LAST TIME OUT

The Cougars finished the Rainbow Wahine Shootout a perfect 2-0 with wins over Hawai'i (1-0) and Pepperdine (2-1). Sunday, the Cougs did what the rest of the Pac-12 had failed to do, down a pesky Pepperdine squad using a pair of second half strikes to grab the win. Elyse Bennett got the scoring started before Molly Myers finished the 'Waves' off late. As they have done all season, the Cougs dominated the Waves on the offensive end, outshooting Pepperdine 17-7 and 8-2 on goal.

ALGER TOP DEFENDER, AGAIN

For the second time this season, junior Brianna Alger was named the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week announced by the conference office Tuesday afternoon. Alger also took home the opening award of the season on Aug. 27. In the last two seasons the Cougars have earned six defensive awards with four weekly honors last season to go with Algers' two this year. Over the weekend, she assisted on both game-winning goals while leading the way to just one goal against and a shutout over Hawai'i.

COUGS IN CONFERENCE OPENERS

With the Pac-12 schedule beginning the Cougs are looking to make it a winning streak in conference openers after downing #8 UCLA, 1-0, last year on the road. The win at UCLA was WSU's third-straight win over the Bruins.

All-time the Cougs are 10-11-3 in conference openers and 4-2-2 since the conference became the Pac-12. In the first home contest of conference the Cougs are 9-13-2 all-time.

THE GREATEST SHOW ON "TURF"

In eight games the 2019 Cougars have proven to have one of the most potent offenses in the country as WSU enters the week #11 in scoring offense, averaging 2.88 goals per game. Using a wide ranging attack, the Cougars have had nine different players hit the back of the net to score their 23 goals (one own goal). The Cougs have scored in myriad of ways including but not limited to five off of corners, four on crosses, three from the spot, and most recently a pair off free kicks. With all the goals being scored it's no surprise the Cougs are #4 in assists per game at 3.00 (24 total) led by Brianna Algers' six.

COUGARS BACK AND BETTER THAN EVER

Despite the loss of a few key players from last season, the 2019 Cougars are back and better than ever as eight of 11 starters returned headlined by all-region honoree Morgan Weaver up top and goalkeeper Ella Dederick between the posts. The two captains lead a stacked team of veteran players who have advanced to the second-round of the NCAA Tournament in each of the last two seasons. In addition, the Cougars returned 29 goals (70% of their scoring) from 2018. The vets have contributed 15 goals and 19 assists.

FRESH FACES CONTRIBUTING EARLY

While the Cougs enter the year with established veterans at every position WSU also welcomes in 10 new faces that have already made an immediate impact. The most experienced newcomer to the Cougars is graduate-transfer Averie Collins who came to the Palouse after graduating from Stanford. Collins won a national title with the Cardinal and finished her Stanford career with 10 goals, five assists, and 25 points. In addition to Collins, freshman MacKenzie Frimpong-Ellertson earned a spot among the starters while eight of the nine freshmen have seen solid time on the pitch.

Collins enters the week second in scoring with 4 goals, 2 game-winners, while Frimpong-Ellertson has netted 2. Each have added 1 assist. Freshman Skye McMillon got on the scoreboard in her first appearance in the season opener against Seattle U.

WEAVER ONE TO WATCH

Coming off of a career year, senior Morgan Weaver put her name among the best in the nation as the Washington State star was named to the watch list for the Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy. Weaver became the first Cougar in program history to be named to the preseason watch list. The MAC Hermann Trophy is the most prestigious award in collegiate soccer and is awarded to United Soccer Coaches National Player of the Year in NCAA Division I soccer.

Weaver has scored 5 goals and posted 1 assist in 8 games.

OFFENSIVE DEPTH TAKES CENTER STAGE

Three-deep at every position it is no surprise that the overall depth has shown through as the Cougars' have 10 different goal scorers accounting for 23 goals. The Cougs also have six different game-winners on the year.

In addition, five of the 10 scorers have been first time scorers (including grad-transfer Averie Collins scoring her first goal at WSU).

SCORING EARLY AND OFTEN

Sporting one of the nation's top offenses, the Cougars have pounced on their opponents early to put the game away. Entering the game WSU has scored 14 of its 23 goals in the first 45' of the contest including posting a six spot in the first half against JMU.

Even more impressively, the Cougars have scored 8 goals in the first 20' and 4 inside the first 10' of action and 3 inside the first 5'. The blitzkrieg offense was optimized against JMU when Makamae Gomera-Stevens scored the fastest goal in program history as the junior netted the opening strike just :21 seconds into the contest.

COLLINS AN IMMEDIATE IMPACT PLAYER

Coming to WSU with championship pedigree, grad-transfer Averie Collins has made an immediate impact on the Cougars as the fifth-year midfielder is second on the team in scoring with four goals in eight games. Collins has used her size and ball skills to overpower the opposition early, scoring in four different ways including a PK, a header off a corner, an open play with her right foot, and even from 22-yards out with her left foot.

WSU RANKED #21/#9

Entering the week the Cougars are among the elite as WSU comes in ranked #21 in the country as per the United Soccer Coaches (USC) poll. In the other major polls the Cougs look even better as they come in #9 in the nation in the TopDrawerSoccer.com poll. Last season the Cougs climbed as high as #7 in the USC poll and #5 in TDS poll after beginning the year a perfect 10-0-0. The top-10 rankings marked the highest rankings in program history for WSU.

KEEPING IT CLEAN ON THE SCORE SHEET

In 2019, the Cougars have picked up where they left off last season dominating non-conference play with three shutouts in six contests. In the two years prior, the Cougs produced 16 shutouts including 11 in 2017, tied for 2nd most in WSU history. On the year, the Cougs have outscored their opposition 23-7. Ella Dederick in goal has been credited with three full shutouts while sharing a fourth with Rachel Johnson.

ALGER'S ASSISTS

Taking over the role of starting left back and primary distributor for the Cougars, junior Brianna Alger wasted no time jumping in with both feet as she picked up a pair of assists on the first two goals of the season. She added an assist in each game at home to run her streak to three-straight games, tying the longest streak in program history. She would be held in check at Gonzaga for the first time in 2019. Her 6 total assists and 0.71 assists per game are tied for #1 in the Pac-12 and rank 12th in the nation. Alger, playing in the back for the first time in her career, is looking to replicate the play of all-region honoree Maddy Haro, who finished 2018 second in the nation with a program record 15 assists. For comparison sake, Haro also earned the first Pac-12 DPOW of the season while assisting on eight goals in the non-conference play.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

Taking care of business at home all season long, the Cougs came up with a program record 10 wins at Lower Soccer Field in 2018. The previous record for WSU was eight, done three times prior. Overall, the Cougs went 10-1-1 at home for an .875 win percentage, tied for the third-best percentage in WSU history. The only teams to get past the Cougars at home last year were #2 USC (3-2) and #1 Stanford (1-1 Draw, 20T). In addition to the wins, the Cougs outscored their opponents 33-12 at home scoring 80% of their goals at Lower Soccer Field this season. In 2019 the Cougars are 3-1-0 and hold a 15-6 scoring advantage. All-time, WSU is 154-78-24 at home.

NON-CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

In their evolution into one of the elite teams in the country, the Cougars have proven to be nearly unbeatable outside of the Pac-12. In 2018, WSU went a perfect 7-0 in non-conference play en route to a 10-0 start. In all, the Cougars have now dropped just two non-conference matches in the last three seasons falling to Santa Clara on Aug. 27, 2017 and Michigan on Sept. 13, 2019. In the last three seasons the Cougs are 19-2-2 in non-conference play.

WEAVER LEADS THE WAY, CLIMBING THE RECORD BOOKS

Star senior forward Morgan Weaver proved once again to be one of the best players in the country in 2018 after posting a career-best 13 goals, tying for the lead in the Pac-12 in the regular season. Her 13 goals ranked tied for fourth all-time in WSU single season history and finished No. 20 in the country overall. Weaver ended her junior year on a tear, scoring six goals in the final five games including goals against #1 Stanford and a hat-trick against rival Washington to end the regular season. With a team-best 5 goals, Weaver now has 33 career goals and ranks tied for third all-time in program history. The all-time record for goals sits at 83, held by hall-of-famer Kim Lynass (1990-93). Deka DeWitt's (1997-2000) second place mark of 40 is well within reach of Weaver in her final season on the Palouse. Her 74 points ranks 5th.

DEDERICK, BACK WITH HER SIGHTS SET ON THE RECORD BOOK

After missing most of the 2018 season due to injury, star keeper Ella Dederick is back and ready to take her place as the best goalkeeper to ever don the Crimson and Gray. The sixth-year senior was granted an extra year of eligibility for 2019. She was 5-0 with 2.5 shutouts before injury. Seven games into the season Dederick is 6-1 with 3.5 shutouts and a 0.65 GAA. Career Ranking – Wins (T1st, 44), Win percentage (3rd, 0.635), saves (5th, 246), goals against average (2nd, 0.86), minutes in goal (2nd, 6716:34), shutouts (2nd, 23). Dederick tied the all-time wins record against Pepperdine.

ALGER NAMED PAC-12'S BEST IN WEEK 1

For the first time in her career, junior Brianna Alger was named the Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Week as announced by the conference office. The award for Alger was the first of the season for the Cougars and picked up where WSU left off a season ago after the team captured a conference-best nine weekly awards, including four on the defensive side, throughout the year. The junior not only led WSU to the shutout of Seattle U but assisted on the opening two goals of the 4-0 route to open the 2019 season.

COLLINS TAKES TOP PAC-12 HONORS

For the first time at Washington State and the second time in her career, grad-transfer Averie Collins was named the Pac-12 Offensive Player of the Week as announced by the conference office Tuesday afternoon. Collins becomes the second Cougar to earn a weekly award in the first three weeks of the year following Brianna Alger earning defensive honors to start the year (Aug. 27). Collins previously earned the award in 2016 while at Stanford. Collins scored a golden goal for the Cougs at Gonzaga, needing just :09 seconds to end the game with a left-footed screamer from 22-yards out.

SOCCER SELECTED FOURTH BY PAC-12 COACHES

Coming off one of their most successful seasons in program history, the Washington State soccer team caught the attention of the coaches in the Pac-12 Conference as the Cougars were picked to finish fourth in the preseason coaches poll as announced by the conference office. The fourth place pick marks the highest preseason ranking for the Cougars in the preseason poll. Stanford, the four-time defending conference champions, were picked to take the title for a record fifth-consecutive season after receiving seven first-place votes. UCLA came in just behind the Cardinal in the poll after picking up the remaining five first-place votes.

SHULENBERGER WINS #50

Having established his Cougars as one of the elite teams in the country, head coach Todd Shulenberg came up with some of his own career recognition as the fifth-year coach hit the 50 win milestone Sunday, Sept. 15 against LMU. Shulenberg picked up his milestone victory in his 87th contest giving him an impressive .615 winning percentage. Shulenberg's first win came on Aug. 21, 2015 against Seattle U (3-1).

WAZZU IN 2018

The Cougs finished the regular season 12-5-1 and eventually finished 13-6-1 overall including a big win over then #8 UCLA, 1-0, and a draw against #1 Stanford, 1-1. The record for WSU was bolstered by a program record start that saw the Cougs go 10-0, rocketing up the rankings to an all-time high of #7 before injuries and bad luck caused the team to stumble. After getting back on track the Cougs earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament where they would rout Montana, 5-1, at home in the first round. The season would come to an end at #2 Georgetown a week later as the Hoyas took a 1-0 win in the second round to knock the Cougs out of the postseason. The 13 wins on the year for the Cougs marked the third-most wins in a single season for WSU. The second round appearance marked the first time in program history WSU won its first round game in back-to-back seasons. Overall, four Cougs earned all-conference honors led by first teamer Morgan Weaver who also earned first team all-region honors. Senior Maddy Haro ended her career with second team all-conference and all-region honors while senior Maegan O'Neill saw her injury shortened season finish with a third team award. Freshman Mykiaa Minniss earned all-freshman honors.

COUGS POSTSEASON RUN

The Cougs made a postseason push to the second round for the second-straight season (in 2017 WSU made the third round) as an at-large bid out of the Pac-12. The success in the regular season earned the Cougars a home game in the first round, dismantling Montana 5-1 at Lower Soccer Field on Nov. 9 to earn a trip to the Nation's Capital for a game against one-seed Georgetown. While the Hoyas would prevail in a close 1-0 contest the Cougs run in the postseason was historic as it marked just the first time in program history WSU won first round games in back-to-back seasons. The win in the first round was the fifth-time the Cougars moved on to round two in 12 NCAA appearances. WSU sports a 4-10-4 record in the NCAA tournament.

WASHINGTON STATE HEAD COACH TODD SHULENBERGER

In just four seasons, coach Shulenberg has reshaped the Cougar program in his image, taking the Cougars among the elite programs in NCAA soccer. In four seasons entering the year, the Cougars won 45 games including a program-record 14 victories in Shulenberg's first season. Shulenberg became the second coach in program history to lead his team out of the first round of the NCAA Tournament in back-to-back season following in the footsteps of Matt Potter who took the Cougs to the second round in 2009 and 2010. In 2017, he became the first coach in WSU history to guide his team to the round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament. In 2018, the Cougars broke a number of program records including beginning the season a perfect 10-0, the best start and longest win-streak in program history. The wins to start the year propelled WSU to a No. 7 ranking in the coaches poll, the highest ranking in the history of Cougar soccer. By the end of the year, and despite injuries wreaking havoc on the WSU's squad, the Cougars earned a home game in round one of the NCAA Tournament. After posting a 9-1-1 record at home in the regular season, the Cougs would tack on a record 10th home win in the tournament, dismantling Montana, 5-1, to advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second-straight year. In all, WSU finished the 2018 season with 13 wins, one-shy of the program record. On the field, the Cougs play was recognized repeatedly over the year by the Pac-12 with a conference best nine weekly awards, the most of any team in the conference on the season. Junior Morgan Weaver and senior Maddy Haro would earn all-region honors for their play with Weaver taking home first team honors.
