

s we shift gears into 2025, let's take a moment to reflect on the wonderful experiences of 2024, filled with smiles, laughter, memorable drives, and the forging of new friendships. While the end of the year was quieter for our club due to Helene's Hurricane, the colder weather and some personal commitments, planning for an exciting 2025 has been in full swing.

We're thrilled to announce two fantastic weekend events for the coming year: May in White Sulphur Springs, WV, and September to Murphy, NC. More details about these events in this newsletter. 

kind stranger and the awe I felt—a single moment that shaped my life. - Christopher Klein






MURPHY, NC - SEP. 11-14, 2025

PCA WERKS REUNION is an excellent opportunity for Porsche owners and fans to meet and share their passion. There is also a range of vendors and sponsors, offering everything from Porsche merchandise to aftermarket parts and services. It's a great place to find unique items and services tailored to Porsche owners.

The event is a celebration of Porsche's history and evolution, offering a deep dive into the brand's legacy. 

### Autobahn Appetites: Rinderroulade

inderrouladen are thin slices of beef, rolled up with bacon, onions, mustard, and pickles, then braised in a rich gravy. They are a hearty, comforting dish, perfect for a cold winter evening, often served with red cabbage and potato dumplings (Kartoffelklöße).

#### Ingredients:

- 4 thin slices of beef (about 150-200g each), from the top round or sirloin
- 4 slices of bacon (smoked or unsmoked)
- 1 large onion, finely diced
- 4-8 dill pickle spears (depending on size)
- 4 tbsp German mustard (medium-hot is best)
- Salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 2 tbsp vegetable oil or clarified butter
- 1 tbsp tomato paste
- 500ml beef broth
- 200ml red wine (optional, but adds depth of flavor)
- 1 bay leaf
- 2-3 juniper berries (optional)
- 1-2 sprigs of thyme or marjoram (optional)
- String or kitchen twine, or rouladen needles

#### Instructions:

- 1. Prepare the Beef: Lay each beef slice flat on a cutting board. Lightly pound them with a meat mallet to tenderize them further and make them slightly thinner. Season both sides with salt and pepper.
- 2. Assemble the Rouladen: Spread about 1 tbsp of mustard evenly over one side of each beef slice. Place a slice of bacon on one end, followed by a small pile of diced onion and 1-2 pickle spears (cut in half lengthwise if they are very thick).
- 3. Roll and Secure: Starting from the end with the fillings, tightly roll up each beef slice. Tie them securely with kitchen twine or use rouladen needles to keep them closed during cooking.
- 4. Sear the Rouladen: Heat the oil or clarified butter in a large, heavy-bottomed pot or Dutch oven over medium-high heat. Sear the rouladen on all sides until nicely browned. This is important for developing flavor. Remove the rouladen from the pot and set aside.
- 5. Make the Gravy: Add the remaining diced onion to the pot and sauté until softened and translucent. Stir in the tomato paste and cook for 1-2 minutes, stirring constantly, to lightly caramelize it.
- 6. Deglaze and Simmer: Pour in the beef broth and red wine (if using), scraping up any browned bits from the bottom of the pot. Add the bay leaf, juniper berries (if

using), and thyme or marjoram (if using). Bring the liquid to a simmer.

- 7. Braise the Rouladen: Return the rouladen to the pot, making sure they are mostly covered by the liquid. If needed, add more beef broth. Reduce the heat to low, cover the pot, and simmer gently for at least 1.5-2 hours, or until the beef is very tender. The longer they simmer, the more tender and flavorful they become.
- 8. Thicken the Gravy (optional): If the gravy is too thin after the rouladen are cooked, remove the rouladen from the pot. Mix 1-2 tablespoons of cornstarch with a little cold water to create a slurry. Whisk the slurry into the simmering gravy and cook for a few minutes, stirring constantly, until the gravy thickens to your desired consistency.
- 9. Serve: Remove the twine or needles from the rouladen. Serve hot with red cabbage and potato dumplings. The gravy should be generously spooned over everything.

#### **Tips and Variations:**

- You can add a carrot, some celery root (Knollensellerie), or leek to the braising liquid for extra flavor.
- Some people add a small piece of smoked sausage to the filling of each roulade.
- If you don't have red wine, you can use more beef broth or a splash of red wine vinegar.
- For a richer gravy, you can use a combination of beef and veal broth.


