### **Requirements for the Book Report**

The following items must be in the book report:

- (1) A cover page (title of book, name, date, and subject (English))
- (2) Introduction
- (3) The main characters (briefly describe each of them)
- (4) The setting (where does the story take place, what is the time frame or era)
- (5) The tone (is the book comedic, sad, etc, provide examples for choosing your tone)
- (6) The plot (what is the story about- DO NOT RETELL EVERY DETAIL OF THE BOOK, JUST A SUMMARY)
- (7) The conflict (with whom does the main character(s) have a conflict)

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with or what is the problem or issue)

(8) A conclusion

(9) Your personal view and rating system for the book (1=lowest and 4=highest). This is the only section that should be in first person.

**\*\*DO NOT WRITE YOUR book report in bulleted or numerical form!!!! These are merely guidelines to ensure that ensure that your paper is written and designed properly and are not an actual outline. DO NOT turn your report in a folder and/or binder. Your book report should be stapled in the left hand corner.**
