continuous charity) as the donor will insya-Allah continue to reap Allah's blessings, for as long as the villagers continue to benefit from the ablution place.

Perform a tremendous act of charity that will last for ten years or more, insya-Allah.

COMMUNITY WATER WELLS

Mrs. Khadi lives at Ongkrouch village, Bourei Cholsar district, Takeo province, Cambodia. Because of the lack of access to clean water, she lived in a difficult situation and had been forced to collect water at the dirty pond near her house which is an arduous journey of 5 miles.

She laments that it was hard for her and her fellow villagers. When the dry season came, she didn't have any water to collect at all. Alhamdulillah after receiving the community water wells from us, she feels happy and thankful. She spoke to us with deep joy, knowing that now her village of five families have enough clean water to use daily for activities like cooking, bathing, washing clothes and even to take ablution.

She makes Dua for our donors and for our organisation, with a smile on her face.



ABLUTION PLACES

Location:

Toul Sombour village, Tompeang pring Commune, Dom bae district, Tbong Khmum province. Cambodia.

Small in stature but big in heart, Uncle Jakfar, the imam in the Masjid which we provide the ablution place. He will do anything for his community to make sure they have water.

"Before we had water, life was hard," he says. "My children and all my villagers were suffering because of it. Every morning we would have to go and collect water from the river. We were very happy when we got water."

With the ablution place in the Masjid, all the villagers have access to clean water in taking Wudhu, and the villagers around the Masjid also have enough water to use in daily need. Not only did children stop getting sick from drinking contaminated river water, but they saved an hour or more each day they used to spend fetching water." Uncle Jakfar expressed.

Alhamdulillah, we thank all donors and the Global Ehsan Relief Cambodia team, "Now, we feel free to use the water whenever we want," says Uncle Jakfar. "For cooking, washing hands, taking a bath, taking Wudhu."



WATER WELLS

Location:

Chomka Ckhek village, Krobov Commune, Komchay Mea district, Prey Veng Province, Cambodia

Meet Sister Sofiya and her husband, with their newborn baby. The couple are both working as farmers - they don't get a regular income and for the job, they need sufficient water to process.

She describes that water is important not just for work, but more importantly for their daily use. Her newborn baby especially needs clean water and sadly, he is the one most susceptible to the effects from contaminated water. Sister Sofiya collects the water from the lake or pond that is quite a distance from their place. During the rainy season, she bought a big pot to store the water - though this water is still unsafe for her baby and not enough for daily use.

She expressed with joy that this water well is a valuable gift from Allah s.w.t to her and her family. She shares her gratitude towards Global Ehsan Relief Cambodia, who gifted the water well to her family.

In her words: "I and my family wish the organisation and donors the best for your family. May Allah reward you for what you did for our poverty community here."
