Porsche 934: The 911 Turbo that became a race car

Much is said about the Porsche 935, and rightly so – it was practically a missing link between the Porsche 911 and a sports prototype, as were many cars made according to Group 5 regulations in the 1970s and 1980s. The central portion it was clearly 911, but the fenders, hood and rear were modified







There's a Porsche 962

Introduced in 1989 as the Porsche 911 Speedster, the limited low-windshield 911 was an immediate hit. Taking styling cues from the late 50's 356 Speedster, the modern version sported both narrow and wide hips, with the wider bodywork coming directly from the 930. For some this special edition 911 would be a collectible, but one owner wanted something much more from the Speedster. From the teamwork at Canepa Motorsports in 1990 and the visionary ideas from Bruce Canepa, perhaps the most powerful and fastest 911 Speedster was born: the 962 twin-turbo Speedster.





he Snake (US-421) is said to have "489 curves, 3 mountains and 1 valley packed into 33 miles". 


his mid-June, five of the Wilderness Trail Region members attended a Porsche-only 3-day rally, driving through the Tennessee and North Carolina mountains. The event (not organized or sponsored by PCA), brought more than 100 cars from 20 different states to legendary roads, such as the Tail of the Dragon, Cherohala Skyway, Moonshiner 28, Foothills Parkway, Blue Ridge Parkway, The Hellbender and many fun backroads like the Elijay Rd, Hiwassee Dam, Wayah Rd, Tilley Rd and the road we shall not speak of (seriously, we can't disclose the road's name!) to name a few. Each day was filled with driving and some strategic stops. On average, we drove around 300 miles / 6.5 hours each day, obeying the social distancing rules, which I thought it would be a challenge with a large group, but everyone managed it well. The event was a blast, to say the least. On every other stop and during the the morning staging each day, there were plenty of opportunities to safely socialize and make new friends, many of them members from various PCA regions (including two beautiful GT3RS).



ECH TALK: FLAT SIX WHEEL SPACERS

(DANIEL THOMPSON)

When I first met Daniel on Facebook, I could tell how passionate he was for all of his cars, in special for his Black 911 Carrera (991), the only Porsche on his garage at that time (photo below). Few months later we met in person, attending a Porsche's rally at the curvy roads of the Smoky Mountains, including the legendary Tail of the Dragon. Daniel is a hardworking guy with crazy working shifts, but he always finds some time to drive his Porsche, which is always shining. Living at Roan Mountain's area, you have a big chance to spot him living life on the fast lane through US-421, aka The Snake!



This April, Daniel brought home a Black Macan Turbo or 1BADTURBO as his car is called. Besides keeping his cars pristine clean, Daniel also enjoys doing some hands-on mods on his toys. One of the first modifications he did on his MACAN Turbo was adding Wheel Spacers. I was very impressed when he shared on Facebook. The project turned so well and he made it looks so easy that I asked him to tell us how he did it. I hope you find his DIY useful and enjoy the reading it.

ITEMS NEEDED

- Brake caliper paint
- Gloves
- Eye protection
- Mask
- Wire brush or drill with wire brush attachment
- Masking tape
- Car cover or plastic painters' sheets
- Newspaper
- Brake cleaner
- Rubbing alcohol
- Paper towels
- Wheel guide bolt
- Two 10mm wheel spacers (front)
- Two 12mm wheel spacers (rear)
- Twenty extended wheel bolts







INSTRUCTIONS

I am starting this project with the assumption of the wheel already being off the car since we all have our own way of doing things. So, let's get started:

1. Make sure you start with a clean vehicle. The car cover or plastic sheet will scratch the paint if applied over a dirty vehicle. Apply cover to prevent paint dust or rust particles from getting on the vehicle.

2. The next step requires eye protection, a good mask and gloves.

3. Use a wire brush or a drill with a wire brush attachment to go around the center of the rotor and the top of the rotor vein to knock off any rust or old paint.

4. Use rubbing alcohol and paper towels to go over everything you used the brush on. Wipe down everything a few times. This is very important to get the best results.

5. Next, tape up the brake caliper with newspaper or something similar to prevent overspray getting on them. Cover up anything that you may think paint overspray could get on.

6. Tape up the shiny rotor face where the brake pads are applied. This is the most time-consuming part of the job.











7. Reinstall old wheel studs or put paper towel in the thread holes to prevent paint getting in the threads which will make it very hard installing the new flat 6 studs correctly.

8. Spray a light coat of paint on rotor hat and rotor vein. Do not try to cover the whole thing with one coat of paint. Take your time and apply multiple light coats of paint waiting 5 to 15 min between coats.

9. You will notice the part of the rotor vein is not going to be painted just yet because the caliper covering that part. Un-tape part of the rotor so that you can turn the rotor enough to spray a few coats on the part that was missed.









10. I usually wait 30 minutes to an hour to dry then I start to un-tape the rotor and caliper.

11. You will have some paint on the rotor. It will come off with some brake cleaner but remember to spray brake cleaner on a towel pointing away from

vehicle and caliper. Rub gently and the paint will come off. If you can't get it all off, then that is fine because when you apply your brakes while driving it will remove the rest of the paint.

12. We are finally at the point to remove the old wheel studs and install the new wheel spacers making sure to align the holes up correctly. Make sure you have the correct wheel spacer for the front or back since they are different sizes.

13. Now is the time to go over everything and take another look to see if you missed anything when painting.

14. Reinstall the wheel with help using the included flat 6-wheel guide bolt and install your new flat 6-wheel studs. Torque wheel to your vehicle specs and recheck studs after you have driven at least 50 miles.





15. You have now completed this job!! Congratulation on a successful project!

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Wilderness Trail Region Porsche Club of America MARCH'09NEWSLETTER

March '09—-Giuseppe's Restaurant Meeting called to order by President Greg Miller

Greg reported on the Rolex 24 and showed slides of many of the race cars. He and a friend from Jacksonville attended and were able to spend a lot of time with fellow member and racer Steve Johnson. Steve invited them into the FarnbacherLoles garage and introduced them to many of the team and drivers. Greg would like more members attend the Rolex next year and possibly rent a couple RV's so everyone could stay in the infield with facilities.

Barbara gave a treasurer's report, we have \$10,404 in the checking account, which includes \$3,939 and \$1,718 from Motorsportreg for our D E in April at VIR. We still have to pay the balance on our D E and will receive more funds from Motorsportreg as the applications are received. Each D E event costs us around \$10,555 which includes track rental, PCA insurance, corner workers plus two additional workers to manage the in and out lanes onto the track. Novice class is full and we have 6spots left for instructors. By limiting the number of applicants to have smaller run classes, we will probably break even on the total costs.

Greg is working with a company in Charlotte on T-shirts for the D E event and showed everyone a couple graphic designs. He has checked with possible sponsors for the shirts but could not get any support. Consensus of opinion from everyone was that unless we find a sponsor we should hold off on the T-shirts and reconsider for our next D E.

HE PCA CODE OF ETHICS AND CONDUCT

This document is presented to define the standards and ethics to which the organization holds itself, its elected and appointed representatives, its employees, and its members. It supplements but does not replace our established Bylaws and procedures, which are documented elsewhere. The following represents the way we want to be and to do business.

PCA is not a political organization. It exists for the benefit of its members, to further their enjoyment of their cars. In the performance of this mandate, it must operate under the rule of law, adhering to the laws of the various countries and jurisdictions under which it exists. This means that illegal behavior is not tolerated, and that close attention is paid to the requirements of the law in the actions of all involved, national and regional officers, individual members, and those within the national office.

Beyond this, we accept the obligation to do what is right. An ethical system is based on the mutual benefit of the involved parties; the corollary of this is that we treat neither fellow members nor non-members in a way that is demeaning, embarrassing, derogatory, or otherwise inappropriate. This, of course, extends to our concept of respect and equal treatment for all, regardless of gender, race, religion, national origin or other such protected status. Our natural competitiveness does not extend to taking unfair advantage of others, be they individuals, clubs, or businesses. Actions and words about which there may be some question are undertaken, when possible, only after careful thought and perhaps consultation. (continue...)

Decisions affecting PCA should be either self-obvious or readily explained. Particular attention should be paid to potential conflicts of interest involving special treatment or gifts from individuals or companies possibly hoping to gain something in return. Other potential conflicts of interest, in which an officer, employee, or member must weigh his immediate and personal potential for gain against the best interests of PCA, require special thoughtful attention. Transparency in all actions is desirable. Nothing must be allowed to compromise the integrity, credibility, and best interests of PCA in the making of decisions that affect the club.

The culture of PCA is founded on doing the right thing to the best of our ability. Without this, we lose our self-respect both as an organization and as individuals, a price that we will not pay. Non-adherence to these principles will not be tolerated; behavior or actions damaging to PCA will be dealt with by the established club Bylaws, and may result in permanent loss of membership.
