had an incredible autocross season (after more than a decade without hosting autocross). Last year's five events brought in nearly \$6,000 in revenue, and after covering our expenses, they added a net profit of around \$3,800 to our club. When we contacted ETSU late in December to request permission to use their parking lot again this summer, we were denied and the search for a new venue started.

Besides ETSU, we also reached out to the following places:

While we were losing hope, Ryan Elswick was working in the background to secure a venue for us in the Lee County, VA. After almost 3 months of negotiation and reaching out the right people, the district officers agreed to discuss the subject on a public hearing at the Lee General District Court. After debriefing they decided unanimously in our favor and authorized the usage of the Lee Co. Airport in Jonesville to the following dates:

- May 21
- June 18
- July 16
- August 13
- September 17
- October (TBD)




#### April 22nd - Group Drive - Wilderness Trail Run KY/VA



orsche Motorsports recently made headlines with their successful participation in several high-profile racing events. One of the most notable events was the 2023 Rolex 24 at Daytona, which took place in January. The Porsche 911 RSR-19 dominated the GTLM class, taking both first and second place on the podium. The winning car was driven by Earl Bamber, Laurens Vanthoor, and Nick Tandy, while the second-place finishers were Neel Jani, Frederic Makowiecki, and Mathieu Jaminet. The victory marked Porsche's fourth win in the GTLM class at the Rolex 24.

Porsche also had a strong showing at the 2023 Bathurst 12 Hour, held in February in Australia. The team fielded two 911 GT3 Rs, which finished in second and fourth place in the Pro-Am class. The drivers of the second-place car were Matt Campbell, Dirk Werner, and Jaxon Evans, while the fourth-place finishers were Marc Lieb, Timo Bernhard, and Romain Dumas.

In addition to these successes, Porsche announced that they will be returning to the FIA World Endurance Championship in the LMDh category in 2024. The LMDh class allows manufacturers to compete with a combination of hybrid power and combustion engines, and Porsche has a rich history in endurance racing with their 919 Hybrid program.

Fritz Enzinger, Vice President of Porsche Motorsport, said in a statement, "We are really excited to announce our return to the FIA World Endurance Championship with an LMDh car. Porsche has a long history of success in endurance racing, and we are looking forward to competing with the top manufacturers in the world once again."


