History of the Rocky Mountain District

At the Nineteenth Annual District Assembly of the Central Northwest District meeting at Jamestown, N.D., on August 17-18, 1928, General Superintendent H. F. Reynolds called the Montana delegates together to consider the organization of a new district, comprising the states of Montana and Wyoming, to be known as the Rocky Mountain District. On August 18, 1928, this same delegation passed a resolution requesting the general superintendents to arrange for a convention to be held in Billings, Mont., under the chairmanship of one of their number, for the purpose of organizing said Rocky Mountain District. The convention met in Billings, October 10 to 14, 1928, at which time Presiding General Superintendent H. F. Reynolds appointed Rev. W. D. Shelor (pastor of Billings) to the superintendency of the new district, with the proviso that "he shall not be called from his Sunday pastoral ministrations by district work." The following list of District Assemblies and district superintendents have been carefully checked and corrected by Ross E. Price, who was a member of the district at its beginning and has since been in some way associated with it. The district superintendents are listed here for the years in which they read reports to the assembly, and not starting from the year of their election (with the exception of his year of appointment for W. D. Shelor). Likewise, district secretaries are listed for the assemblies they actually served.

III. PLAN OF EXAMINATION

A. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

Eligibility

The Ministerial Course of Study is open to anyone who is pursuing ordination as an elder or deacon. This includes students who are attending college, seminary, and Nazarene Bible College, as well as those participating in the on-line Course of Study program.

To begin the enrollment process, a student contacts the Secretary of Directed Studies for an enrollment packet. He/she reviews the packet, completes the application and gives to his/her pastor to sign and submit to the district superintendent. The district superintendent approves/ disapproves the enrollment. If approved, the application is sent by the D.S. to the secretary of Directed Studies.

Courses

Each student must select the track in which he/she wishes to enroll: elder; deacon--Christian education; deacon--compassionate ministries; deacon--music; deacon—youth; deacon--administration; deacon—chaplaincy; lay ministry. Each student must successfully complete a minimum of two courses each year to remain in the course of study. (429.3) If the student fails to maintain this minimum, he/she will be removed from the course of study.

The student must actively participate in a local church while completing the course of study. (426.3)

A student must have completed 1/4 of the required courses (6 courses in the online course of study program) to receive a district license.

A student has ten years after receiving his/her first district license to complete the course of study. (429.4)

Modes of Study

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is to attend a Nazarene liberal arts college/university, Nazarene Bible College and, if possible, the Nazarene Theological Seminary. The Course of Study modules are available online through NNU or Nazarene Bible College. The Directed Studies Course of Study is under the immediate supervision of the District Board of Ministerial Development.

Directed Study (non-degree, certificate) Regulations

Directed Studies has moved into the twenty-first century, from courses to modules, from textbooks, exams and reading books to interactive online education/training modules.

Who may consider the directed studies route: those who cannot uproot the family to go off to school; the budget won't stretch to cover the cost of classes and feeding the

family; don't need another degree but have a call to preach; difficult to get away from current responsibilities to take classes.

The Directed Studies Course of Study Online program of NNU and NBC has been developed with you in mind. You can complete course work toward ordination in a timely fashion from your home or office.

1. Request an application and enroll with the district Board of Ministerial Development. Student must be enrolled prior to signing up for online courses.
2. The modules/courses will be completed through the NNU or NBC Course of Study online program. For the students participating in the NNU online Course of Study, the supervised ministry requirement is handled by the district.
 - a. Course work is all online. There may be some textbooks or other materials to purchase.
 - c. The student may wish to purchase books for his/her own library.
 - d. To register, go to website: NNU: <http://interests.nnu.edu/regionpastor>; NBC: <http://online.nbc.edu>.

Bible College, College, and Seminary Students

College, Bible school, and seminary students are responsible to the Board of Ministerial Development to submit documentary evidence of academic standing in their respective schools by February 28 each year. Word of mouth will not suffice as documentary evidence. College and seminary students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with the Manual requirements for study toward ordination. Course requirements are available from the online course of study at NNU, NBC or from the secretary of Directed Studies.

Graduate status from the prescribed Course of Study and completion of experience requirement does NOT automatically qualify a candidate for ordination (430.3, 431.3).

- The Board of Ministerial Development is not obligated to recommend ordination upon completion of prescribed course of study and completion of the experience requirement but has the right to consider each case on its own merits.
- Ordination should always be viewed as a privilege, not a right. Candidates should never assume that passing the prescribed course of study and completing the experience requirement automatically entitles them to ordination or imposes some legal obligation on the church. Election to ordination as elder or deacon is the prerogative of the District Assembly.

MINISTERS TRANSFERRING FROM ANOTHER EVANGELICAL DENOMINATION

Ordained ministers, coming from another evangelical denomination, asking to have credentials recognized are required to complete at least the following courses: Exploring Nazarene History & Polity, Becoming a Holy People and Exploring John Wesley's Theology.

“Together We Are...” (DVD presentation)

My favorite cartoon character of all time is Charlie Brown. Charles Schultz was not just a gifted cartoonist but also a wise observer of humanity with all our quirks, our needs, our weaknesses, and our strengths. He had a unique way of putting real life issues into a concise, practical package. One of my all-time favorites has Snoopy sitting on his dog house, his typewriter/computer in his lap, typing away. Charlie Brown enters the scene and looks on as Snoopy is intently engaged in his project. Snoopy looks up as Charlie Brown is focused on Snoopy’s writing. He reads, “It was a dark night, dark and foreboding, as a pirate ship silently slipped into the still waters of the hidden cove. Suddenly there was a shot, and the piercing scream of a lady echoed into the night.” Snoopy could see the perplexed look of Charlie Brown, so he stops his work and affirms, “Don’t worry, it all connects in the end.”

Tonight my report also has several dots that I hope will connect us to (I) what we’ve done; (II) what we need to do; and (III) a recommitment to being the church He has called us to be.

I. Dot Number One: What We’ve Done

I want first to thank you for the warm and gracious welcome you have extended to Janet and I. We have sensed and witnessed your support and we have been blessed by your prayers on our behalf. Thank you for sharing your friendship, for caring for us, and for working with us as we endeavor to “Create Communities of Hope and Help” throughout the Rocky Mountain District. Janet and I have truly enjoyed getting acquainted with our District team as we have visited every church on the District and worshipped with many. We have a great team, a great commission, and a great opportunity to help people who are in need of hope and the Good News so that they can live not as victims, but as victors through a loving, obedient, faith and a trust relationship with Jesus.

I also want to thank you for your ministry to and for others in the following areas:

A. Stewardship

1. World Evangelism Fund (WEF) Giving: paid 111.42% of our goal. (Acknowledge Pastors and NMI presidents that have paid 100% or more.)
2. Pension & Benefits (P&B) Giving: paid at 107:19%. (Acknowledge Lay-Persons in churches paying 100% or more.)
3. Educational Giving: paid 100% of goal. (Acknowledge all Graduates of Christian Education.)
4. District Giving: paid 115.5% of goal. (Acknowledge Pastors of churches that have paid in excess of 100%.)

Because of your faithfulness in giving, and God’s blessing of allowing us to lease the District Center, we will be able to further reduce the proposed 9.2% of our District allocation to 8.5%. This unified percentage includes the auxiliary (NMI, SDMI, and NYI) allocations. We are able to do this because of your faithful giving of over 100% payment to the District allocation. We need your continued commitment, as our goal is to start three new church ministries in this church year.

Thank you for being generous in your giving, as I believe God blesses those who give on behalf of others.

B. Worship and Discipleship

In our current system of metric measurements we focus on:

1. New Believers by Profession of Faith - 78

2. New Nazarenes by Profession of Faith - 86
3. People involved in discipleship through small groups, traditional Sunday School, and other ministries that help us and others mature into fully committed and wholly surrendered followers of Jesus Christ – 1,657

The report indicates we can and must become more effective in our worship and discipleship. I realize we do not produce the fruit, but we can and must be engaged in those activities that allow God to harvest the spiritual fruit He longs to produce. We must:

- a. Sow the seeds of the Gospel by being consistent and passionate witnesses for Jesus.
- b. Cultivate an atmosphere wherein people sense and experience the presence of the living Jesus and encounter His love and grace through the Holy Spirit in us.
- c. Live consistently as God's called people who have been delivered from sin's grip and restored to holy living in our behavior and our attitudes, through the saving and sanctifying work of Jesus.

I would like you to hear two stories of what God is doing through two pastors and their churches as they endeavor to reach people for Jesus.

- b. Rev. Tim Tharp, Billings Journey Church of the Nazarene

- Renounce failed practices, behaviors, and attitudes
- Affirm and embrace God's grace, His provisional resources, and His missional purpose and plan

1. **Acknowledging Current Reality**

A story is told of a man who went to see his doctor and upon being asked by the doctor to describe his symptoms, he said, “Well, when I touch my head with my finger, it hurts; when I touch my shoulder, my arm, and my knee, it hurts; in fact, wherever I touch with my finger, it hurts. What’s wrong with me, Doctor?” The doctor thought and considered it all and then said, “You have a broken finger.” As we access our reality let me describe some current data that will lead to a diagnosis.

- a. The percentage of adults in the USA who attend church is decreasing. Most polls indicate that only one in four people attend church. (A side note of this would indicate that we in the church are failing to keep our own children connected to Christ.)
- b. Approximately one-half of all churches in America failed to add one new person through coming to faith in Christ this past year. We have some churches on our District who find themselves as part of that statistic.
- c. However you do the math or spin the statistics, the reality is that people disconnected from a living relationship of faith and obedience to Christ lose during this life, and lose for eternity. God calls the church to exist for the benefit of those outside its membership; we seem to have lost sight of this reality.
- d. Many researchers claim that in the USA more churches are closing than are opening every year. In 1900 there were 27 churches for every 10,000 people. In 2004 (nine years ago), that statistic was 11 churches per 10,000. It is reasonable to believe that current figures would indicate an even further decline in this number.

- e. In the USA, conversions to other religions are growing while the number of those leaving Christianity is increasing. (In contrast, in the most densely populated Muslim country in the world, it is Christianity that is the fastest growing faith.)
- f. The decline in Christianity in America is not a recent trend. It has been going on for fifty years. In the last fifty years, US churches have failed to gain an additional 2% of the population. Note that, while church membership has increased, actual church attendance is declining. In baseball there is a saying: “You can’t play the game while seated in the bleachers.”
- g. Too many “churched people” believe and behave identically to those who are unchurched. There is a huge disconnect between the belief and behavior of the early New Testament followers of Jesus and that of our “culturally Christian” church of today. Alarming data:
 - Only 53% of churched people believe there are moral truths that are absolute.
 - 43% do not believe in or affirm the Holy Spirit.
 - 33% do not believe Jesus was physically resurrected.
 - The US leads the industrialized nations of the world in the following:
 - 1) Percentage of single-parent families
 - 2) Abortion rate
 - 3) Sexually transmitted diseases
 - 4) Teen age birth rate
 - 5) The use of illegal drugs by students
 - 6) Prison population
 - 7) Rate of child poverty

Diagnosis:

The church in the USA as a whole is broke. We have lost sight of our identity. We have ignored the promised resources God has given to us; we have, like ancient Israel, given ourselves to the worship of the gods of our culture as opposed to the worship of the God of Creation.

2. Confess Our Sin:

This is not a “them” condition; it is an “us” condition. The old spiritual song declared it accurately by saying, “It’s me, It’s me, It’s me O Lord, standing in the need of prayer.”

II Chronicles 7:14 reminds us and beckons us, *“If My people, who are called by My name, will humble themselves and pray and seek My face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land.”* I John 1:9 encourages us with the following promise, *“If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.”*

It's time for us to determine to believe God meant what He said when He made these promises to His people, and to act accordingly in response to them. I ask you now to join me in a prayer of confession whereby we humble ourselves before God and repent of

our failure to be His Holy Sanctified Missional Church. Let us repent for our apathy and our self-centeredness that have kept us from experiencing and being His transforming church to our culture.

3. Renounce our failed practices, behaviors and attitudes:

Today, the need of the church is not another seminar for the sake of some “new method” or “strategy.” The answer to the Church’s need is not in any human methodology or strategy or program. The answer is in the power and anointing of the Holy Spirit. The answer is in the grace of God for us and within us. The Church cannot and will not be the Church God called us to be without the Holy Spirit’s abiding and empowering presence in us. Teaching and preaching alone will not suffice. Vows and promises, no matter how sincere, will not overcome the power of the world, the flesh and the enemy of our soul. We must not settle for less than what Jesus prayed for in John 17:17, *“Sanctify them by the truth; your word is truth.”* In Acts 1:8 He promised, *“You will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.”*

Therefore, we cannot and must not continue to settle for the status quo attitude so characterized by today’s cultural phrase, “It is what it is.” This basically translates to, “Existing is good enough.” No, it is not! We are not called to exist; we are called to transform our world; to overcome the reign of sin; to help bring forth God’s Kingdom Rule.

It can no longer, it will no longer be acceptable for us to report year after year, “no new believers” coming to faith in Christ. It will no longer be acceptable to report no new ministry endeavors to reach out to build caring relationships to those who are unchurched and disconnected from a faith relationship with Christ. It will no longer be acceptable to be a church that exists for us. We must not and will not accept that it is ok to not be engaged in “Making Disciples.” We will not accept as ok the failure to have and implement a plan and process for “Making Disciples.” It is not acceptable nor is it “good enough” to remain as we were and are, and not be growing in maturity in Christlikeness and holiness of lifestyle in behaviors, attitudes, motives and priorities. It is no longer acceptable to go about our daily lives and not intentionally practice being God’s ambassadors.

We must not ignore the marginalized or those who are considered to be the unwanted and neglected people of our world. We cannot and must not ignore the injustices of our culture to each other as God’s people. Lastly, it is not acceptable to be content with an individualistic faith relationship that does not take responsibility for helping others grow and be built up in Christ. We are “One Team One Mission” because we are better and stronger together. We live and grow in our relationship with Christ most effectively within the context of being connected with each other through the Church and ministry. This is how God made us.

III. Dot Number Three: Reaffirm and Embrace God’s Grace

In conclusion, I want us to reaffirm and embrace God’s grace, His promised resources, and His missional purpose and plan. Listen, Church, to these promises:

Isaiah 42:5-7, which is God’s promise to His people, fulfilled by His Servant Jesus, Who made this our inheritance as well: *“This is what God the Lord says...I, the Lord, have called you in righteousness: I will take hold of your hand. I will keep you, and will make you to be a covenant for the people and a light for the Gentiles (unbelievers) to open eyes*

that are blind, to free captives from (the prison of sin) and to release from 'sin's grip' the dungeon those who sit (live) in darkness."

Isaiah 43:1: *"This is what the Lord says, He who created you, (Jacob) He who formed you, (Israel). Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are Mine. When you pass through the waters I will be with you and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your (Deliverer) Savior."*

I Corinthians 1:4a: *"I always thank my God for you, for in Him you have been enriched in every way. Therefore you do not lack any spiritual gift as you eagerly wait for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed."*

God has called us; God has given us the Holy Spirit, both to empower us and to equip us; God has commissioned us with His mission and with our ministry. Go make disciples; teach and proclaim the Good News of Hope and Help through Jesus; love others as we have been loved by Jesus; be His Holy Kingdom people living by His rule and under His reign and thus be His witnesses to all who are yet apart from Him, those who do not yet know all He has available to them.

We, His called-out ones, are by nature to be missionaries, "sent ones." When or if we cease to be missionaries, we have not just failed in a task, but we cease to be His called and sent people.

We face a choice, Rocky Mountain District Church of the Nazarene: To be or not to be. Are we to be fully surrendered, wholly committed followers of Jesus; to have the influence of Salt and Light and Yeast in our culture whereby in and through us our culture is transformed back to where God will say, "It is good"? Or are we to be yet another church of the world, simply one more casually and culturally Christian church where there is no power to transform anyone, let alone transform our world? Will we follow God's call to be "One Team One Mission", to serve God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength? Or will we remain merely a collection of churches under the banner of a denominational name, giving lip service to a creed or faith? James 5:4 states, *"Everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith."* Let us live up to this declaration not only in word, but may it become our purposeful and intentional resolve, our testimony, our witness of God's power so those around us are able to see and experience for themselves the power of Jesus Christ.

Like Joshua before the nation of Israel, I ask you to join me in following Jesus; being His Kingdom people in holiness of heart behavior and life choices; to be His witnesses; to be intercessors for our broken and unbelieving culture and its people; to give ourselves wholly to His service.

Last year you heard about Work and Witness trips that took place. This afternoon, Rev. Mark Seitz will tell about the trip to Tanzania last July, sponsored by our district. There were some lasting connections made with the people in Tanzania and lives changed.

Objectives for Nazarene Missions International are:

Praying – Interceding for leaders and churches and for the Holy Spirit to draw all people to Christ.

Discipling – Involving and mentoring future missions leaders, especially youth and children, to make Christlike disciples in the nations.

Giving – Devoting ourselves and our resources, especially the World Evangelism Fund, to extend Christ's kingdom.

Educating – Informing people of the World's needs and enabling our church to meet those needs in Christ.

This year we have done all of these.

When a church meets these objectives and pays at least 100% of the assigned World Evangelism Fund amount it shows that Missions is a priority. We have ??? Mission Priority One churches. Let's recognize them now. Give out awards.

Once again, you've done a great job financially supporting the global efforts of Nazarene Missions International. Of our 36 churches, 26 paid 100% or more of their WEF goal. Thanks for funding the Mission. All but two churches gave something toward the World Evangelism Fund.

We have 21 churches that will receive a World Evangelism Church of Excellence certificate. This award is for giving at least 5.7% or \$1,500 more than 5.5% of their current income toward the World Evangelism Fund. **Present Awards.**

Nine of these churches overpaid their WEF by more than 20% this year. They are: Casper – 127% - \$2,846; Evanston – 146%; Great Falls – 123% - \$2,059; Lander – 226% - \$4,421; Libby – 124%; Poplar – 228%; Sheridan – 134% - \$1,922; Torrington – 128%; Wheatland – 151%.

Rocky Mountain Nazarenes gave a total of \$275,248 for missions, that is an increase of \$24,225 over last year! As a district, we overpaid our World Evangelism Fund goal by \$18,105. We are at 111.423% of our WEF. **Praise the Lord!** Thank you for supporting Nazarene Missions!

With this being my last year, it would be easy to become nostalgic and reminisce over the past. The past is an important part of our future. We need to know where we have come from and why we believe what we do so that it will make sense where we are going.

Without Him I could not have done this. It is His message and His mission; we are but tools in His hands. I want to thank my wife, Susan, for her support and the many hours she put in over the years. Thanks to our current district NMI council for serving Him. Also, thanks to all the people involved in NMI on the Rocky Mountain District through the years. Some of you have helped shape my view and love for missions. We call that discipling. All Praise is to God!

3. District Sunday School Ministries Chairman

Rev. Carr, pastors, delegates and friends, it is once again my privilege to report to you what has been taking place through Sunday School and Discipleship

Ministries (SDMI) on the Rocky Mountain District. We were reminded at our recent General Convention each of us involved in SDMI are to be: **people of prayer, engaged in the Word, and making Christlike disciples.** I pray this would characterize all Rocky Mountaineers.

Last year in a statement from our Board of General Superintendents we were told:

“Sunday School and other small groups are vital components in the mission of every Church of the Nazarene. What is done in Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries addresses every aspect of our Core Values. There is no better place where people of all ages learn what it means to be ‘Christian, Holiness, and Missional’ and how ‘to make Christlike disciples.’

“The effectiveness of the local church is enhanced when those attending our worship services are given opportunity to learn the Word, participate in small groups that provide nurture and accountability, and find spheres of pastoral concern and personal attention. There is no better venue than Sunday School and other small groups for this kind of ministry.

“As well as being proven vehicles for training, discipleship, and fellowship, Sunday School and small groups are also effective evangelistic outreach tools of the church. The Great Commission is most effectively pursued through vibrant Sunday Schools and other small group ministries.”

I again want to express my appreciation to our district age division department heads: Andrea Bender, Children’s Ministries director; Joe Arnold, District NYI president; and Ken Osso, Adult Ministries director. They, together with district SDMI board members Janet Aranda, Susan Vigil and Wendy Knight, share with me the desire to see the goal of **making Christlike disciples** become a greater reality across our district.

Regrettably our District SDMI hosted TRAINing Events planned for last fall in Casper, WY and Great Falls, MT had to be cancelled when our keynote speaker backed out at the last minute. The board is committed to having meaningful TRAINing Events take place this fall. Our hope to have details available at District Assembly has not materialized however.

District Camping Ministries

The Rocky Mountain District camping program had another great season. Montana Boys and Girls Camp, Teen Super Camp and Laymen’s Retreat all reported good camps. It was unfortunately necessary to cancel Wyoming Boys and Girls Camp last summer, but I have already heard they had an excellent camp this year! I thank everyone who willingly gave of their time and energy to keep the camping program a vital part of the Church.

Continuing Lay Training

Continuing Lay Training (CLT) has a goal to equip believers for effective ministry while enriching the individual’s walk with Christ. Through CLT resources are available to enhance ministry as well as tools to aid in spiritual and personal growth. Several district churches have participated in CLT, but I have not received a report from the CLT office.

SDMI Achievement Awards

I encourage each of our churches to work to qualify for Achievement Awards as follows: **Honor School Award** (5-24% increase in both attendance and enrollment). **Superior School Award** (25-49% increase in both attendance and enrollment). **Exceptional School Award** (50%+ increase in attendance and enrollment).

Our District SDMI Board remains passionate about each area which comes under the umbrella of Sunday School and Discipleship Ministries. I encourage our congregations to work with them to see the ministry of SDMI across our two states advance.

District Assembly 2013 will be the occasion of my official retirement from ministry. While I do not intend to completely withdraw from ministry involvement, I do feel that it is time for me to step aside as chairman of the Rocky Mountain District SDMI

Board. We need someone with new and fresh ideas to lead us on in our pursuit of **being** and **making** Christlike disciples in the states of Montana and Wyoming. I pray that you will give to whoever is elected as district SDMI chairman the same cooperation and support that you have given to me.

I conclude with the same questions I asked last year. Could we determine that this will be a year of seeing God's kingdom expanded on our Rocky Mountain District? Would you ask others from your church to join you in praying to that end? Pray that the Holy Spirit would find us willing to go to those who represent fields ripe for harvest.

May God's leading in the 2013-2014 church year be clear and specific.

2. We recommend that ordained ministers asking to have their credentials recognized, coming from another evangelical denomination, do at least the following course: Exploring Nazarene History & Polity, Becoming a Holy People and Exploring John Wesley's Theology.

3. Student must be enrolled with District Board of Ministerial Development prior to signing up for online courses. He/she should request an application and enroll with the Board.

4. Students must have the required two classes completed by the end of February and verified by the time of the interview.

4. The Board of Ministerial Development promotes continuing education for ordained ministers and other staff ministers on the district.

a. In keeping with the continuing education requirements of the 1997 General Assembly (231.4), the district is making seminars available to the pastors. The seminars are in cooperation with the Pastoral Ministries office and will be registered for continuing education credit.

C. ASSEMBLY COMMITTEES

1. Finance

Finance Committee

The Committee on Finance submits the following recommendations:

1. Our people use the Scriptural method of church finance: the faithful giving of tithes and offerings (Malachi 3:10).

2. Each pastor/church accept their allocations as a fair share of the total church program. Recognizing it is the responsibility of pastors and congregations to support our denominational ministries, we recommend they develop and work a systematic weekly or monthly plan to fully fund their allocations.

3. Our churches consider benevolent gifts to other churches on the Rocky Mountain District who might need assistance in meeting in their allocation responsibilities (Romans 12:1; Acts 20:35).

4. That allocations accepted by the district assembly be as follows:

- a. World Evangelism Fund is 5.5% of church income.
- b. Education is 2.25% of church income.
- c. Pensions and Benefits is 2.25% of church income.
- d. Rocky Mountain District is 9.2% of church income.

Allocations are percentages of current year church income. Churches report income and calculate allocations for payment at the www.fundingthemission.org website.

5. Each local church fund each allocation proportionately as they are able with a goal of fully funding the mission of the general and district Church of the Nazarene. We recommend that payments be made due by the 21st of each month on the previous month's income. Local churches may apply to the District Superintendent and DAB for a one time exemption from the Rocky Mountain District allocation on special gifts for capital improvements or developmental projects.

6. We recommend that the District Budget be as follows:

7. The total District Budget of \$244,758.00 will be allocated as above, subject to the receipt of allocation payments.

9. Travel expense reimbursement for authorized district business by board members and officers be set at 50% of the IRS allowable published mileage rate regardless of mode of travel, plus other approved expenses.

10. The local church set aside funds to assist its pastor(s) and department heads in attending the General Assembly.

11. In light of the inflationary cost of living that all salaries be reviewed as per current *Manual* paragraph 129.8. March is the suggested month for this annual review. It is further recommended that an annual cost of living increase based upon the consumer price index be the minimum increase for both the local pastor(s) and the district employees.

12. Every pastor be given a paid vacation each year, the terms to be determined after a consultation of the pastor with the church board; that this vacation policy be established in the written understanding between that pastor and the board. It is further recommended that the following formula be used as a minimum guideline based on years of ministerial service to the Church of the Nazarene as credited by the Pensions and Benefits Department:

1- 3 years	2 weeks
4-10 years	3 weeks
11-20 years	4 weeks
20+ years	5 weeks

A policy on accumulation of vacation benefits will be developed at the beginning of each written understanding. The absence of such a policy expressly implies no accumulation will occur from year to year. Church activities whether local, district or general, are not to be counted as vacation time. We strongly urge pastors and the district superintendent to take one day a week away from church duties, and to take vacation time based on the above formula.

13. Each individual church should report on a regular basis their allocation payment progress to their congregation.

14. The District Auxiliary Budgets are to be set as requested by the District SDMI, District NYI, and District NMI respectively.

Financial reports for each month, including a detailed balance sheet and budget-versus-actual report, will be sent to the District Finance Committee chairman by the 10th of the following month. Forms for these reports will be provided by the Finance Committee. The Committee chairperson will forward these reports to the District Office each month.

15. Every church subscribe to *Church Law and Tax Report*, a bimonthly newsletter, and purchase the annual edition of the *Church and Clergy Tax Guide*. These may be purchased from: Church Ministries Resources, P.O. Box 1098, Matthew, NC 28106. *Compensation for Church Staff* by Cobble and Hammer (*Christianity Today International*, Resource Dept., 465 Gunderson Dr., Carol Stream, IL 60188) is highly recommended as well.

16. In view of the retirement needs of pastors, each church is encouraged to contribute to its pastor's tax-sheltered annuity as provided by the Pensions and Benefits Department (www.pbusa.org).

17. In view of the complexity of ministry in our day and desiring to invest in both the clergy and the local church, and in light of the historic wisdom of the general assembly of the Church of the Nazarene, it is heartily recommended that every local church follow the provision of paragraph 129.10 of the *Manual*:

“In order to encourage a healthy pastoral ministry and the lifelong learning of the pastor, the church board, in consultation with the district superintendent, should provide a sabbatical leave for the pastor following each seven consecutive years of service in one congregation. The timing and duration of the sabbatical shall be determined in consultation with the pastor, church board and district superintendent. It is strongly urged that the pastor's salary continue in full and the church board provide for pulpit supply during the sabbatical period.” (*Manual 2009-2013*).

18. As established by the District Advisory Board, the local church financial year is May 1 through April 30. To receive credit for allocations paid, all payments must be received by the district treasurers no later than May 15 following the close of the local church financial year.

19. The district superintendent, NMI, SDMI and NYI must submit their annual operational budget requests to the District Finance Committee chairperson no later than two weeks before the Pre-Assembly Finance Committee meeting.

20. Operational budget expense items D-100, D-200, D-300, D-310, D-330, D-350, and D-600 are the district superintendent's salary and benefit package and may be allocated between those items as necessary by mutual agreement between the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board.

21. Operational budget items D-610 and D-620 are to be reimbursed at actual or IRS allowable cost based on an accountable reimbursement policy as set forth by the IRS and established by the District Advisory Board.

22. Since an operating budget is essential to good church financial management, it is imperative that every local church annually adopt an operational budget with these considerations:

- a. A systematic plan for paying allocations
- b. Feasibility of the adoption of Faith Promise giving
- c. An adequate salary for all paid staff
- d. Keeping local bills paid to date
- e. Maintaining their property in good condition
- f. Financing outreach ministries

23. It is required that pastors and church boards give careful attention each year to the filing of non-profit corporation registration with the secretary of state. All state nonprofit corporation requirements must be met. Confirmation of this is to be forwarded to the district office.

24. It is required that each church carry a multi-peril insurance policy. Said policy needs to be reviewed in light of the potential local liability with consideration given to the limits that are carried. Confirmation of this policy being in force is to be forwarded to the district office annually. It is strongly recommended that directors' and officers' liability and malpractice insurance also be considered.

25. This Finance Committee report shall be presented to the local church board at its first meeting, or as soon as practical, following the district assembly.

26. We encourage every church to utilize The Church of the Nazarene Foundation to facilitate planned and deferred gifts from their members to any Nazarene ministry, including gifts to the local church, and to use the Foundation to manage investment accounts, endowments, and charitable trusts. Visit www.nazarenefoundation.org or call 866-273-2549 to contact the Foundation.

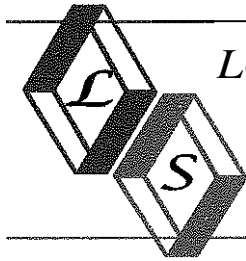

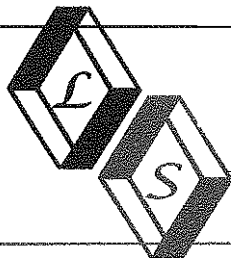

1. Nature of Activities and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Rocky Mountain District Church of the Nazarene is an entity made up of interdependent local churches throughout Montana and Wyoming organized to facilitate the mission of each local church through mutual support, the sharing of resources, and collaboration.

The majority of revenue comes from local churches who give a predetermined percentage of funds to the Rocky Mountain District. This percentage is voted on yearly at the District Assembly by delegates from each church. The churches are expected to fund its allocation with a goal of fully funding the mission of the District Church of the Nazarene.

This summary of significant accounting policies of The Rocky Mountain District Church of the Nazarene is presented to assist in understanding the District's financial statements. The financial statements and notes are representations of the District's management, which is responsible for their integrity and objectivity.

Basis of Accounting - The District's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the modified cash basis of accounting; consequently, revenues are recognized when received rather than when promised or earned, and certain expenses and purchases of assets are recognized when cash is disbursed rather than when the obligation is incurred.

Property and equipment - The District capitalizes property and equipment with a cost or fair value at date of receipt of \$250 or more and an estimated useful life greater than one year. Property and equipment have been capitalized at cost if purchased, or at fair market value if donated. Depreciation is provided using the straight-line method over the following estimated useful lives:

Buildings and improvements	15 - 31.5 years
Automobiles	5 years
Office equipment	7 years
Land improvements	15 years

Income taxes - Rocky Mountain District Church of the Nazarene is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Service Code Section 501(c)(3), and is treated as a publicly supported charitable organization.

Tax penalties and interest, if any, would be classified with income tax expense in the financial statements. No tax penalties or interest have been incurred or are recognized in the financial statements. Generally, three tax years remain subject to examination by tax jurisdictions.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

1. Nature of Activities and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies (Continued)

Subsequent events -Management has evaluated subsequent events through the date the financial statements were available for issuance, which is the same date as the independent accountants' review report.

2. Investments

Investments are composed of cash, certificates of deposits, and mutual funds and are stated at fair value.

6. Operating Lease -Lessor

The Church rents out the District Center in Billings, MT as a held for sale property while it looks for a buyer for the property. During the year ended May 31, 2013, the Church required monthly payments of \$425.00 on a month to month lease for 6 months. Total rent revenue was \$2,550.00.

Subsequent to year end and beginning July 1, 2013, the Church leases the District Center on a three-year lease requiring rental payments of \$5,000 the first year; \$6,000 the second year; and \$7,000 the third year. The lease also provides an option to purchase the property/first right of refusal for \$1,200,000. The annual rental income is as follows:
