1. Scope

This Privacy Policy ("Policy") is meant to help you understand how we and our affiliates collect, use, protect, and share your personal information. This Policy applies to Composer's online and offline collection, use, sharing, and retention of your personal information.

This Policy also applies to the personal information of individuals associated with a commercial customer, such as authorized account holders, signatories, beneficial owners, and key personnel, when we collect, use, protect, or share their personal information in connection with providing our products and services.

This Policy covers Composer Technologies Inc. (USA), Composer Technologies Inc., a Canadian Corporation, and Composer Securities LLC (collectively, "Composer," "we," "us," and "our"). Composer is a subsidiary of SoFi Technologies, Inc. Our affiliates include SoFi Technologies Inc., Social Finance LLC, SoFi Securities LLC, SoFi Wealth LLC, SoFi Lending Corp., SoFi Bank, N.A., Social Finance Life Insurance Agency LLC, Golden Pacific Bank, a Division of SoFi Bank, N.A..

Composer Services means the Composer platform, our websites, our mobile and desktop applications, our products and services, and any other Composer sites or services that link to this Privacy Policy. If you have applied for or opened an account with Composer, please also review our [U.S. Consumer \(GLBA\) Privacy Notice](#), which describes how we collect, use, and share the nonpublic personal information we obtain in connection with opening and servicing your account. The rights and opt-outs described in that notice are distinct from those described in this Policy.

2. Changes to Our Privacy Policy

We may change or update this Privacy Policy periodically. When we do, we will post the revised Privacy Policy on our website and update the "Last Updated" date.

If we make any material changes to this Privacy Policy, we will provide additional notice, including by sending an email to the email address associated with your account, before or as required by applicable law. We encourage you to review this Privacy Policy periodically to stay informed about our privacy practices.

Any changes to this Privacy Policy will become effective when posted unless indicated otherwise.

3. Personal Information We Collect and How We Collect It

Information you or your authorized agent provide to us. Personal information you may provide to us includes:

- a. **Identity information** – including name, date of birth, marital status, social security number, and other data on government-issued identification documents (e.g., passport and driver's license).

We collect this information, in part, to meet federal requirements and to combat money laundering activities. Federal law requires all financial institutions to obtain, verify, and record information that identifies each person who opens a financial account.

When you open a financial account, we will ask for your name, address, date of birth, and other information that will allow us to identify you. We may also ask to see your driver's license or other identifying documents. This includes collecting and verifying the identity of individuals associated with such accounts, such as

beneficial owners and authorized signatories, for identity verification and Bank Secrecy Act / Anti-Money Laundering (BSA/AML) compliance.

Other types of personal information that may be tied to your identity or used to identify you may include:

Profile Data – such as your username and password, your interests, age, preferences, feedback, and survey responses.

Contact information – including home address, telephone, email address, and emergency contact details.

Employment information – including job title/position and annual income.

Geolocation data – which may include city, state, and country, and the location associated with your I.P. address.

Characteristics of protected classifications under California or federal law, such as age, citizenship, gender, place of birth, and marital status.

Preferences – such as your preferences for receiving our marketing communications and privacy choices.

User-generated content – such as questions, messages, reviews, blog posts, and other content or information that you generate, transmit, or otherwise make available, as well as associated metadata. Metadata includes information on how, when, where, and by whom a piece of content was collected and how that content has been formatted or edited. Metadata also includes information that users can add or can have added to their content, such as keywords, geographical or location information, and other similar data.

Promotional information – including information you share when you enter a competition, promotion, or complete a survey. Please note that if you participate in a sweepstakes, contest, or giveaway, we may ask you for your contact data to notify you if you win or not, to verify your identity, and/or to send you prizes. We may need additional information as part of the entry process, such as a prize selection choice. These sweepstakes and contests are voluntary. We recommend that you read the rules and other relevant information for each sweepstakes and contest that you enter.

Financial information – such as personal and business bank account number(s); banking details, and tax information.

Information Technology (IT) information – information required to provide access to Composer’s systems, such as IP addresses, log files, and login information.

Audio, electronic, visual, or similar information, including recordings of calls and online user sessions. We collect and use this information to measure and improve our member relationship protocols, to train and educate employees, and for compliance purposes.

b. Sensitive Personal Information We Collect

Unique Identifiers – Social Security number, passport number, or other government-issued identification numbers.

Financial accounts – We collect account log-in, financial account, debit card, or credit card numbers in combination with any required security or access code, password, or credentials allowing access to an account.

Precise geolocation data – With your consent, we collect precise geolocation data (data derived from a device used or intended to be used to locate a consumer within an area equal to or less than a circle with a radius of 1,850 feet).

Biometric data – As part of the verification process, we collect biometric information from government IDs

and images to verify your identity.

- c. **Third-party sources.** We collect information about you from third parties. We may also combine personal information we receive from you with personal information we obtain from other sources. We receive information from the following categories of sources.

Data providers – such as information services and data licensors that provide demographic information, mailing addresses, and other information (e.g., data aggregators, data compilers, data compilers/originators).

Public sources – such as government agencies, public records, and other publicly available sources (e.g., public record sources).

Consumer Reporting Agencies – we obtain information from credit agencies through third parties to prevent fraud and identity theft. This is done as part of our fraud prevention and onboarding processes and could include information regarding public records of bankruptcy, judgments, tax liens, and other payment statuses.

Referral sources – such as when a friend or family member refers you to Composer for your financial product and service needs.

Other. To enable this connection, Composer uses Plaid Inc. (“Plaid”). When you link an account, Plaid retrieves information from your external financial institution and shares it with Composer. Composer retains and uses this information to process your deposits and withdrawals, prevent fraud, and as otherwise described in this Policy. Plaid's handling of your information is governed by Plaid's own privacy policy, available at <https://plaid.com/legal>.

- d. **Agencies to whom complaints have been submitted regarding our services/products**

Financial regulators, consumer protection agencies, and other businesses may share information, typically with your consent and knowledge, regarding complaints you submitted related to Composer and its products or services.

- e. **Our Composer family of companies.** In compliance with applicable laws, Composer collects personal information from other Composer and SoFi Affiliates. In certain cases, you have the right to opt out of this sharing.
- f. **Automatic data collection.** We, our service providers, and marketing providers may automatically collect, use, and retain information about you, your computer or mobile device, and your interaction over time, our communications, and other online services, such as:

Device data – such as your computer’s or mobile device’s operating system type and version, manufacturer and model, browser type, screen resolution, RAM and disk size, CPU usage, device type (e.g., phone, tablet), IP address, unique identifiers (including identifiers used for advertising purposes), language settings, mobile device carrier, radio/network information (e.g., Wi-Fi, LTE, 3G), and general location information such as city, state or geographic area.

Online activity data – such as pages or screens you viewed, how long you spent on a page or screen, the previous website visited before navigating to our website(s), navigation paths between pages or screens, information about your activity on a page or screen, access times and duration of access, and whether you have opened our emails or clicked links within them.

Location data – such as city, state, country, and location associated with your I.P. address.

4. Cookies and Similar Technologies

We use the following technologies to facilitate the automatic data collection described above:

Cookies – small text files that websites store on user devices and that allow web servers to record users’ web browsing activities and remember their submissions, preferences, and login status as they navigate a site. Cookies used on our sites include both “session cookies” that are deleted when a session ends, “persistent cookies” that remain longer, “first-party” cookies that we place, and “third-party” cookies that we place on our websites and app for social media, advertising, analytics companies, and other service providers.

Logical storage technologies – like HTML5, that provide cookie-equivalent functionality but can store larger amounts of data on your device outside of your browser in connection with specific applications.

Pixels or web beacons – also known as pixel tags or clear GIFs, enable the collection, storage, and sometimes sharing of your information and/or your actions taken, such as whether you accessed or opened a webpage or email or that you viewed or clicked certain content. Certain pixels include computer-code snippets that enable the collection and sharing of information back to the web servers of third parties.

Session Replay Technologies – Composer will capture your use of the Site and may record your use. We use third-party services that employ software code to record users’ interactions with the Website in a manner that allows us to watch DVR-like replays of those user sessions. The replays include users’ clicks, mobile app touches, mouse movements, scrolls, and keystrokes/key touches during those sessions. These replays help us diagnose usability problems and identify areas for improvement. We may use cookies and similar technologies for the following purposes:

Technical Operation – To allow the technical operation of our Services, such as by remembering your selections and preferences as you navigate our websites and app.

Functionality – To enhance the performance and functionality of our Services.

Advertising – To help our third-party marketing providers collect information about how you use our Services over time to show you ads on other online services they believe will interest you and measure how the ads perform.

Analytics – To help us understand user activity on the Website, including which pages are most and least visited and how visitors move around the Website, as well as user interactions with our emails.

Cookie Opt-outs – You can disable cookies via most browsers. This may affect site functionality. To opt out of cookies on our site, click the “Your Privacy Choices” link in the footer of our website, click “cookie choices” and select your preference.

Do Not Track (“DNT”) is a privacy preference that users can set in certain web browsers. At this time, we do not recognize or respond to DNT signals.

5. Retention of Personal Information

We retain information we collect about you, and use the following factors to determine the retention period of personal information:

- To maintain an ongoing relationship with you as a customer, member, or business contact (for example, when you are a recipient of any of our financial services/products).

- To perform under the applicable terms and services to which you agreed.
- As necessary in connection with the lawful purposes set out in this Privacy Policy.
- To comply with applicable laws
- To establish, exercise, or defend our legal rights.

6. How We Use Your Personal Information

We use your personal information for the following purposes, or as otherwise described at the time of collection:

- Provide Financial Services and Products.** We use your personal information to provide you with financial services and products, and may:
 - Review your application and determine eligibility for financial products and services.
 - Process transactions and payments, fulfill orders, and verify your customer information.
 - Make and receive payments.
 - Provide, operate, and maintain your Composer financial accounts and services.
 - Verify the identity of all account holders, beneficial owners, and authorized individuals for brokerage accounts, and conduct necessary compliance activities such as BSA/AML screening and sanctions checks.
 - Facilitate wire transfer requests, including verifying recipient information, to process outgoing transfers from your Composer account.
 - Communicate with you about our products and services, your financial accounts, investments, including by sending announcements, updates, security alerts, and support and administrative messages.
 - Provide support for the Website, our financial services, and products, and respond to your requests, questions, and feedback.
- Website and application delivery.** We may use your personal information to:
 - provide, operate, and improve the Website, application, our services, and our business.
 - establish and maintain your user profile on the website or application.
 - enable online security features, such as by remembering devices from which you have previously logged in.
 - understand your needs and interests and personalize your experience with the Website and our communications.
 - provide support for the Website, our financial services, and products, and respond to your requests, questions, and feedback.
- Research and Development and Business Promotion.** We may use your personal information for research and development purposes, including to analyze and improve our Services and business, and for business promotion purposes.
- Marketing and Advertising.** We, our service providers, advertising and marketing platforms, and our third-party companies with which we maintain advertising agreements may collect and use your personal information for marketing and advertising purposes:
 - **Direct marketing** – We may send you direct marketing communications. You may opt-out of our marketing communications as described in the Opt-out of marketing section below.
 - **Interest-based advertising** – Our third-party advertising providers may use cookies, pixels, and similar technologies to collect information about your interaction (including the data described in the automatic data collection section above) with the Website, our communications, and other online services over time, and use that information to serve online ads that they think will interest you. This is called interest-based advertising.

We may also directly share information about you with these companies to facilitate interest-based advertising to those or similar users on other online platforms. To opt out of sharing information for this purpose, please visit “Your Personal Information Choices” on this page for instructions.

We provide customers with access to multiple products and services offered by other companies through our Services. When you select to connect with another such company, Composer may receive and keep information about your use of the other company’s products and services.

- Meet Compliance and Legal Obligations.** We may use your personal information to:

- comply with applicable laws, lawful requests, and legal process, such as to respond to subpoenas or requests from government authorities;
 - protect our, your, or others' rights, privacy, safety, or property (including by making and defending legal claims);
 - audit our internal processes for compliance with legal and contractual requirements or our internal policies; and
 - enforce the terms and conditions that govern our Services.
- f. **Fraud Detection and Prevention.** We may use your personal information to prevent, identify, investigate, and deter fraudulent, harmful, unauthorized, unethical, or illegal activity, including cyberattacks and identity theft.
- g. **With Your Consent.** In certain cases, we ask for your consent to collect, use, and share your personal information.

7. Our Disclosure of Your Personal Information for Business Purposes

We share your personal information with the following parties and as otherwise described in this Privacy Policy, or at the time of collection.

Service Providers. Third parties that provide services to Composer, or to you on our behalf, or that help us operate our business (such as data cloud providers, information technology, customer support, email delivery, marketing, consumer research, and website analytics).

Social Media Platforms. If you interact with Composer or our affiliates on or through social media platforms, the platform may be able to collect information about you and your interaction with us. If you interact with social media objects on our sites, both the social media platform and your connections on the platform may be able to view that activity. To control the sharing of information, please review the privacy policy of the relevant social media platform.

Third parties designated by you. We may share your personal information with third parties where you have instructed us or provided your consent to do so. We will share personal information with these other companies to provide the services that you requested.

Business and marketing partners. Third parties with whom we co-sponsor events or promotions, with whom we jointly offer products or services, or whose products or services may be of interest to you.

Professional advisors. Professional advisors, such as lawyers, auditors, bankers, and insurers, where necessary in the course of the professional services that they render to us.

Legal authorities. Law enforcement, government authorities, regulatory agencies, and third parties, as we believe in good faith to be necessary or appropriate for the compliance and protection purposes described above, and in compliance with applicable law.

Business transferees. Acquirers and other relevant participants in business transactions (or negotiations of or due diligence for such transactions) involving a corporate divestiture, merger, consolidation, acquisition, reorganization, sale, or other disposition of all or any portion of the business or assets of, or equity interests in, Composer or our affiliates (including, in connection with a bankruptcy or similar proceedings).

Newsletter, Webinar, and Marketing Participants. Information you submit when participating in our newsletters, webinars, marketing events, or other promotional activities may be visible to other participants and the public, and may be retained or used by us and third parties consistent with this Policy and any event-specific notices.

8. Artificial Intelligence (AI)

We incorporate AI functionalities into our products and services, such as the chatbot used for customer support. We use AI to enhance your investing experience, improve the efficiency and quality of our services, and protect your account from fraud. We require our service providers to keep your personal information secure and do not allow them to use or share it for any purpose other than providing the contracted services on our behalf. Furthermore, we contractually prohibit our AI service providers from using your data to train or improve their own AI models.

10. Sale/Sharing of Personal Information

Composer does not sell personal information for monetary consideration.

However, under certain state privacy laws, some disclosures of personal information to advertising, analytics, and social media partners may be considered a "sale" or "sharing" of personal information.

Composer may share the following categories of personal information for interest-based advertising and analytics with

social media platforms and marketing/advertising companies: Identity information, profile information, contact information, Internet or other electronic network activity information, automatic data collection described above, and limited Composer financial and demographic data, and combinations of this data used to infer interest or relevance.

Composer takes the privacy and security of its customers' personal information seriously. With regard to our internal security procedures, we restrict access to your personal and account information to those employees who "need to know" the information in order to provide products and services to you. We maintain reasonable physical, administrative, and technical safeguards designed to protect the security, confidentiality, and integrity of your personal information. We conduct regular internal audits of our business practices and procedures.

12. Links to Other Services or Applications

This Privacy Policy applies only to Composer's Services. Composer Services may contain links to other websites or apps, or may forward users to other websites or apps that we do not own or operate and to which this Privacy Policy does not apply. We neither can control nor are responsible for the privacy practices or content of these websites or apps. We suggest reading the privacy notices of these websites or app providers or contacting them directly for information on their privacy practices.

13. Information of Children

Our Services are not intended for individuals under 18 years of age. We do not knowingly collect or solicit any information from anyone under the age of 18. In the event that we learn that we have inadvertently collected personal information from a child under age 18, we will take reasonable steps to delete this information. If you believe that we might have any information from a child under 18, please contact us at privacy@composer.trade.

14. Your Personal Information Choices

You may have additional choices if you are from California. Please see below if you are a resident of California. We want you to be aware of the choices you have in limiting the sharing of your personal information.

To update your profile, visit "My Account" after logging into your account. This section of the site is password protected to safeguard your information. As a registered user, you can update your password, or contact our support team (help@composer.trade) to make changes to your physical address, phone numbers, education, and employment information at any time.

Advertising choices: You can limit the use of your information for interest-based advertising by:

Browser settings – Blocking third-party cookies in your browser settings.

Privacy browsers/plug-ins – By using privacy browsers or ad-blocking browser plug-ins that let you block

tracking technologies.

Platform settings – Google, Bing, Facebook, and TikTok offer opt-out features that let you opt out of the use of your information for interest-based advertising:

Declining to Provide Information

We need to collect personal information to provide certain services. If you do not provide the information we identify as required or mandatory, we may not be able to provide those services.

15. Complaints and Concerns

Composer maintains a process to respond to your concerns regarding violations of this Privacy Policy. If you believe that we have not complied with this Policy or have questions regarding your privacy with us, please email us at privacy@composer.trade. If you are reporting non-compliance with this Privacy Policy, please describe the issue in as much detail as possible without disclosing any sensitive information about you or third parties.

16. Data Privacy and Protection Rights

Depending on the jurisdiction in which you reside, you may have certain rights about how your personal information is collected, stored, used, and shared.

Your California Privacy Rights

Under the California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA), residents have certain rights as outlined in this section. However, the CCPA allows exceptions for and, therefore, does not apply to the following:

- Publicly available information made lawfully available from government records.
- Information that is deidentified, meaning that the information is rendered so that it cannot reasonably be used to infer information about or link to a specific person.
- Information subject to other laws, such as the following:
 - Personal information subject to certain sector-specific privacy laws, including the Fair Credit Reporting Act (“FCRA”), the Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act (“GLBA”) or California Financial Information Privacy Act (“CalFIPA”), and the Driver’s Privacy Protection Act of 1994.

To the extent your personal information is subject to the CCPA and is not otherwise exempt under applicable law, California residents have the right to:

- know what personal information we have collected about you, including the categories of personal information, the categories of sources from which the personal information is collected, the business or commercial purpose for collecting, selling, or sharing personal information, the categories of third parties to whom the business discloses personal information, and the specific pieces of personal information the business has collected about you;
- request the deletion of certain personal information collected by us;
- correct inaccurate personal information;
- know/access or receive a disclosure of your personal information;
- know what personal information is sold or shared and to whom;
- opt out of the sale or sharing of your personal information;
- in certain cases, limit the use and disclosure of sensitive personal information; and
- no retaliation for opting out or exercising any other rights, including an employee’s right not to be retaliated against for the exercise of their CCPA rights.

How to Exercise Your Rights to Know (Access), Delete, or Correct Your Personal Information

We must verify your identity before processing most requests, which may require you to provide additional information. You may submit a request by emailing us at privacy@composer.trade. We strive to honor requests within forty-five (45) days of receipt. In certain instances, we may not be able to honor your request, such as when an exception applies or when we cannot verify your identity. We will notify you if we are unable to process your request within that time or at all, and provide you with an explanation.

Composer recognizes the Global Privacy Control (GPC), a setting that allows you to communicate your privacy preferences to websites and online services. When we detect a GPC signal from a browser, we treat it as a valid request to opt out of the sale or sharing of personal information associated with that browser or device, in compliance with applicable laws.
