Upon his return, on a visit to the Utah State Capitol, he met a young and beautiful employee, Beverlee Andersen, whom he married on June 12, 1951, later solemnized in the Salt Lake Temple. Allen was many things to many people: businessman, outdoorsman, hunter, camper, boater and skier. For decades he ran the family business started by his father: AE Carter Distributing, Eureka Appliance Company, Carter Brothers LLC, Durfee Creek Estates and others.
