NEA Awards \$25,000 Grant to Tanasi

Tanasi Arts and Heritage Center, whose gallery is currently housed in the Town of Unicoi Tourist Information Center, was recently awarded a \$25,000 "Our Town" grant from the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA). The funding from this grant will be used to produce a series of monthly events showcasing regional art- and craft-making traditions and talent in support of Tanasi's Project, "Functional Artways of America." Programs will include artists in residence who will stage live demonstrations of their craft, such as pottery, woodcarving, textile arts, and landscape photography, and will provide hands on opportunities for residents to experience many ways of making arts and crafts. The project is will provide opportunities for residents to connect with local cultural assets, strengthen a unique sense of place, boost tourism, and provide an economic outlet for local artisans. Primo's Italian Cuisine

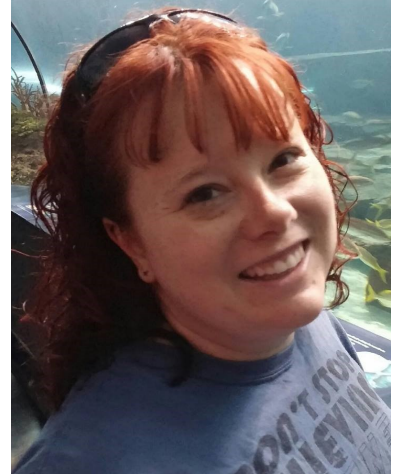
