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



n April 7th, we will host a Car Control Clinic at David Crockett High School in Jonesborough, TN. This unique, one-day course is designed to teach proper car control for everyday driving, enhancing safety and driving skills. We believe this event holds significant importance for everyone as it offers invaluable insights into vehicle handling and dynamics, which can help prevent accidents and save lives. This event is free but limited to 30 participants. Hurry up!

The clinic is open to everyone aged 18 and over with a valid driver's license. It is not limited to Porsche Club members or Porsche vehicles; if you have any family member interested in joining, let them know; any car owner can participate. Our experienced Driver Instructors have tailored a program that includes a variety of practical exercises. Participants will learn throttle and brake control, emergency braking, collision avoidance, and how to handle their vehicle in skid situations. The event is designed to be engaging and educational, suitable for a broad range of driving abilities.

You should expect the following stations at the course:

- Skid pad: for skid control and throttle steering
- · Corner: Early, mid, late apex and effect on corner exit
- Slalom: Shifting car inertia and looking ahead
- Intersection: Emergency braking and collision avoidance

Our journey covers the entire length of the Snake, from Bristol to Shady Valley, then from Shady Valley to Mountain City, including a route through the Backbone Rock Campground area and the shortest Natural Tunnel in the US. We'll also explore some lesser-known but equally thrilling mountain backroads on our way back to Bristol. Our adventure-filled day wraps up at Michael Waltrip Brewing, where we can relax with a fantastic selection of beers and a bar menu, in a vibrant atmosphere. And here's a fun fact for car enthusiasts: Michael Waltrip, the brewery's namesake, is a celebrated two-time DAYTONA 500 champion and a notable figure in the NASCAR community.



he Porsche Club of America is gearing up for its 68th annual Porsche Parade, a spectacular weeklong event that will take place from June 9 to 15, 2024, in the vibrant city of Birmingham, Alabama. The Sheraton Birmingham Hotel and the Westin Birmingham Hotel will serve as the central hubs for most of the activities, offering an exclusive PCA discounted room rate of \$179 plus tax, a good deal compared to the standard rate of \$337.

Registration for Phase 1 ended on March 22nd and those who have registered will register for Phase II starting on Wednesday, April 3 (12:00 PM ET). During Phase II, the club members who have registered to the Parade will be able to select what competitive and non-competitive they want to attend.

The event includes competitive events like the Concours d'Elegance, where beautifully maintained and restored Porsches are displayed and judged on their condition, authenticity, and cleanliness. There are also sporting competitions, such as autocross, time-speed-distance (TSD) rallies, and technical quiz competitions that test knowledge of Porsche history and specifics. If you are patient, you will most likely be able to attend the event. Additional events may potentially be added to the calendar (if possible). If all fails, you will be refunded your money if you do not get in. At the Parade, there will be a

whiteboard with people selling or giving away tickets to events they are unable to attend. You also must register for two hours o f voluntary work during the Parade. If you're o i n g autocross, you only need to volunteer for one assignment because you'll be doing course work anyhow.



Missed this event? Don't worry! Our next autocross is already open for registration. If you've never tried autocross before, it's a thrilling and rewarding experience you won't want to miss!





How to Jack The Car Up

o you know how to jack up your 993? Here is a safe approach for DIY projects. The first step is getting it properly jacked up. Remember, quality tools are crucial for your car's safety and yours. Don't skimp on costs – a reliable jack and stands are worth the investment. Harbor Freight Tools is a recommended spot for these essentials, but feel free to shop around. When choosing a floor jack, opt for one with a removable cup. This feature is crucial. Without the cup, the jack's flat area evenly distributes the weight, reducing the risk of damaging your car's jack points. This is particularly important if your car is lowered, as removing the cup often makes it easier to fit the jack under the car.

Safety tip: Always use jack stands! Avoid placing them under suspension components or areas not designed as jacking points. While other safe spots exist on the 993, stick to the designated points unless you're confident in your alternative choice. Here are three ways to lift your car:

1. **Front Only**: Use a floor jack at the rear jack point, then set a jack stand under the front jack point. Lower the car onto the stand. Repeat on the other side.

2. Rear Only: Position the floor jack under 59 the engine crankcase (make sure any undertray is removed first). Lift to your desired height, place jack stands at the rear points, and lower the jack.

3. All Wheels: Start with method 1 to lift the front, then use method 2 for the rear.

Remember, your Porsche 993 deserves care and respect, so take the time to do this right and keep it in top shape!

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How to build your own brake fluid power bleeder 61

Flushing a brake system usually needs two people - one to operate the brake pedal and the other to open the valves at the caliper. However, there's a risk of damaging the master cylinder piston with this traditional method, as it may travel further than in normal use, potentially harming the seal. So, I will show you how to create a simple yet effective DIY power bleeder. This setup negates the need for repeatedly opening the reservoir cap and requires just one person.

You can assemble this power bleeder with parts from Home Depot and Walmart for under \$60. The design involves using an air compressor with an adjustable regulator to pressurize new brake fluid from a supply bottle. This fluid is then pushed through a custom-made brake reservoir cap, which replaces your stock cap, and flows through the brake system, exiting at the bleeder nut on the caliper. While it's possible to adapt this system to work with a spare tire, it focus on the air compressor method.

This homemade bleeder was tested by pressurizing the system to 20 psi, and it's held up perfectly. There's no reason it shouldn't work as well as the \$150 commercial units since it's essentially the same.

You will need to start with an extra brake fluid reservoir cap for you car. You can purchase it from your local Porsche dealer:








This is about as far apart as you can take apart the cap.







A hole will need to be drilled on the black cap in order for the valve stem to fit through.





This is how the completed unit look.



This is where the air source connects, this same point can also be exchanged with a valve stem connector to connect to the spare tire. In this case I am connecting it to my air compressor.



You will need to find a brake fluid supply bottle which will hold the extra brake fluid to be pumped to the brake reservoir when it is bleeded out, You can find it at Walmart at their "Camping equipment" section. The bottle has to be strong and have a tight seal and will hold at least 20 psi of pressure. Two holes need to be drilled to accommodate the connectors one which will be connected to the air source, the other to the custom made reservoir cap. Besides drilling out the hole I also used the Dremel to smooth out the edges.





All the fitting are from Home depot from their air tools parts section. these are all air hose connectors and adapters.





After completed the system without any rubber washers it was found out pressurized air leaks out around the connector area. Some rubber seal was purchased from Home Depot at their "sink" section of the store and installed them on both the top and the bottom of the connectors.



Here is a picture of the completed cap, the air inlet compresses the bottle with compressed air, and the only way pressure to exit the bottle is through the clear rubber hose on the other connector which will be hooked to the custom made spare reservoir cap via the valve stem.



It was used tape seal on all the fittings to prevent any leaks. This is a picture of the valve stem quick connect which can be hooked and lock on the valve stem of the custom made reservoir cover. The other end of the brass connector will connect to the outlet of the brake fluid bottle.

he Porsche Penske Motorsport team achieved a podium finish in the 12 Hours of Sebring with their Daytona-winning Porsche 963, driven by Felipe Nasr, Dane Cameron, and Matt Campbell, securing third place. However, their sister car, No. 6, experienced a series of misfortunes, including an incident that resulted in a ninth-place finish, while another prototype managed an eighth-place result. In the GTD-Pro class, AO Racing's Porsche 911 GT3 R narrowly missed a podium spot, while Wright Motorsports earned third place in the GTD category. The race began under favorable weather conditions, with all top GTP class teams focusing on tire conservation for the later stages. The No. 7 Porsche initially lost ground due to an extra pit stop but regained the lead, while the No. 6 car faced a setback when Frédéric Makowiecki had a collision and tire issue, resulting in a significant loss of time. As the race progressed into cooler nighttime temperatures, the No. 7 car's performance slightly diminished, leading to its third-place finish after a final sprint. Thomas Laudenbach, Vice President of Porsche Motorsport, acknowledged the challenges faced in the cooler conditions and praised the team's effort and Wright Motorsports' success in the GTD class. Urs Kuratle, Director Factory Motorsport LMDh, noted the setbacks and the commendable podium finish for car No. 7. Jonathan Diuguid, Managing Director of Porsche Penske Motorsport, expressed pride in the team's performance but recognized the need for further analysis to improve speed. In the GTP class, Porsche customer teams showed competitive pace but couldn't sustain it towards the end, with Proton Competition's No. 5 car falling to eighth and JDC-Miller MotorSports retiring due to technical issues. The GT classes saw varied success for Porsche customer teams. AO Racing's Porsche 911 GT3 R was in contention for a win but ended up ninth after a penalty. Wright Motorsports, however, managed a third-place finish in the GTD class, thanks to drivers Adam Adelson, Elliott Skeer, and Jan Heylen. Andretti Motorsports and MDK Motorsports finished in the eighth and twelfth spots, respectively, rounding out the mixed results for Porsche teams in the event.

Formula E: Porsche Delivers Strong Team Performance

he Porsche team made a significant impact at the São Paulo E-Prix, part of the ABB FIA Formula E World Championship, marking a strong return after a considerable hiatus. In the Brazilian heat, three Porsche 99X Electric cars impressively finished in the top six. Pascal Wehrlein, the top Porsche driver, secured his second pole position of the season and finished fourth, propelling the TAG Heuer Porsche Formula E



Team to the second position in the team standings.

The race unfolded under challenging conditions with a temperature of 33 degrees Celsius. Wehrlein led from the pole for the 34-lap race on the fast 2.933-kilometre São Paulo Street Circuit. The event was filled with lead changes and overtaking maneuvers. Wehrlein maintained his position in the leading group but narrowly missed a podium finish. His teammate, António Félix da Costa, also shone with a sixth-place finish, marking his first championship points in 2024 after a challenging start.

Jake Dennis from Andretti Formula E, a Porsche customer team, finished fifth. Norman Nato, piloting the second Porsche 99X Electric for Andretti's team, ended the race in 18th.

With these results, the TAG Heuer Porsche Formula E Team has accumulated 61 points, rising to second in the team classification behind Jaguar's leading 96 points. Andretti Formula E is currently fifth with 47 points. In the drivers' standings, Wehrlein is a close second with 53 points, just four behind leader Nick Cassidy. Dennis is fifth with 38 points, Nato is thirteenth with nine, and after São Paulo, Félix da Costa ranks fifteenth.

Florian Modlinger, Director Factory Motorsport Formula E, reflected on the weekend as positive but acknowledged that the team could have capitalized more. Wehrlein expressed satisfaction with his qualifying performance but felt more could have been achieved during the race, particularly after safety car phases which made overtaking challenging.

Félix da Costa, meanwhile, felt a podium was within reach but recognized areas for team improvement. He was determined to showcase a solid performance in São Paulo, matching the pace of the fastest drivers.

As the season progresses, Wehrlein leads Porsche's charge, ranked second in the drivers' standings. The team is focused on building on their strengths and addressing weaknesses as they prepare for upcoming races, including Tokyo. The early season standings show Jaguar leading in the teams' category, with Porsche's teams closely following, indicating a competitive season ahead.

Sebastian Vettel tests the Porsche 963

n March 22, 2024, Porsche Penske Motorsport announced that Sebastian Vettel, a winner of 53 Formula 1 Grands Prix. is set to test drive the Porsche 963 hypercar at Motorland Aragón, Spain. Vettel, who has extensive simulator experience for the track, will be trying out the hybrid prototype for the first time. This event is part of Porsche's preparation for the upcoming 24 Hours of Le Mans, featuring a 36-hour



long run in Spain. The Porsche 963 has been a part of the IMSA sports car series and the FIA World Endurance Championship WEC since 2023 and has already achieved wins in both championships in 2024. The WEC, including the Le Mans race, will use biofuel, a practice started in March 2022. Vettel, excited about the test, considers it a new experience with no future plans confirmed yet: "I'm looking forward to testing the Porsche 963. I already got the chance to get a feel for the car during a rollout in Weissach," says Sebastian Vettel. "I've always followed other racing series and my curiosity for endurance events encouraged me to just give it a shot. Now I'm excited about the long run in Aragon and I'm looking forward to my time behind the wheel. It'll definitely take an adjustment and some getting used to but everyone in the team is very open and helps me. This will be a new experience for me. We will then see what happens next in this respect – at the moment there are no further plans for the future."

Porsche is enthusiastic about Vettel's participation and expects to gain valuable feedback:

"We're delighted that Sebastian Vettel is interested in our Porsche 963," explains Thomas Laudenbach, Vice President Porsche Motorsport. "There was no question for us that we'd be thrilled to support his request for an opportunity to test and provide him with extensive preparation and plenty of time to drive our hybrid prototype - there's no doubt we'll learn a lot from his valuable feedback. Our 36-hour long run



with Porsche Penske Motorsport and our works drivers at Motorland Aragón offers a perfect environment for this."

The test at Motorland Aragón also involves works drivers from Porsche Penske Motorsport, aiming to prepare for the Le Mans race on June 15/16, where Porsche seeks its 20th victory. Additionally, Porsche Penske Motorsport plans to enter a third hybrid prototype in the 2024 Le Mans, with customer teams also participating with more Porsche 963 race cars and two Porsche 911 GT3 Rs in the new LMGT3 category.

orsche has expanded its electric sports sedan lineup with the addition of the Taycan Turbo GT and the Taycan Turbo GT with Weissach Package, setting new benchmarks in the electric vehicle segment. Both models deliver an astonishing power output of more than 1,000 hp [1], combining advanced technology and innovative design for superior driving dynamics. The Weissach Package, specifically tailored for track use, ditches the rear seats to enhance the power-to-weight ratio.

Before hitting the market, the Taycan Turbo GT with Weissach Package achieved remarkable feats, setting the fastest lap record for electric series-production cars at California's Weathertech Raceway Laguna Seca. Porsche development driver Lars Kern clocked a time of 1:27.87, beating previous electric car records. The same model also set a new class record at the Nürburgring, recording a time of 7:07.55, significantly faster than previous Taycan models. These achievements underscore the exceptional track potential of the Taycan. The Taycan Turbo GT models, equipped with enhanced powertrain technology including a powerful pulse inverter with silicon carbide semiconductor material, demonstrate remarkable performance improvements. This advancement allows the Taycan Turbo GT to sprint from zero to 60 mph in just 2.1 seconds with the Weissach Package. Additionally, the pulse inverter increases system power, contributing to the Taycan Turbo GT's improved acceleration and dynamic driving experience.

Porsche has implemented innovative features like the "Attack Mode," boosting power by 120 kW (160 hp) for ten seconds, enhancing track performance. This feature, reminiscent of those used in Porsche's Formula E race cars, illustrates the brand's commitment to pushing the boundaries of electric vehicle technology. Furthermore, the Taycan Turbo GT models incorporate intelligent lightweight construction measures, including the use of carbon fiber components, and are fitted with Porsche Active Ride suspension, delivering an optimal driving experience. Priced starting at \$230,000, the Taycan Turbo GT redefine electric performance and are slated for delivery in summer 2024.

Autobahn Appetites: Buttermilk Soup With Chives

Ithough unusual in America, Buttermilk soup as Buttermilchsuppe as the Germans call it is fairly common in Germany. There are many variations of buttermilk soup recipes, some containing potatoes, some with beans and some with the addition of a seafood variety like crab. The recipe below is a basic version and I encourage you to experiment adding different favorite ingredients of your choice. Unlike most soups, buttermilk soup does not have to simmer for a long period of time to lock in the flavors. The buttermilk is guickly thickened with cornstarch and after the egg yolk is tempered back into the mixture, the soup only cooks for a few minutes more until it is ready to be garnished with chopped hardboiled egg pieces and fresh chives and served.

PREP TIME: 10 minutes COOK TIME: 15 minutes TOTAL TIME: 25 minutes YIELD: 4-6 servings

INGREDIENTS:

3 tablespoons cornstarch

- 4 cups buttermilk
- 1 tablespoon freshly chopped chives, plus more for garnish
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 large egg yolk
- 1 large hard-boiled egg, peeled and chopped into small pieces



PREPARATION:

In a large saucepan, whisk cornstarch into the buttermilk until completely combined.

Place the mixture over medium heat and stir the mixture constantly until it thickens.

Stir in salt and freshly chopped chives.

Beat the egg yolk in a small bowl.

Ladle a small amount of the buttermilk mixture into the egg yolk, streaming slowly and whisking briskly to temper the volk.

Pour the tempered egg yolk mixture back into the large sauce pan and stir until evenly combined.

Cook the buttermilk soup for another 3-5 minutes, stirring occasionally.

Pour the soup into bowls, garnish with the chopped hard-boiled egg pieces and fresh chopped chives and serve immediately.


