And why for the sheep should we seek And earnestly hope and pray? Because there is danger when sheep go wrong; They lead the lambs astray.


Lambs will follow the sheep, you know, Wherever the sheep may stray. When sheep go wrong, it won't take long Till the lambs are as wrong as they.
