# **South Dakota Junior Point Show Association Sanctioning Rules**

# Shows desiring to be sanctioned for the SD Junior Point Show must abide by the following guidelines:

- 1. Sanctioned shows **must** offer *breed* classes for breeding heifers and market beef and market lambs
  - (Market lamb breeds are **Hampshire**, **Suffolk**, **Crossbred**, **Dorset**, **Natural**, **Southdown**, and **Speckle Face**), regardless of the number entered in a breed division. Ewes & Wethers show together, and split them by breed.
  - Swine are shown in the following divisions: **Purebred Gilt, Purebred Barrow**, **Crossbred Gilt, and Crossbred Barrow**.
  - Market Goats will be shown in a **market doe, and market wether** divisions. **Breeding Does** will be shown according to age with a 3 mo. minimum and no max.

- 2. Fall heifers (2017 born) are allowed to accumulate points. Points are not available for cow/calf pairs. When making selections for Champion and Reserve Champion make sure that your judge is aware of this. Please choose a top 5 in beef.
- 3. For **showmanship** please record the top 5 names in each age division and how many participants were in the age division. Please take time for showmanship. Members pay extra to be involved in this contest from a SDJPS stand point.
- 4. All points recorded in a breed class are based on actual number of breed cattle that enter the showing regardless if they are point show members or not. The points exhibitors receive will be based on their actual placing in the junior show. The show committee can use their discretion and combine 1 head entries into an AOB class, but please write down what breed they actually were. The animal needs to be recorded on paper as the breed it represents and will get points based on # of breed animals shown. Example: 1 Angus Steer and 1 Shorthorn Steer are shown together in an AOB named class. Angus steer would receive 5 class points plus 5 bonus for being champion Angus steer by default and the Shorthorn would be scored the same. If there are 2 or more animals of a breed, you must have a breed class for those individuals.
- 5. Breeds have to be indicated on results sheet. When entries are taken, exhibitor must indicate to what breed they want their points allocated.
- 6. Official show results must be sent back to Audra Scheel within *10 days* following the show. Results must be turned in on the <u>sample result sheet or similar format</u>. **Please do not calculate the points**. Shows at the end of the year (Brown, Turner & Central States) have 3 days after their show to turn in results. Results may be photographed and texted to Audra as long as they are legible.
- 7. SDJPS program will conform to any specific rules established by that particular breed association.
- 8. Youth are to check with each individual fair for specific arrival and release times and dates.
- 9. Youth need to fill out and returned membership forms to Audra Scheel along with their dues. **Please do not collect money for SDJPSA registration.** Ask all exhibitors to mail completed entry form and fee to Audra.
- 10. Entries will be accepted anytime throughout the showing year. There will be **a 7 day** grace period after each show in which individuals can get entry forms in so points from that show will be counted.
- 11. SDJPS recommends that sanctioned show's make exhibitors show their registration papers when exhibiting purebred livestock. Registered livestock needs to be in the exhibitor or family name unless a lease paper accompanies the registration paper.

# **Beef Rules**

The South Dakota Junior Point Show Association (SDJPSA) will be giving an award to juniors who accumulate the greatest number of points in a given year in each breed. The SDJPSA calendar will run from October 1, 2018 to Sept. 1, 2019. Points start at zero each year beginning at Oct. 1.

Breeds will need to have a representation of 5 exhibitors entered per breed per sex for the year to maintain breed representation and to receive year end awards. Example: There needs to be 5 Angus Heifer participants to receive an award. An animal must be shown twice to receive year end awards within your breed.

Points shall be earned on the following basis for every specie:

Anytime an exhibitor is named champion or reserve champion of any breed, he or she will receive the same number of points as the highest point-getting class winner of that breed rather than the number of points for his or her original class. In addition, the breed champion will receive 5 bonus points and the reserve champion will receive 3 bonus points.

When a show selects a top 2 through 5 Overall Breeds, bonus points will be given to those exhibitors. Champion = 10; Res. Champion = 5; 3rd Overall = 3; 4th Overall =2; 5th Overall =1. All points recorded in a class are based on actual number of junior class cattle that enter the showing regardless if they are point show members or not. The points you receive will be based on your actual placing in the junior show.

If one person exhibits more than one head in a breed, only the best placing will be recorded per breed.

Sanctioned shows are encouraged to offer breed & age classes for heifers, regardless of the number entered.

SDJPS program will conform to any specific rules established by that particular breed association.

In each division, the cattle must be entered in the name of the individual, the individual's immediate family or

the individual's immediate family's ranch name. They must be shown by the individual for any points to be recorded. Even though a substitute show person may be granted by the SDJPSA, points will not be awarded to an exhibitor unless he or she is in attendance to show his or her own animals.

The SDJPSA age requirement is at least 8 years old and not older than 21 years old as of Jan 1 2019. We will conform to specific breed rules; if you are still eligible to show within a breed as a junior member we will allow you to participate in SDJPS in that breed division/s only. Youth are expected to follow the rules of the breed they are exhibiting.

Year-end points are calculated for heifers and market beef by totaling points earned by an exhibitor. Winners in each breed for heifers and steers will be recognized. Overall Heifer and Overall Market Beef points are calculated by adding all points earned throughout the year.

A \$15 annual fee/exhibitor is required to participate.

First place ties will be broken by which youth attends the most junior shows. Fall heifers are eligible to participate but they must be born in the 2017 year. Market heifers are eligible to participate. Cow/calf pairs do not qualify. Youth are to check with each individual show for specific arrival,

Each show is responsible for submitting their results to the director, at which time the director will calculated points and post them on the website.

## 2019 South Dakota Junior Point Show Association Goat Rules

The South Dakota Junior Point Show Association (SDJPSA) will be giving an award to juniors who accumulate the greatest number of points in a given year. Market wethers and does will be classified in their divisions for year end awards. Breeding Doe Division Classes will be broken by age. The SDJPSA calendar will run from March 1, 2019 to September 1, 2019. Points start at zero each year beginning at Mar 1.

Breeding Doe and Market Doe and Wether divisions will need to have a representation of 5 participants entered with SDJPS per division for the year to maintain representation and to receive year end awards. Market classes should be broken by sex and then by weight, judge should pick a champ and reserve doe and champ and reserve wether. Breeding Doe division needs to be included in all shows! Shows should break breeding classes according to age.

Breeding Meat Goats- Age requirement: Minimum of 3 months old; there is no maximum age. Anytime an exhibitor is named champion or reserve champion of any division, he or she will receive the same number of points as the highest point-getting class winner of that division rather than the number of points for his or her original class. In addition, the division champion will receive 5 bonus points and the reserve division champion will receive 3 bonus points.

All points recorded in a class are based on actual number in the class showing regardless if they are point show members or not. The points you receive will be based on your actual placing in the junior show.

If one person exhibits more than one head in a division, only the best placing will be recorded per division.

Sanctioned shows must offer both doe and wether classes, regardless of the number entered.

In each division, the goat must be entered in the name of the individual, the individual's immediate family or the individual's immediate family's ranch name. They must be shown by the individual for any points to be recorded. Even though a substitute show person may be granted by the SDJPSA, points will not be awarded to an exhibitor unless he or she is in attendance to show his or her own animals.

The SDJPSA age requirement is at least 8 years old and not older than 21 years old as of Jan. 1 2019.

Year-end points are calculated by totaling points earned by an exhibitor. Winners in each division will be recognized.

A \$10 annual fee/exhibitor is required to participate.

First place ties will be broken by which youth attends the most junior shows.

Youth are to check with each individual show for specific arrival and release times and dates and rules.

Entries will be accepted anytime throughout the showing year. There will be a 7 day grace period after each show in which individuals can get entry forms in so points from that show will be counted.

# 2019 South Dakota Junior Point Show Association Mkt. Lamb Rules

The South Dakota Junior Point Show Association (SDJPSA) will be giving an award to juniors who accumulate the greatest number of points in a given year. Market sheep will be split by breed for yearend awards. Hampshire, Suffolk, Speckle Face, Natural, Wool Breeds, Crossbred, Southdown, & Dorset are the breeds recognized. The SDJPSA calendar will run from March 1, 2019 to September 1, 2019. Points start at zero each year beginning at March 1.

Breeds will need to have a representation of 5 participants entered per breed division for the year to maintain breed representation and to receive year end awards. *Example: There needs to be 5 youth who plan on exhibiting Natural market lambs for participants who actually show Natural market lambs to receive an award.*
