Planning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals

In response to citizen request on what to do to prepare for the Planning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals, here are some quick tips. The first step is to call Town Hall and describe your issue. Once we have a better understanding of your issue, we will guide you to the next steps in the process and the documents that need to be prepared.

Important Reminder

Be mindful of leaves and brush that may accumulate in area ditches. When leaves and brush accumulate in ditches, it can lead to clogged storm drains. This will eventually lead to flooding of these areas. Take notice if any debris needs to be removed from ditches in your area and help us prevent flooding due to clogged storm drains.

The Unicoi Business Alliance is currently in the process of compiling a listing of properties for sale. Contact us with any listings you would like to have added to the list.

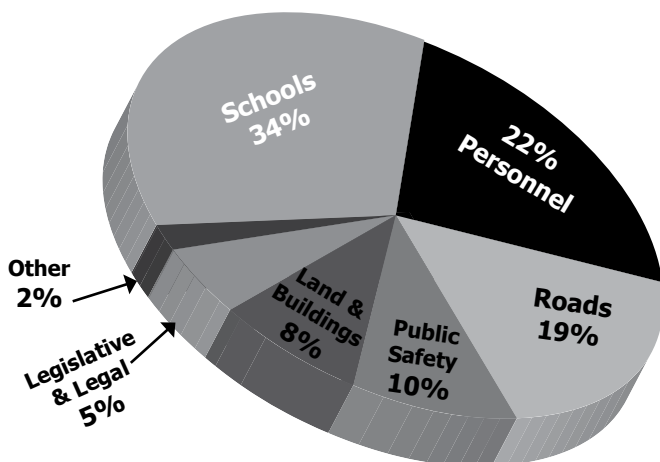

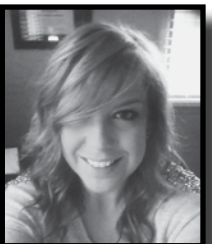
