



This stunning shot of a black Porsche 911 Turbo (930) was taken on a quiet Sunday evening atop a parking garage in downtown Knoxville. The golden hour light perfectly accentuated the classic curves and aggressive stance of this legendary machine, making for a truly breathtaking capture.




Dragon Fest 3 - Apr 19






This last-minute drive turned out to be an absolute blast! It was a perfect mix of spirited driving, great company, and scenic roads, and we couldn't have asked for a better day.
