

PCA WERKS REUNION AMELIA ISLAND 2022 - MAR 4

CA WERKS Reunion brings more than 500 Porsches on display to Amelia Island, FL in March and many hundreds more to the streets on that weekend. Registration is open at https://www.werksreunion.com/ amelia.cfm.

Corral Parking (Porsche only) early registration is \$60 per car, includes a WERKS event bag, reserved parking space, and automatically entered into raffle contests. Spectator parking fee is \$40 per car. Must be a PCA member to display your Porsche, but anyone can attend the event as spectator.

The PCA WERKS is on March 4th and the great thing about that weekend is that it is also the **Amelia Concours d'Elegance** weekend. I attended the event for the first time in 2021 and I am not an expert by any means, but I would like to share with you my experience and why you should attend it in 2022 (Spoiler Alert: I am going back!).

First, if you want to attend Porsche PCA WERKS Reunion and/or Amelia Concours d'Elegance, I recommend you booking a room NOW. While hotels and resorts in Fernandina Beach still have rooms ranging from \$350 to \$500 per night, you may also want to consider checking airbnb.com or hotels away from the island for more budget options to find rooms below \$200/ night (depending where you are in Jacksonville, you are not to away from the main events locations). A few months ago (May to be more precise), I got an Airbnb apartment from Thursday (March 3rd) to Sunday (March 6th) located at Fernandina Beach, a block from the beach and 8 minutes from where the main events are located, for about \$850 total. Prices will just go up and rooms will become scarce once the Amelia Concours d'Elegance tickets goes on sale in January.

So, what else is there to do on that weekend?

Thursday is when most of the people that are attending the events will be arriving in Amelia. Plan for a +7:30 hrs drive on Thursday, leaving very early from Tri-Cities, stopping for lunch and gas on the way and arriving in Amelia Island late in the afternoon. Dinner with other Porsche friends on one of the many restaurants in downtown or at the beach is a great way to end the day.

n Friday you should plan for a great day at the PCA WERKS **Reunion** from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm. Whether you are displaying your Porsche at the Corral or just visiting, swing by the parking lot a few times a day; the parking lot is as good as the Car Show itself. On Friday you can also opt for attending the Porsche Experience, which in my opinion, is worth only after you have attended WERKS a few times. If that's your first time going there, stick with PCA WERKS, do not make the same mistake as I did! The most interesting thing on Porsche Experience is visiting Brumos Collection and also the opportunity to drive a Porsche or two on a small course at the Airport. But again, I would rather attend WERKS than the Porsche Experience.

On Friday afternoon, once WERKS is over, go to the RM Sotheby's Amelia Island Preview. It's free and open to anyone from 10:00 am to 8:00 pm at the Ritz-Carlton Ocean Front Lawn and Ballroom Thursday to Saturday (I almost missed the cars at the hotel's ballroom!). An opportunity to see amazing cars that will be auctioned that weekend, like Ferrari F40 and F50, the 918 Porsche Spyder, RUF, Bugatti and many other amazing multi-million dollar cars. From there you can poke around downtown and around the Ritz campus, always bound to find something cool. Dinner with your old Porsche and new Porsche friends is another great way to end the day!

aturday morning, over 450 classic and exotic cars from local car clubs will be displayed on Cars & Coffee at Fairways of the Golf Club of Amelia Island. Spectator Free. definitely don't miss this as it always features an incredible variety of cars.



If you didn't have chance to check all the cars at the RM Sotheby's Amelia Island Preview on Friday afternoon, the preview is located at walking distance from Cars & Coffee, don't miss them! It's also worth to check the same cars again at the daylight. Spend the rest of Saturday sightseeing and exploring. Catch the show cars getting unloaded from their transporters, or seeing what treasures are hidden in the parking garage at the Ritz Carlton.

Got some money left at your pockets? Go visit The Shop at the Concours from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm at the Show Field, The Golf Club of Amelia Island. Amazing car memorabilia and luxury items available to buy.

On Saturday evening (and Friday evening if you have time) I highly recommend walking around Ritz Carlton valet and the hotel's garage. It will blow your mind! I got to see a Ferrari LaFerrari (\$7 millions), a McLaren Elva (\$2.5 million) casually parked at the garage and so many other jewels-on-wheels.


Sunday is the big day. That's the **Amelia Concours d'Elegance** day. Tickets will go on sale in January, last year it did cost around \$150 and they usually sell-out the same day. One of the tickets includes lunch at the hotel and honestly, I would rather pack a sandwich or some snacks and save some money or have late lunch somewhere else. If you never attended, I recommend doing it, but my personal opinion is that once you have attended more than once, it seems to be more of the same (and I am not a huge fan of car shows that display only vintage cars).

I might head back home on Sunday and not attend the Concours d'Elegance this year or spend the Sunday sightseeing at the Historic Downtown.

This is a very high-level suggestion of things to do in 3 or 4 days. I am sure there are many other events and opportunities to take most of the weekend in Fernandina Beach area, which I will try in 2022. Check below some other events that I missed in 2021 during that weekend.




