

Craig “Craigers” Thatcher our beloved husband, father, grandfather, brother, and friend passed away at the age of 73 on July 6, 2025 surrounded by his wife and children.

Craig loved to tell stories, and his life was full of incredible moments that he immortalized with his confidence and larger than life storytelling ability. Craig is survived by his wife, Connie Nelson Thatcher; daughters, Courtney Healy (Shelby), Jinii Boren (Mike), and Brittney Sorensen (Joseph); son, Scott Thatcher (Florence); 14 grandchildren (and waiting for more from Scott and Flo... someday), and 3 grandpups.
