With group sizes ranging from intimate gatherings of 10 to larger cohorts of 60, WCF facilitates environments conducive to collaboration, learning and impactful service. Throughout the year, WCF organises a series of trips to various destinations, with Lebanon, Jordan, Pakistan, Turkiye, Gambia & Syria as the most frequently visited destinations.



VOLUNTEER ABROAD!

We take separate groups BROTHERS, SISTERS, FAMILIES AND YOUTH GROUPS.

The spectrum of participants spans generations, from as young as 12 years old to blessed volunteer at the age of 80 who went to Lebanon with her family. This inclusivity ensures that individuals of all ages and backgrounds can all benefit from these journeys. Volunteers travel to help those in need but come back having gained the priceless enrichment of their own souls.

At WCF, we prioritise the participation of volunteers in our noble humanitarian work over meeting specific fundraising targets. We understand that each individual's capacity to contribute financially may vary which is why we value their involvement regardless of their ability to raise funds. Therefore, there are no minimum fundraising requirements imposed on volunteers. Instead, we encourage everyone to contribute to the best of their ability and raise funds according to their means, without any pressure. Our focus is on fostering a culture of compassion, empathy and collective action, where every volunteer's effort, whether big or small, is highly valued and contributes to our shared mission of serving humanity. By removing financial targets, we aim to create an inclusive and supportive environment where volunteers can focus on making a positive impact in the lives of those in need, regardless of their financial resources.

We raise funds collectively, followed by on-the-ground deployment of resources to assist impoverished communities, particularly focusing on vulnerable groups such as widows, orphans, the disabled and individuals in need of medical treatments. This approach ensures direct engagement with beneficiaries, allowing volunteers to witness first-hand the tangible impact of their contributions. There is full transparency and participation by the volunteers on the usage of funds for each relief activity. Through this participatory process, WCF educates the volunteers in the processes of charitable work plus cultivates a sense of ownership and commitment among

WCF facilitates the establishment of impactful projects such as orphanages, bakeries, schools and more.

This collaborative effort empowers volunteers to directly contribute to the creation of sustainable solutions that address the needs of communities in need.

For instance, in Lebanon, WCF has overseen the establishment of 19 orphanages,

with many of these initiatives being funded and organised by groups of volunteers during their trips to the country.

Each trip has its own dynamics and plans for the relief work depending on the location and the time of the year. In general, our activities in Lebanon (as an example) where we travel the most; involve visiting our projects such as schools, residence centres, women empowerment centres (Threads of Care), bakeries and much more.

In addition to engaging in various projects, volunteers in Lebanon also visit camps hosting Syrian refugees and individual families in need outside the camps. These visits entail distributing essential items like food, clothing and hygiene products. The volunteers provide support for diverse needs such as medical treatment funds, household essentials, rental assistance and debt payments. This direct engagement with vulnerable populations underscores WCF's commitment to providing holistic support and addressing the multifaceted challenges faced by individuals and families in crisis.

Beyond the material assistance provided, the words of support and hope offered directly to those in need carry immense significance. The personal connection forged through these interactions transcends monetary aid, leaving a lasting impact on both volunteers and beneficiaries. This direct engagement underscores the profound importance of human connection and empathy in uplifting and empowering individuals facing adversity.

SUPPORT AT HAND

Our dedicated staff assist the volunteers throughout the entire journey. We handle all logistical aspects, including booking flights, hotels and transportation at the destination. Our team also provides comprehensive guidance to volunteers at each step of the trip, ensuring a smooth and fulfilling experience. From initial planning to on-the-ground support, we are committed to facilitating a seamless and rewarding volunteering experience for all participants.

Once volunteers register and make a payment to cover their travel expenses for the trip, our staff will add them to an online group and schedule a Video call to cover all relevant aspects of the deployment.

THE COST OF THE TRIP VARIES FROM

£500 TO £900

DEPENDING ON THE LOCATION AND THE TIME OF THE YEAR.



During the Video Call, we will provide:

- I. Overview of trip itinerary and schedule: Detailed outline of activities and events planned for the trip.
- 2. Logistics: Information on flights, accommodations (single or shared) and local transportation arrangements.
- 3. Safety and security measures: Protocols in place to ensure the well-being of volunteers throughout the trip.
- 4. Roles and responsibilities: Clear explanation of tasks and duties expected of volunteers.
- 5. Cultural considerations: Guidance on local customs and etiquette to respect cultural sensitivities.
- 6. Interacting with beneficiaries: Guidelines on engaging with beneficiaries respectfully and sensitively.
- 7. **Documentation:** Instructions regarding any necessary paperwork or documentation required for the trip.
- 8. Emergency contact information: Providing contact details for assistance and support in case of emergencies.
- 9. Total charges: Breakdown of costs associated with the trip.
- 10. Visa, insurance: Guidance on visa requirements and insurance coverage.
- 11. Exact itinerary: Detailed day-to-day schedule of activities.
- 12. Fundraising process: Support and resources available for fundraising efforts.
- 13. Packing essentials: Recommendations for clothing, medications and personal items.
- 14. Journey to local airport: Logistics for traveling to the departure airport and onwards.
- 15. Location: Detailed information about the destination and project sites.
- 16. Accommodation: Options for single rooms or shared accommodations and amenities provided.
- 17. Clothing, medicine, and other personal items needed: Recommendations for essential items to bring, including clothing suitable for the climate and any necessary medications.
- **18.** And much more: Addressing any additional questions or concerns volunteers may have, ensuring they feel fully prepared and informed for the trip ahead.


