### County votes to buy 8 new radios and pay utilities for Primrose Fire Department

The Lee County Fiscal Court met in regular session on Thursday, April 14, 2022 at 6 p.m. in the Lee County Courthouse with Judge Canfield and all magistrates in attendance.

Magistrate Dennis Palfrey opened the meeting with prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Department reports were first on the agenda. Scott Jackson, Economic Development gave a report considering tourism. He said in the past weeks two properties had been sold and the buyers were looking at building 11 cabins in one and 12 on the other. He also said Lion Apparel now had 60 employees and was still hiring.

Jon Allen gave a report on the ambulance service saying things were going good. Several EMT's were taking the Advanced EMT Class

and were doing great. He also said they were getting two new CPR machines purchased by Public Health at no cost to the county. Allen said that FEMA funding had been approved for several projects and that the State Legislature had changed the matching funds from 75-25 to 50-50 which will help the county tremendously.

Road Foreman Kevin McDaniel reported that the road department was going well and that the backhoe machine was ready to go.

Angie Williams, Solid Waste Director reported that her department had collected \$46,338.60 for the month of March. April 23 has been designated as free day garbage in Lee County. Materials will be received at the land fill on

The initial purpose of this project was to put use into the beautiful county roads and to stimulate local business economy while improving and preserving the roads from illegal closures, vandalism, erosion, and other risks. The Daniel Boone Back Country Byway is made possible through support from local counties. Mersey Health - Marsum and Wallace Hospital will host a FREE Community Carotid scan event on Tuesday, May 17th.

The event will be held at Lee County Recreation Center (located at 1932 Old HWY 11, Beattyville) from 2:00 - 6:00 p.m. Appointments for the event are limited and pre-registration is required. Call 606-726-8185 to schedule a time for a Carotid screening and

Stroke Risk Assessment. Lee County Primary Care APRN, Heather Pike says, "Carotid artery disease is a major risk factor for stroke, developing slowly and often without symptoms. Carotid arteries are the two large blood vessels in the neck that supply blood to the brain. When they become clogged with plaque, they narrow, affecting

blood flow to the brain. The DBBB is of moderate difficulty and open to licensed vehicles only. It is designed for entry level off-roading and providing a safe and rewarding driving experience. The initial purpose of this project was to put use into the beautiful county roads and to stimulate local business economy while improving and preserving the roads from illegal closures, vandalism, erosion, and other risks. The Daniel Boone Back Country Byway is made possible through support from local counties. There is some savanah that looks like baby breath in touches of white and you will just have to see it to believe the awesome beauty it holds. Trees are greening up and getting ready to show their splendor to the county.

May... with the little winters that put you back on the house under your good warm blanket and light the fireplace again. Flip on the TV for a favorite old black and white American movie classic with John Wayne, Betty Davis, Curt Douglas, Maureen O'Hare, or Audie Murphy. (Watched one of Audie Murphy's last night on FSNP channel). Little winters of spring that say warmer weather is on its way. Surveys, dogwood and blackberry and red bud.

Winters. We kinda never know which one is which. But watch out for the surprise frosty mornings yet to come. You all know the ones that pinch your toes; you just set out the garden.

The Thunder Storms that May brings. Really dark, heavy clouds, streaks of silver lightning light up the heavy dark skies, huge rolling thunder. Surprises of daily storms, night storms, pop up storms. Some heavy down pours and some light that put you to sleep almost instantly.

Raise the windows and listen to the rain and storms. Wow.

The flowers of May have been seeing winter's blossoming like crazy.

Daffodils and tulips have already made their appearance and shown themselves. They will return again next year. Lilacs, hydrangeas, peonies, anises, dianthus, lins, phlox, and of course lins never forget the wonderful little faces of the Pansies. They are my favorite.

All the work that's needs to be done in May. All the yard cleaning of the flowers of shrubs and trees and lots of other things. Yard work is definitely non-stop year round job to be done. Blood eating. That's a non-stop job also. You can also do a lot of spraying to try to control the weeds and grass so it won't take so much mowing. Gardening is a big job for May. Lots of things to plan out and work on in the gardening line. Time also to clean out barns and out buildings. And watch out for snakes, they are definitely crawling.

Birds. LIKE WOW those precious little things. They are singing their little hearts out all the time. They still need to be fed. PORK milk into large bowl. Add dry pudding mixes. Beat with wire whisk 2 minutes or until well blended. Gently stir in 1 cup of the whipped topping, spread evenly over banana layer in pan. Top with the remaining 1 cup of whipped topping, sprinkle with pecans. Cover with foil. Freeze 2 hours. Just before serving, slice remaining 1/2 cup of whipping cream, spread evenly over top. Slice 1/2 inch thick. Makes 24 servings.

Layered Dolce De Leche Dessert ( WOW, does this one sound divine )

40 vanilla wafers, divided  
1 1/2 cups cold milk  
2 pkg. (4 serving size each) Jello Vanilla Flavored instant pudding and pie filling  
1 tub (8 oz) Cool Whip whipped topping, thawed  
1 cup caramel topping  
CHOP four of the wafers. Set aside. Line 9x5 in. loaf pan with foil, with ends of foil extending over sides of pan. Arrange 12 of the remaining wafers in single layer on bottom of prepared pan. Set aside.

PORK milk into large bowl. Add dry pudding mixes. Beat with wire whisk 2 min. or until well blended. (Mixture will be thick). Gently stir in the whipped topping. Spoon one-third of the pudding mixture over wafers in pan; top with 1/2 of the remaining wafers and 2 Tbsp. of the caramel topping. Repeat layers of pudding mixture, wafers and caramel topping.

Cover with the remaining pudding mixture. Sprinkle with chopped wafers, press wafers gently into pudding mixture.

FREEZE 4 hours or until firm. Lift dessert from pan using foil handles. Remove lid. Place dessert on serving plate. Let stand 15 minutes to soften slightly before cutting into 12 slices to serve. Slice leftover dessert in freezer. Makes 12 slices.

JAZZ IT UP! Drizzle dessert slices lightly with additional caramel topping just before serving.

\*Very Strawberry Cheesecake

1 pkg. (8 oz) Philadelphia cream cheese, softened  
1/3 cup sugar  
2 cups thawed cool whip  
strawberry whipped topping  
1 Honey Maid graham cracker  
1 cup sliced strawberries

BEAT cream cheese and sugar in large bowl with electric mixer on medium speed until well blended. Gently stir in whipped topping.

SPOON into crust. REFRIGERATE 3 hours or until set. Top with strawberries just before serving. Slice leftover cheesecake in refrigerator. Makes 8 servings.

When you make one of these heavenly desserts, remember a friend or a loved one and take them a special piece to enjoy. They will not forget your kind deed.

## Formula 1 2022 Season is in the heat!

After 9 rounds (out of 22 races) RedBull Team (Porsche F1 partner in 2026) is now leading the championship with its two drivers after overtaking Scuderia Ferrari (due to a series of strategy mistakes or bad luck). Lewis Hamilton and Mercedes were dominating F1 for the past seven years but they are struggling to get their cars ahead of Ferrari and RedBull this year, but the good news is that the rookie, George Russel, has been scoring top 5 in all of the races this season. While Daniel Ricciardo (McLaren) isn't performing well and doesn't even figure in the top 10, Lando Norris has been able to maintain a moderate consistency in scoring points for McLaren! Valtteri Bottas is doing a phenomenal job for Alfa Romeo and is in the 8th place in the championship followed by the Alpine (former Renault) with the young French man Ocon and the older driver on the grid, Fernando Alonso. The next race is this first weekend of July on Sunday, July 3rd at the Silverstone Circuit.

## THE SAFETY HELMET / BRAIN BUCKET / MELLON PROTECTOR - BY PEDRO P. BONILLA GCR PCA

The head is probably your most important asset and the most vulnerable part of your body during an accident. While the driver's body is strapped in very tightly to the seat, the head can jerk around uncontrollably. The helmet is designed to dissipate impact energy over the entire helmet and prevent debris from puncturing it.

Every professional and amateur race car driver is required to wear some type of protective safety helmet. Most choose a full-face helmet, which covers the entire head and wraps around the mouth and chin. Others wear an open-face helmet, which only covers the head. Drivers who wear the open-face helmet usually wear protective goggles or face shields as well. Some claim that a full-face helmet restricts their peripheral vision or that it's too hot inside the car.

There are three main parts to racing helmets:

- Outer shell
- BeadALL liner
- Inner liner, padding and hardware

Once a shell design has been approved, a custom-made nickel model is created for that particular helmet. Construction of the outer shell begins with a thin layer of gelcoat. Then a special resin, consisting of several types of glass, carbon, Kevlar and other exotic fibers and weaves, is added to the shell. This all combines to make the hard, glossy outer shell.

Just underneath the outer shell is the BeadALL liner, which is a special foam layer in the crown of the helmet. The purpose of this liner is to absorb the energy that the outer shell has not absorbed. This layer is made of polystyrene or polypropylene.

The inner liner of most helmets is a form-fitting layer that is made of either nylon or Nomex. Nomex is a special fire-retardant material made by DuPont. It doesn't melt, drip, burn or support combustion. Helmets are also equipped with cheek pads, chin straps and visors. The visor is made of a tough Lexan plastic. Lexan, which is also used in many racing cars' windshields, is commonly known for its use in bulletproof glass.

All helmets go through some sort of testing before they are considered safe enough for high-speed racing. The Snell Memorial Foundation is an independent organization that sets voluntary standards for auto-racing (and other application) helmets. The standards set forth by Snell are more stringent than the DOT standards, and are the ones used for auto racing in the USA. To test the impact resistance of a racing helmet, Snell places the helmet onto a metal head form and drops it onto various types of anvils. If the peak acceleration impacting the metal head exceeds a magnitude of force equal to 300 Gs, or 300 times the force of gravity, it is rejected.



This level of impact is hard to conceptualize -- a head-on impact at 30 mph into a concrete wall is measured at 80 Gs. Most impacts on a race track are between 50 and 100 Gs. A 100-G impact for a 160-pound man would feel like 16,000 pounds pressing on top of him.

There are several types of motorsport safety helmets available on the market:

- SA: Sports Application
- M: Motorcycle
- K: Karting

Each one must meet specific and unique safety and protective requirements.

Snell "SA" (Sports Application) rated professional helmets are designed for auto racing and provide extreme impact resistance and higher fire protection.

When I'm doing tech inspection at any of our events which require certified helmet approval, I always get asked: "Why can't I use my motorcycle (or karting) helmet?"

Well, here's what I tell them:

The Key differences between SA, M and K Rated Helmets are:

SA standard requires flammability test while the M and K standard does not.

SA standard has rollbar impact tests while the M standard does not.

SA standard allows narrower visual field than the M standard (Some SA helmets aren't street legal).

To identify there standards, each manufacturer of a certified safety helmet must include the official Snell sticker inside the helmet. Snell revises and updates their standards every 5 years, so the newest standard available is the 2010 (just made available on 4/1/10). Most of the manufacturers will have SA2010 - stickered helmets on the market by September or October 2010. This is what those stickers look like:



For DE and Club Racing applications, Porsche Club of America and most auto clubs accept the last two Snell certifications for Sports Application (SA) helmets.

So, as of today, you may participate in a PCA Driver Education or Club Race event if your helmet has a Snell SA2000 or SA2005 sticker. By the end of the year, your helmet must have SA2005 or SA2010 and the SA2000 will no longer be accepted at DE events.



For Autocross the standards are a bit more relaxed and older Snell certifications are accepted, such as SA2000 and SA1995.



If you have an SA2000 or older Snell-certified helmet you will not be able to use it PCA DE or Club Race events, but we welcome your donating it to the Gold Coast Region PCA for the AX Helmet Loaner Program. Many newcomers to the sport come to their first AX events without any helmet protection and the Club provides loaners for them so they can participate and get themselves into motorsports. Because AX is run at much slower speeds, older Snell-certifications are still valid and accepted at AX events. But we can only accept SA-certified helmets, not M or K. ### PCA Update

#### PCA Directors Suspend Member

At its meeting on July 11, 1978, the Board of Directors of PCA voted, by more than two thirds of the members present or represented, to suspend a member for violation of the General Objectives in the use of The Mart.

The facts were, as documented, that the suspended member advertised a Porsche for sale, accepted a deposit, called off the offer to sell, and then did not at once return the deposit in full. At the time of the vote he still retained \$75 of the deposit, about six months after receipt of the deposit.

This indicates to me that the Directors of your Club are taking a hard line on transactions between members and probably on transactions by members with non-members. In the past I have been able to resolve conflicts between members in the use of The Mart but in this one I failed and had to present the facts to the Directors. Dealings through The Mart must be honest and above

board. In my experience most failures are due to delay and this example tells me that delay in delivery or refund will result in suspension. The same is true of misrepresentation.

#### No Passengers at Most PCA Events

Except for rallies, tours, gymkhanas (which require the presence of a passenger), and approved instructors at driver education events, *there is to be no more than one person in a car in PCA events.* This applies equally to both practice and competitive runs.

This restriction was considered necessary by a large majority of the Board of Directors of PCA at the National Board Meeting on July 11.

The basic problem is that the carrying of passengers is not necessary for the conduct of most PCA events and the carrying of passengers creates an unnecessary insurance exposure for the Club.

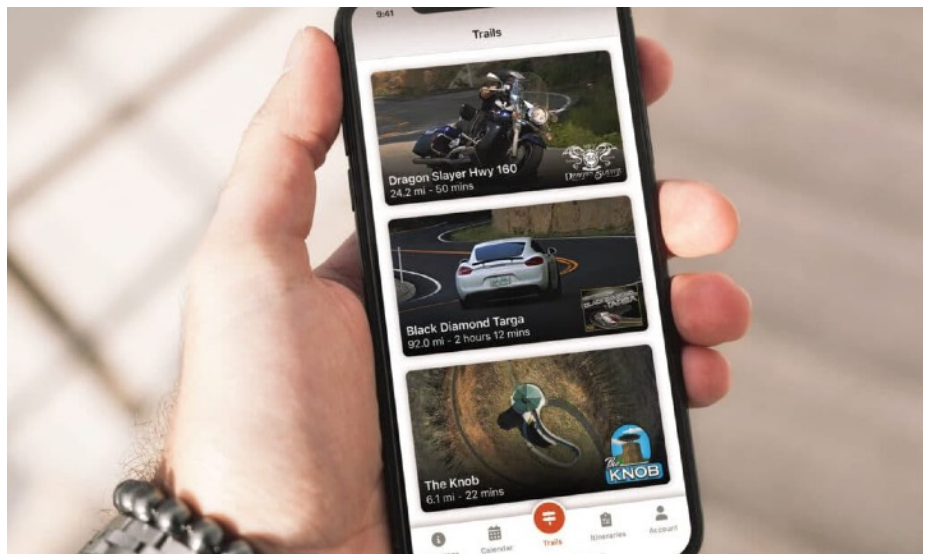
