APPLICATION AND AFFIDAVIT FOR ARREST WARRANT

STATE OF FLORIDA

COMES NOW THE AFFIANT, Detective Pamela Woehr, ID #601, a sworn law enforcement officer of the Winter Park Police Department, who, by first being duly sworn, states in a written and sworn Application and Affidavit for Arrest Warrant that there is probable cause to believe that on/between **January 11, 2019** in Orange County, Florida, the Defendant, **DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK**, born on 11/03/1973 did in violation of Florida State Statute unlawfully commit the following offense(s): **F.S.S. 782.04(2), 775.087(1)(a): Second degree Murder (with a weapon) (Life)**
F.S.S. 918.13(1)(a): Tampering with Evidence (F3).

On January 12, 2019, Detective Woehr was assigned the following case regarding a death investigation. The homicide occurred at a residence located at 1231 Temple Drive Winter Park, Orange County, FL 32789. This residence is within the jurisdictional boundaries of the Winter Park Police Department.

Detective Woehr possesses the 911 call that came into the Winter Park Police Department at 0928 hours on Saturday, January 12, 2019. The 911 call came from DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that her husband was deceased and there had been a "tragedy at her home". DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK gave the communications operator her address on 1231 Temple Drive, Winter Park.

DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK told Winter Park communications Operator Smith that she "believed her husband was deceased". Operator Smith asked why she believed that. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK started to say, "He's been...I just...he's stiff and he might have had a heart attack. I don't know."

Operator Smith asked if DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK just found him. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK paused and said, "No, actually. It happened last night." Operator Smith confirms that it happened last night. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK said, "Correct". Operator Smith asks how old her husband is. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK answers "He's 65".

Operator Smith again asks if DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK found him this morning, reconfirms that it happened last night, and asks if DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK saw him last night and if he was ok. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that "he was not ok last night".

DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK said, "we had an altercation and he stabbed himself and I ran and hid in the bathroom and when I came out I was trying to help him and saw he was lying in blood and then I tried to help him and I couldn't I..."

Operator Smith confirms that he stabbed himself. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK states, "Correct, yes... I tried to help him and I woke up and I was sitting next to him and I've been trying to figure out what to do."

Operator Smith confirms that they had an altercation last night. Operator Smith asks for her name and if there are any weapons. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK tells Operator Smith that there is a knife. Operator Smith confirms the age of the victim. Operator Smith asks if the victim stabbed himself last night and passed last night and stated "you" just didn't know what to do. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK said, "correct, I believe so, yes."

Operator Smith asks if they had been drinking. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK states that, "he was." DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK states that there was another altercation the night before but she left the house and took her children with her because he was drinking then too. Operator Smith asked if the kids were there last night during the altercation. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK says, "No! They were not. They were not here and they are not here now."

Operator Smith says that she knew DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK had said that she thought that the victim had a heart attack and continues to ask if DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK thought he died from the heart attack or it was due to the stabbing. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK states, "um..probably the stabbing triggered it."

I guess. I don't know, it's a shoulder wound." Operator Smith confirms that it is a shoulder wound. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK says, "Right".

Operator Smith asks information about herself and the victim, and DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK is able to give Operator Smith the information without any issues. Operator Smith asks DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK if she is able to move the knife away so that the units can get in there. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK asks "what now?" Operator Smith asks where the knife is. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK said, "It's in the kitchen". Operator Smith asks DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK last name to verify the phone number. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK gives her last name and phone number.

Operator Smith asks what time the altercation took place and he stabbed himself. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK states that it started around 10:30 pm. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK claims that the victim was trying to choke and suffocate her first. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK says that she went for the knife and the victim started screaming "what are you gonna do, stab me?" DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK says the victim then "grabbed the knife and that's when he did it, he made a motion". DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK states that the victim made a motion and she ran out of the room, because she is on probation and she was scared to death.

Operator Smith asks if DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK went to go check on him or if she stayed there. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that she stayed in the bathroom for a while and the victim came to the bathroom door and it was closed. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK said that the victim was screaming that he was going to send her to jail. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK said she was just trying to stay away from him and heard the victim moaning and she was scared and then she finally went to check on him. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that she saw the victim was "out of it" and she was slipping on his blood and it was heavily bloody. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK said again that the victim was "out of it" and she thinks "he was already..." and she tried to give him mouth to mouth.

Operator Smith asks DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK if there was a reason she didn't call 911 last night. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK says after hesitating, "Yeah, um, I'm on probation and I was afraid and I didn't think anyone would believe me and I was just trying to get him to wake up." DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK says that she was just exhausted and fell asleep from sitting up next to him and she tried to hurt herself this morning and it doesn't look good for me. At that time in the call, the police arrived at the door and DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK opened the door.

According to DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK's version of events, DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK waited eleven (11) hours before calling the police. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK admits that she and the deceased victim were the only two people at the residence during the incident. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK admitted that she knew he was out of it and moaning. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK indicated that she did not call 911 because she was scared, she was on probation, and she was exhausted.

Detective Woehr arrived on scene at 1005 hours. Detective Woehr observed the scene to be a well maintained single family two story residence. There were three (3) black vehicles in the circular driveway; an Audi, a Lexus sedan, and a Lexus SUV. Detective Woehr noticed that the scene had been secured and no one was in the house. Detective Woehr observed a white female, DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK, dressed in a black long sleeve shirt and black pants standing in front of the garage near fire department personel. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK appeared to have been crying and looked dishelved. Detective Woehr noticed that both her wrists had been bandaged. It had been relayed that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK had slit her wrists with a knife and she would be transported to the hospital.

Detective Woehr observed several broken egg shells on the driveway of the residence. There were also broken eggshells inside the deceased victim's vehicle and on the outside of the vehicle which belonged to the deceased victim.

A search warrant was obtained for the residence. Inside the front door, Detective Woehr observed a white male laying on the floor just past the foyer close to the wall of the living room. The victim was laying on his back with his arms stretched out in a "T" position. The victim was wearing jeans, a belt and socks. The victim's jeans appeared to be saturated with blood. The victim appeared to have a cut by his left eye and a wound on his left shoulder. There was no vomit on the victim's chest or face area. There were saturated towels laying near the head, right side and right foot of the victim.

Detective Woehr observed that the foyer had circular marks in the blood as if someone attempted to clean up the blood. Detective Woehr noticed that there was what appeared to be a blood trail coming from the master bedroom.

Detective Woehr walked to the left of the front door past the formal dinning room table. Detective Woehr noticed a large serrated kitchen knife on the floor at the entry way to the kitchen. Detective Woehr observed that the knife on the floor had blood on it. Detective Woehr noticed blood spatter about shoulder height on the right side of the entry wall and a blood smear on the left side. Detective Woehr noticed that there was a pile of blood soaked towels on the floor near the stairs.

The crime scene appeared to have been tampered with. There was a strong smell of bleach in the residence. Circular markings appeared to be in the blood as if someone had been trying to wipe up the blood. Bloody towels were found in a pile. At the bottom of the bloody towels, the victim's shirt was found in the pile. The victim's shirt appears to have been removed after the stabbing, as it had a matching tear in the shirt consistent with where the stab wound was on the victim's body.

Detective Woehr observed a mop that had blood on it near the stairs. Detective Woehr saw a mop bucket full of pink liquid that was near the mop and stairs. Detective Woehr walked through the kitchen and observed three kitchen knives in the kitchen sink with blood on them. Detective Woehr noticed blood in a small area on the island in the kitchen. Detective Woehr observed that the counter tops were clean and did not have any food on them. Detective Woehr walked into the living room and saw bloody foot prints near the couch and the victim. Detective Woehr walked on the outside of the living room and noticed bloody foot prints on the living room rug.

Detective Woehr walked into the master bedroom and saw the blood trail that led to the master bathroom. Detective Woehr noticed that the master bathroom door was all the way open and there was one drop of blood on the door. Detective Woehr observed that the linen closet door, inside the bathroom, was open and there were towels on the floor. There was blood on the baseboards inside of the bathroom door. Detective Woehr observed blood on the baseboards in the master bedroom near the closets. Detective Woehr noticed a folded pair of woman's white and black plaid pants that had blood on them in the little hallway leading into the master bathroom. Detective Woehr observed that someone had attempted to clean up the blood in the master bathroom, bedroom area and also in the living room area.

Detective Woehr called the medical examiner. Upon arrival, the Medical Examiner Investigator Ralph Calatche further examined the victim. The Investigator Calatche rolled the victim to his side. Detective Woehr noticed that there were no wounds on the victim's back. Detective Woehr searched the trash cans and observed the McDonald's container with blood on the outside of the container. The McDonald's container and trash bag were clear of any remnants of hamburger and fries. Detective Woehr located a McDonald's receipt for Friday, January 11, 2019 at 2143 hours and it shows that a quarter pounder and fries were purchased.

On Sunday, January 13, 2019, Detective Woehr attended the autopsy performed by Dr. Sara Zydowicz at the Orange County Medical Examiner Office. Detective Woehr noted there was a superficial cut by the victim's left eye that was possibly made by a sharp cutting object. Detective Woehr observed bruising on the victim's left arm that was consistent with defensive wounds. Detective Woehr observed that there was a wound to the victim's inner left forearm close to the wrist that appeared to be finger nail impressions with skin tear. Detective Woehr observed that there was a black and blue injury located on the inside upper lip of the victim's mouth. Detective Woehr noticed a circular mark on the victim's left upper arm. Detective Woehr visually observed the location of the stab wound and noted it was located in the left shoulder several inches away from his armpit area. Detective Woehr asked if there was any signs of a heart attack and was informed there were no signs of a heart attack.

In determining how much time the victim would have had to survive after his injury, Detective Woehr was informed the victim would have bled out approximately within five (5) or six (6) minutes. Detective Woehr was advised the victim would have been able to walk around but would have felt the effects of losing blood at a fast rate. Some of the effects of his injury would have been light headedness, unsteadiness, and fatigue. Detective Woehr noticed a clear mucus like substance on the victim's pants, which in her opinion looked like egg whites. Detective Woehr noticed that the victim's ribs were intact and there was no bruising to the center of the victim's chest, commonly observed when CPR has been performed. Detective Woehr also observed that the victim's mouth appeared to be clear of any vomit or substances.

On Monday, January 14, 2019, Detective Woehr received the District Nine Medical Examiner Case Synopsis #ME19-00059 which listed the cause of death as stab wound of torso and the manner of death as homicide. The Medical Examiner indicated that the stab wound was not self-inflicted.

Detective Woehr is in possession of the Department of Children and Families interview with DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK. In the interview, DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK states that there were numerous text messages between herself and the victim on the evening of January 11, 2019. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that in the evening of January 11, 2019, she was in the kitchen eating McDonald's hamburger and the victim got angry took a bite of the hamburger and spit it in her face. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that the victim then grabbed her arms and pushed her down on the ground. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that she was able to get up and the victim pushed her head down on the stove and took his fist and rubbed it against her face (but never punched her). DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that she attempted to break free and he ended up putting his hands over her face covering her nose and mouth. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated she grabbed the knife from the drawer that was close to her and held the knife in a motion that looked as if she was going to stab him. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK said that the victim took the knife from her hands, backed away from her and began making stabbing motions towards himself. The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK said she ran to the bathroom, closed the door and sat on the bathroom floor against the door.

The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK heard the victim come to the bathroom door and kept saying "Sam Katie" (which references a movie, Cape Fear, that they had watched three (3) weeks prior) and then got quiet. The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that "after a while" she opened the bathroom door and saw blood on the floor so she followed the blood trail from the bathroom to the living room where he was laying. The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK realized the victim wasn't moving and badly hurt and immediately went for her phone but couldn't find it. The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that she kept slipping in the blood and looking to see if he was dead. The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK grabbed a towel to clean up the blood and kept looking to see if the victim was deceased. The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated she took off the victim's shirt to see where the stab wound was and tried to resuscitate him. The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that she tried CPR and the victim started vomiting.

The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that she continued to push his chest and tried that for a very long time and became exhausted and collapsed next to the victim. The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK remembered lying next to the victim thinking "what am I going to do". The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK thought about calling the police but couldn't find her phone. The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK woke up on Saturday morning and continued to clean up the blood on the floors. The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated she didn't know what to do and went to the kitchen and slit her wrist. The DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK said that when she started to bleed, she called 911.

Winter Park Paramedic/Firefighter Childers stated that he was asked to look at the DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK'S wrists because she had lacerations to both wrists. Childers stated that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK told him that she cut her wrists 30 to 45 minutes prior to their arrival. Childers said that the wounds were no longer bleeding. Childers stated that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK told him the victim had punched her

several times. Childers observed a light colored bruise on DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK'S left upper arm. Childers said that the DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK asked to go back inside the home to see her husband (the victim).

Detective Woehr obtained a search warrant for DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK's cellular phone. An extraction was conducted on the DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK's cellular phone. Despite the DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stating that there were text messages between her and her husband leading up to the events, there were no text messages found at all between the Defendant to the Victim. It appeared that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK had deleted all messages between her and her husband before calling the police.

A search warrant was obtained for DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK's account on a dating application named Meet Mindful. According to the records, DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK had been reviewing her messages on the application on Saturday, January 12, 2019 at approximately 0722 hours (approximately two hours before calling the police).

Detective Woehr obtained a search warrant for DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK's medical records. The medical records toxicology report shows a >10 mg/dL alcohol level in DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK when the blood was collected on January 12, 2019 at approximately 1128 hours. The collection of blood was taken almost over thirteen hours from when DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK indicated her husband had died. She still had alcohol in her system. She had indicated to 911 that only her husband had been drinking that night. She additionally was not permitted to possess alcohol while on probation. It should be noted that a large number of empty wine bottles were found in the outside recycling bin at the residence.

Witness 1 saw DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK the evening of Friday, January 11, 2019 at a youth football game prior to the incident. Witness 1 stated that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK arrived at approximately 2005 hours, after the game started and by herself. Witness 1 stated that when they were leaving, DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK started yelling at her son and was angry about her son wanting a haircut. Witness 1 said that the DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK and the deceased victim have a very "on again, off again" relationship. Witness 1 heard DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK say, "it's been a weird night".

Witness 1 has had past experiences with DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK. Witness 1 states that she has seen DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK where she just "turned". Witness 1 explained that she went out with DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK one night and after about five drinks, DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK "switched". In this incident, DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK started to swing her fists at Witness 1 for no reason. Witness 1 had to call the police. Witness 1 stated that on the evening of January 11, 2019 (night of the death), DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK had the same look in her eyes (as when she began punching at Witness 1) and thought that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK was in that type of mood again.

Witness 2 stated that the victim used to share information regarding his marriage to the DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK. Witness 2 described the relationship as "rocky". Witness 2 stated that the victim would tell Witness 2 that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK had outbursts and exhibited anger. Witness 2 would tell the victim that it wasn't good. Witness 2 said that the victim used to say DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK "is crazy but as long as I hide the steak knives everything will be fine."

Witness 2 stated that there were heated arguments throughout the relationship. Witness 2 said that he knew the victim and the DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK were living in separate houses. Witness 2 said that the victim told him that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK had a drinking problem. Witness 2 said that he had talked to the victim in December and knew the victim had moved back in. Witness 2 joked around with the victim during the call in December and asked if he was still hiding the steak knives. Witness 2 stated that victim told him "oh yeah". Witness 2 knew that the DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK would throw things at the victim and had an explosive personality. Witness 2 stated that the victim never hit DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK. Witness 2 stated that when the victim talked about divorce it seemed like it was just a "toxic" situation for the kids to be around.

It should be noted that at the time of this statement, Witness 2 had no information regarding how the victim died. The news reported a "suspicious death" and common friends were told he died of a heart attack.

Witness 3 stated that she had previously observed the victim with a black right eye.

Witness 3 stated that either on Friday, January 4, 2019 or Tuesday, January 8, 2019 (week of murder), she observed bruising on the victim's arm. Witness 3 said that the bruising observed "look like four fingerprints on his forearm" that were purple and blue. Witness 3 did not ask about the bruising on either occasions.

Other witnesses have come forward with statements regarding DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK being violent toward the deceased victim in the past, and knew she had a drinking problem.

On January 28, 2019, about three hours after her husband's funeral, Detective Woehr received a call from DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK was calm and insistent that she wanted her cellular phone back and seemed annoyed that this Detective was not releasing her phone to her.

In researching any prior contacts with law enforcement for either Mr. or Mrs. Redlick the following was obtained:

On February 4, 2018, the deceased victim called 911 stating that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK was a danger to herself and to others and he needed the police. Winter Park Police Department arrived and the deceased victim told officers that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK had been drinking and there was a verbal argument but she was asleep now.

On January 26, 2018, Seminole County Sheriff's Office (case#201800000704) arrested DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK for battery on officer/firefighter, resisting officer with violence and disorderly intoxication. The SCSO Deputy listed DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK as the primary aggressor who started a verbal argument and became physical. At one point during the encounter, DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK was being treated by SCFD. During the treatment, DEFENDANT JUSTINE REDLICK became more aggressive yelling vulgar comments, pushed the paramedic, and attempted to punch him. The SCSO Deputy attempted to have DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK sit down so she could be treated. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK started yelling and pushed the deputy. The SCSO Deputy stated that he placed both hands on DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK'S shoulders to keep her seated. The SCSO deputy said that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stood up and lunged at him again. While two SCSO deputies were trying to restrain DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK, she attempted to bite one of the deputies on the hand.

On October 3, 2016, Winter Park Police Department met with DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK about a verbal argument between herself and the deceased victim. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK stated that the deceased victim pushed her and she needed it documented for her court proceedings. The WPPD Officer stated that while she was trying to obtain necessary information from DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK, the defendant refused to write a sworn written statement and began to get upset. The WPPD Officer said that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK became progressively more upset and refused to speak to the officer, abruptly leaving the building.

On June 18, 2016, Winter Park Police Department was patrolling the area and came in contact with DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK at North Park Avenue and Lincoln Avenue. The WPPD Officer completed a Marchman Act and Crisis Intervention tracking report on DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK which states that DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK was disorderly/disruptive behavior, belligerent, and had violent behavior towards others.

Based on the aforementioned, your affiant believes that probable cause exists to prove; Between January 11, 2019 at 2150 hours and January 12, 2019 0928 hours, DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK, started an argument with the victim, armed herself with a cutting instrument (as evidenced from the autopsy report and her own statements to 911) and stabbed the victim which resulted in his death. DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK then attempted to clean up the crime scene and deleted pertinent information off of her cellular phone knowing an investigation was about to follow, and in doing so tampered and contaminated the crime scene. Thus showing that the DEFENDANT DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK committed an act imminently dangerous to her husband and evidencing a depraved mind regardless of human life. Even after stabbing her husband, she admitted to not rendering aid while he was moaning and "out of it" while he died. Additionally, she waited eleven hours to call for assistance after tampering with the crime scene knowing that a death investigation was forthcoming.

Based upon my investigation, your Affiant has probable cause to believe that the Defendant, **DANIELLE JUSTINE REDLICK**, committed the aforementioned violations of law and requests the issuance of an arrest warrant.
