History of the Rocky Mountain District

At the Nineteenth Annual District Assembly of the Central Northwest District meeting at Jamestown, N.D., on August 17-18, 1928, General Superintendent H. F. Reynolds called the Montana delegates together to consider the organization of a new district, comprising the states of Montana and Wyoming, to be known as the Rocky Mountain District. On August 18, 1928, this same delegation passed a resolution requesting the general superintendents to arrange for a convention to be held in Billings, Mont., under the chairmanship of one of their number, for the purpose of organizing said Rocky Mountain District. The convention met in Billings, October 10 to 14, 1928, at which time Presiding General Superintendent H. F. Reynolds appointed Rev. W. D. Shelor (pastor of Billings) to the superintendency of the new district, with the proviso that "he shall not be called from his Sunday pastoral ministrations by district work." The following list of District Assemblies and district superintendents have been carefully checked and corrected by Ross E. Price, who was a member of the district at its beginning and has since been in some way associated with it. The district superintendents are listed here for the years in which they read reports to the assembly, and not starting from the year of their election (with the exception of his year of appointment for W. D. Shelor). Likewise, district secretaries are listed for the assemblies they actually served.

III. PLAN OF EXAMINATION

A. INSTRUCTIONS TO STUDENTS

Eligibility

The Ministerial Course of Study is open to anyone who is pursuing ordination as an elder or deacon. This includes students who are attending college, seminary, and Nazarene Bible College, as well as those participating in the on-line Course of Study program.

To begin the enrollment process, a student contacts the Secretary of Directed Studies for an enrollment packet. He/she reviews the packet, completes the application and gives to his/her pastor to sign and submit to the district superintendent. The district superintendent approves/

disapproves the enrollment. If approved, the application is sent by the D.S. to the secretary of Directed Studies.

Courses

Each student must select the track in which he/she wishes to enroll: elder; deacon--Christian education; deacon--compassionate ministries; deacon--music; deacon--youth; deacon--administration; deacon--chaplaincy; lay ministry. Each student must successfully complete a minimum of two courses each year to remain in the course of study. (429.3) If the student fails to maintain this minimum, he/she will be removed from the course of study.

The student must actively participate in a local church while completing the course of study. (426.3)

A student must have completed 1/4 of the required courses (6 courses in the online course of study program) to receive a district license.

A student has ten years after receiving his/her first district license to complete the course of study. (429.4)

Modes of Study

The recommended mode of preparation for full-time Christian service is to attend a Nazarene liberal arts college/university, Nazarene Bible College and, if possible, the Nazarene Theological Seminary. The Course of Study modules are available online through NNU or Nazarene Bible College. The Directed Studies Course of Study is under the immediate supervision of the District Board of Ministerial Development.

Directed Study (non-degree, certificate) Regulations

Directed Studies has moved into the twenty-first century, from courses to modules, from textbooks, exams and reading books to interactive online education/training modules.

Who may consider the directed studies route: those who cannot uproot the family to go off to school; the budget won't stretch to cover the cost of classes and feeding the family; don't need another degree but have a call to preach; difficult to get away from current responsibilities to take classes.

The Directed Studies Course of Study Online program of NNU and NBC has been developed with you in mind. You can complete course work toward ordination in a timely fashion from your home or office.

1. Request an application and enroll with the district Board of Ministerial Development. Student must be enrolled prior to signing up for online courses.

2. The modules/courses will be completed through the NNU or NBC Course of Study online program. For the students participating in the NNU online Course of Study, the supervised ministry requirement is handled by the district.

a. Course work is all online. There may be some textbooks or other materials to purchase.

c. The student may wish to purchase books for his/her own library.

Bible College, College, and Seminary Students

College, Bible school, and seminary students are responsible to the Board of Ministerial Development to submit documentary evidence of academic standing in their respective schools

by February 28 each year. Word of mouth will not suffice as documentary evidence. College and seminary students are reminded to plan their curriculum in harmony with the Manual requirements for study toward ordination. Course requirements are available from the online course of study at NNU, NBC or from the secretary of Directed Studies.

Graduate status from the prescribed Course of Study and completion of experience requirement does NOT automatically qualify a candidate for ordination (430.3, 431.3).

- The Board of Ministerial Development is not obligated to recommend ordination upon completion of prescribed course of study and completion of the experience requirement but has the right to consider each case on its own merits.
- Ordination should always be viewed as a privilege, not a right. Candidates should never assume that passing the prescribed course of study and completing the experience requirement automatically entitles them to ordination or imposes some legal obligation on the church. Election to ordination as elder or deacon is the prerogative of the District Assembly.

MINISTERS TRANSFERRING FROM ANOTHER EVANGELICAL DENOMINATION

Ordained ministers, coming from another evangelical denomination, asking to have credentials recognized are required to complete at least the following courses: Exploring Nazarene History & Polity, Becoming a Holy People and Exploring John Wesley's Theology.

IV. DAILY PROCEEDINGS

FRIDAY, JUNE 27, 2014

The 87th District Assembly of the Rocky Mountain District opened at Billings Hotel & Convention, Billings, MT at 7:00 p.m. with a worship service including the report/challenge of the district superintendent.

Greetings and welcome were given by Rev. Bill Carr, District Superintendent.

Dr. Bob & Karen Broadbooks, Regional Director USA/Canada, brought greetings to the Assembly from the General Church, the 80 districts and 5,021 churches in the USA/Canada region. He presented Rev. Carr with a collectible milk bottle. There were 50,000 new converts in USA /Canada last year and 203,000 worldwide. He prayed for the district and the assembly.

Guests were recognized: Dr. David and Sharon Graves, General Superintendent; Dr. David Alexander, NNU president; Dr. Fred Fullerton, NNU; Dr. Harold & Cheryl Graves, Nazarene Bible College president; Dr. David & Carol Ralph, Colorado District Superintendent; Rev. Art Alexander, New York Region; Rev. Bill Sunberg, Toronto pastor; Rev. Kevin & Joan Bruck, Asia-Pacific Regional Financial Coordinator.

Rocky Mountain District will be presenting Denny & Loris Friesen with a Distinguished Service Award for their years of faithful service and churchmanship.

Rev. Bill Carr presented the Call to Worship. He blew the Shofar. Dr. David Graves lit the Menorah. Scripture from Ephesians 1:17-21, 2:8-10 was read by Rev. Larry Dahlberg. Blessing by Rev. Bill Carr.

Theme “One Team, One Mission.”

Worship in song was led by Whitefish Praise Team.

Dr. David Graves called the Assembly to order and opened it with prayer.

Dr. David Graves presented Rev. Bill Carr, District Superintendent, to give his report and challenge.

The Children’s Choir sang, “Jesus Loves Me” and “Two By Two” during the report.

Our new focus must be “The principle of the Power of One.” We need a recovery of the “Power of One” in each of our churches. As a church we must change or our apathy will be our demise. We must share the message of hope. We must refuse to accept that no one is being transformed in our churches; just getting by is unacceptable.

Thank you for your stewardship. As a district we paid over 105.87% of our World Evangelism Fund, 93.24% of Pensions & Benefits Fund; 86.2% of Education Fund; and over 97.23% of district allocations.

We will be keeping our district unified district budget at 8.5% but we will need every church to meet this budget 100%.

We have 32 active churches; 3 inactive churches; 108 new Nazarenes; 158 new believers.

We can do better. We can take on the giants with God’s help.

Pastor Tom Lance came and shared what is happening in our Casper church. The miracle of the Power of One.”

We, each of us, are witnesses. We can do acts of grace and love to others. Determine to live in complete obedience and be his witness. Will you, Rocky Mountain Nazarenes, dare to say, “I will be One?” We can. We change our cities, communities and world for Christ. We can do it.

Dr. Harold Graves brought greetings from Nazarene Bible College. NBC was started in 1967 to fill a need for pastors and church workers. 22% of pastors in Church of the Nazarene are graduates of NBC.

Rev. David Ralph, Colorado District Superintendent, brought greetings on behalf of the Northwest Region.

Rev. Holland Lewis, interim pastor at Whitefish, MT, led in prayer.

Worship singing was led by the Whitefish Worship team.

Morning Devotions were led by Dr. David Alexander, NNU president. NNU turned 100 this year. 98th commencement. NNU is now giving as many graduate degrees as bachelor degrees conferring over 500 degrees in both the bachelor degrees and the graduate degree

programs. What is next for NNU? We must stay focused on our mission. We are a university in covenant relationship with the Rocky Mountain District Church of the Nazarene.

Dr. Fred Fullerton, heads the Wesley Center at NNU which provides assistance and support for pastors. They are now offering CEUs online education for \$29.00; helps churches with Clergy Sabbatical Preparation. They also provide Gallup Strengths Finder for leaders across the district and local churches. Follow NNU and Wesley center on Facebook and Twitter. Sept. 6, Cynthia Tobias and Focus On Family will simulcast “Transition from Grade School to Middle School students.”

Dr. Alexander announced the selection of a new co-chaplains: Olivia and Dustin Metcalf.

Constitutional Amendments from General Assembly 2013 for ratification of the district:

RESOLVED that a new paragraph be added to the *Manual* as follows:

Resolutions amending the Articles of Faith (paragraphs 1-22) shall be referred by the General Assembly to the Board of General Superintendents for review by a study committee, including theologians and ordained ministers, appointed by the Board of General Superintendents that reflect the global nature of our Church. The committee shall report, with any recommendations or resolutions, to the subsequent General Assembly.

RESOLVED that *Manual* paragraph 18, Article of Faith XIV, be amended as follows:

18. We believe in the Bible doctrine of divine healing and urge our people [to seek] to offer the prayer of faith for the healing of the sick. We also believe God heals through the means of medical science. (2 Kings 5:1-19; Psalm 103:1-5; Matthew 4:23-24; 9:18-35; John 4:46-54; Acts 5:12-16; 9:32-42; 14:8-15; 1 Corinthians 12:4-11; 2 Corinthians 12:7-10; James 5:13-16)

RESOLVED that *Manual* paragraph 27.1, item 3, be amended as follows:

27.1 First. By doing that which is enjoined in the Word of God, which is our rule of both faith and practice, including:

3. Being courteous to all [men] people (Ephesians 4:32; Titus 3:2; 1 Peter 2:17; 1 John 3:18).

FURTHER RESOLVED that *Manual* paragraph 27.1, item 5, be amended as follows:

5. Seeking to do good to the bodies and souls of [men] people; feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and imprisoned, and ministering to the needy, as opportunity and ability are given (Matthew 25:35-36; 2 Corinthians 9:8-10; Galatians 2:10; James 2:15-16; 1 John 3:17-18).

RESOLVED that *Manual* paragraph 27.2, item #3, be amended as follows:

27.2. Second. By avoiding evil of every kind, including:

3. Sexual immorality, such as premarital, [or] extramarital, or same-sex relations[,]; perversion in any form[,] or looseness and impropriety of conduct (Genesis 19:4-11; Exodus

20:14; Leviticus 18:22; 20:13; Matthew 5:27-32; Romans 1:26-27; 1 Corinthians 6:9-11; Galatians 5:19; 1 Thessalonians 4:3-7; 1 Timothy 1:10).

RESOLVED that a new paragraph be added to the *Manual* as follows:

28.1. We are agreed that there are three legislative entities in the structure of the Church of the Nazarene: local, district, general. The regions serve as administrative entities for mission strategy and implementation.

RESOLVED that *Manual* paragraph 30 be amended as follows:

Article III. District Assemblies

30. The General Assembly shall organize the membership of the church into district assemblies, giving such lay and ministerial representation therein as the General Assembly may deem fair and just, and shall determine qualifications of such representatives, provided, however, that all assigned ordained ministers shall be members thereof. The General [Assembly] Boundaries Committee shall [also] fix the boundaries of assembly districts[, and]. The General Assembly shall also define the powers and duties of district assemblies. (200-5.6)

RESOLVED that *Manual* paragraph 32 be amended as follows:

Amendments

32. The provisions of this Constitution may be repealed or amended when concurred in by a two-thirds vote of the General Assembly members present and voting, and when concurred in by not less than two-thirds of all the Phase 3 and Phase 2 district assemblies of the Church of the Nazarene. A majority vote is required on each constitutional amendment item by any Phase 3 or Phase 2 district assembly. Either the General Assembly or any Phase 3 or Phase 2 district assembly may take the initiative in the matter of proposing such amendments. As soon as such amendments shall have been adopted as herein provided, the result of the vote shall be announced by the Board of General Superintendents, whereupon such amendments shall have full force and effect.

Dr. Graves, General Superintendent called for a vote concurring with these amendments. All affirmed; no negative votes.

It was announced that Rev. Jim Tharp will be serving as supply pastor at Livingston, MT.

V. Reports

A. DISTRICT OFFICERS

District Superintendent

I’ve invited Janet to join me in this beginning portion that will lead into my report to you as your District Coach/Superintendent. As you know this new year of 2014 has been one that has presented to Janet, to me and to our family our greatest sense of loss, our darkest of hours, days, weeks and now months, a sense of loss which continues at times to threaten to overwhelm us. It began with the death of my brother, who passed away on New Year’s Eve as a result of kidney failure. It continued as sixteen days later, my Mother, 93-years old with Alzheimer’s, finally was able to know the reality of her faith as she, too, would experience the promise of scripture that “blessed are those who die in the Lord.”

Your support during those days was deeply appreciated. Little did we realize that there was yet more tragedy to come. In February, as a District, we experienced the shock of losing a young, vibrant witness for Christ as we learned of the tragic accident that left us mourning with

Youth Pastor Nathan Capen over the loss of Hannah. The question: how could one so young and with so much to give be so quickly absent from us? This became all too real.

That question would become even more embedded in Janet's and my heart and mind as on Sunday morning, March 23rd, we received a call from our son-in-love, Trent, informing us that our vibrant, out-to-make-a-difference-in-her-world daughter Karissa had suddenly passed away with what was found to be a rare and aggressive malignant brain tumor.

Your loving support, your prayers for strength and help for us, your cards, your gracious memorial gifts, and other expressions of care and love have truly been our source of strength, along with the presence of God and the support of our family. This support has enabled us to continue our daily life through this dark time.

While this year of 2014 has begun with tremendous loss, we are confident that, while we do not understand the circumstances, the tragedies and their consequences, God can be trusted, He cares for us, He hurts when we hurt, His grace is sufficient and He does all things well.

Thus, while without question there is deep sorrow and grieving, there is also hope and faith to dare to believe that God is at work renewing our world, preparing us for His New Day: a day of rejoicing and not sorrow, a day of praise and not mourning, a day of life everlasting where death is no more, a day of hope which has come to pass.

A reminder of our reason to hope is found in the promise of our children. A children's choir is going to share a song with us. It is a song of children, a song that will remind us all that we are God's children and He cares for us even as we care for these, our children. The children's choir is under the direction of Ms. Andrea Bender.

In the Old Testament account of David, the Shepherd King of Israel, no story is more often repeated than that of David's battle with Goliath the giant. Goliath is estimated by many biblical scholars to have been approximately 9 feet, 9 inches tall; he wore a warrior's armor weighing approximately 125 pounds and carried a spear that weighed 15 pounds. No question about it, Goliath was indeed a huge, intimidating and fearsome presence that could – and did – paralyze all of Israel's army. An entire army of thousands was held in check by one man, one giant of a man.

When a young shepherd boy of approximately 16 to 18 years of age by the name of David enters the story, events take a major turn. Most agree that David is a normal young man in terms of physical size. There was nothing about David that would suggest he possessed any extraordinary physical presence, unlike his counterpart, the giant called Goliath.

Note however, a marked contrast: one man, because of his size and demeanor of intimidation, held in check an entire army; one man, because of his faith in the One True God of creation and because of his obedience to God, put to flight an army of thousands. With this act, David illustrates the mighty principle of the "Power of One."

This story sets the focus for what I believe is needed on our Rocky Mountain District. We need a recovery and a re-establishment of the "Power of One" in each church across our District. I shared in my report last year the reality of the culture of our nation with regard to the attitude, attendance, values, and behavior of the church and "unchurched" of our population.

I shared with you that we, the church, must change. We must change, for if we don't, the current trend of increasing apathy toward the church and its message of hope through Jesus will continue, and if that happens, the church will continue to lose its influence. We will then resemble the churches that I visited in Germany and England. The buildings were beautiful and massive; they were very ornate with elaborate architecture and stained glass windows depicting scenes from the Bible; there were also the tombs of those buried on or under the floor of the

building. They were beautiful buildings and magnificent to see, but inside they were museums and mausoleums. Most people came to take pictures, enjoy a concert, or visit the dead. Few were there to hear and experience the message of hope, help, and healing through Jesus. Few, if any, came to be delivered from sin's grip on their lives. There was little, if any, life transformation occurring to those who came.

I also shared last year that in our changing, we must cease to view as acceptable zero or few new followers of Jesus testifying to being delivered from sin's grip and control of their lives. We cannot accept as normal that there is no one being transformed by the infilling and sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit.

The focus last year was, as it needed to be, on the necessity to change, and the need to no longer accept the status quo as our standard, our goal, our "normal."

This year, our focus must be on what we can do. Our current measurements tell us what we have done during this past year. What we have done is maintain in some areas, increase in a few, and lose ground in others:

World Evangelism giving - \$170,403 or 105.87%

Pension and Benefit giving - \$61,693 or 93.24%

Northwest Nazarene University giving - \$57,050 or 86.21%

District Unified giving - \$237,971 or 97.23%

Last year we reduced the percent for District giving from 9.2% to 8.5% based on our desire to allow the local church the dollars needed for local ministries. To do so and still accomplish our goals and obligations, we would need a 100% District allocation giving from every church. We desire to allow each local church to retain the needed dollars to do the work of its ministry needed to reach into its communities and, as Jesus instructed, "Make Disciples." The allocation percent for the District Unified giving will again be at 8.5% this year, but we will need your faithful giving to allow us to meet our increased budget that is designed to assist in starting and re-starting churches on the District. I believe we can meet this goal. The "Power of One" is experienced when each one does his or her part, which in turn will enable us to accomplish our goals of "Creating Communities of Hope, Help, and Healing" throughout the Rocky Mountain District.

In the area of Discipleship we recorded the following:

32 active churches

3 inactive churches (Billings Journey, Butte, and Rawlins)

New Nazarenes: 108

New Believers: 158

Baptisms: 95

Church Membership: 2,345

Morning Worship Attendance: 1,715

SDMI Attendance: 1,660

I believe we can do more than continue to lose ground or maintain. I believe we can, like David, utilize the "Power of One" with regard to "Making Disciples." Jesus' promise to His disciples is for us today as well: "Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in Me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even greater things than these, because I am going to the Father." John 14:12

One hundred people committed to the “Power of One” over 10 years, filled with God’s empowering presence and Spirit, will dramatically begin to transform our District. It begins with One. The key? What can One do? Rev. Tom Lance is going to share a testimony of Ms. Elaine Niter from the Casper Church.

One person sharing in friendship with another, and through that relationship sharing Jesus. Thus, the miracle of the “Power of One” begins.

What can One do?

1986 World Series

New York Mets vs. Boston Red Sox

The series leader was Boston, as they had won three games in the best-of-7 series, and New York had won two. It is now game six, which is a pivotal game. If Boston wins, the series is over and they become World Champions; if New York wins, they tie the series and force game seven to decide the Series Champion.

Boston gains a quick lead by scoring two runs in the first inning. The Mets refuse to let that affect their play and battle back to tie the score by the end of the fifth inning. In the seventh inning Boston regains the lead by scoring a run on an error. In the eighth inning the Mets again come back to tie the game at three runs each. The ninth inning ends with both teams tied at three runs each. Boston, in their at-bat, scores two runs in the top of the tenth inning. This seemingly guarantees them a World Championship.

The Mets begin their at-bat with the first batter hitting a routine fly to left field for out #1. The second batter also hits a routine fly to center field for out #2. One batter and one out away, even the most die-hard Mets fans begin to prepare to leave. Nearly everyone has conceded the win to Boston except for one: Gary Carter, the Mets catcher and next batter. Carter gets two quick strikes against him but refuses to quit, and battles to hit a single. The next batter, who had already left the dugout to secure a return flight home, has to be called back to the playing field for his turn at bat. Realizing Carter is on first, and catching some of his don’t-give-up attitude, this batter also hits a single. The Mets now have runners on 1st and 2nd, still two outs, but there is a spreading contagious attitude; it is an attitude of “We’ve got a chance. We can win this game; we’re not finished and the game isn’t over!”

The next batter again gets two quick strikes against him; Boston needs one strike or a routine fly or ground ball to win. Yet, the hitter refuses to give in and he, too, hits a single, which scores Gary Carter and allows the other runner to advance to 3rd.

Now the Mets are one run away from a tie game; they have runners at 3rd and 1st. The next batter, after seven pitches, has a 2-ball and 2-strike count. The 8th pitch is a wild throw which allows the runner at 3rd to score and tie the game while the runner on 1st advances to 2nd base. The game is now tied, with one out remaining, and up steps Mookie Wilson as the next Mets batter. Needless to say, the Mets are now totally caught up with the infectious attitude of “We can win this game.” Wilson hits what appears to be a routine ground ball to the veteran Boston first baseman Bill Buckner; as Buckner attempts to field the ball it takes a different bounce and rolls underneath his glove into right field while the Mets runner on second base goes home to score the winning run. The Mets, seemingly down and out from the beginning of this crucial game, come back to win game six and tie the series at three games each.

In game seven the Mets win against all odds and thus become the 1986 World Series Baseball Champions.

What can one person do? He/she can change the atmosphere from one of defeat to one of victory simply by their own attitude of “We can win.”

What can one person do in their church? One person who is committed to praying, believing, preparing their own life for God’s empowering Holy Spirit, can ignite a revival and renewal in a church.

What can one church do? One church that has people committed to be passionate witnesses for Christ in their community can inspire a District to become a passionate and committed community of churches that dares to “Create Communities of Hope, Help and Healing” through sharing the love of Jesus in their respective towns and cities.

What can one District do? One District committed to “Creating Communities of Hope, Help and Healing” can inspire a region, which can and will inspire a nation of churches and thus change our world.

It all begins with One. What can One do?

One can commit to prayer – intercessory prayer – committing to keep on praying, and seeking to be available and used by God to touch other lives.

One can have faith to believe Jesus will indeed honor His promise, “Ask in My name and in My purposes and it shall be done.” Then live and act on the basis of that faith.

One can commit to loving God with all they are (heart, mind, soul and strength) and to loving others in the same way as they have experienced the love of God.

One can commit to living and being a witness. Note this is not “doing” witnessing but being a witness. It is who and what we are called to be, not “do.”

One can consistently do acts of love, grace, and service to others in the name of Jesus.

One can determine to simply live in complete obedience and surrender to Jesus. In so doing you will be one of His change agents in this world and you will be One who helps change this world for God’s praise and glory.

2. District NMI President

Last year was the first time I had been given any leadership role in NMI. My wife and I

served twenty-eight (28) years, as missionaries, on the recipient side of what NMI did. We received the cards and gifts from LINKS churches, we visited your churches and shared our stories and were welcomed as family and were blessed with generous deputation offerings. We lived in homes built by your Alabaster funds and with the help of your Work & Witness teams who came and lightened our load. Our children carried the label MK (Missionary Kid) and we were all the focus of so many prayers from people like you who faithfully supported missions through the ministry of NMI.

Now for one year I have been trying to figure out the other side and discover how to lead our district NMI to do well at what NMI was designed. This year the effort was focused in putting information in your hands intended to empower you in your leadership role. The goal was to pass on to you helps and ideas to help equip you in your leadership role in NMI. Numerous emails were sent out that covered topics like “NMI presidents 15 point checklist, or “partnering with your pastor to expand mission vision”, or “How to work with your pastor,” or “Preparing for a missionary”. I hope you found at least one item that helped make you more successful in your NMI task.

The council has attempted to keep you informed in areas such as Alabaster, NCM, Prayer, mission education, mission call, LINKS, W&W and more. I asked the council to start thinking with me of ways in which we can connect mission with a younger generation. This will be an ongoing effort as we must find ways to capture the hearts, minds, passion and energy of our children, youth and young adults.

There was great response from most all churches willing to schedule deputation services with either the Cyrs’ or Chapmans’. I hope the email “Preparing for a missionary” gave you some new thoughts on what to do and how to prepare for when they come to your church.

I have had an ongoing concern that not every NMI president has received the numerous emails that have gone out. One of the great hazards of email is the inability to know for sure if someone receives and reads the information sent. I apologize if you felt you were overlooked and somehow did not hear from me or the council this year. I hope we can improve our communication and verify each president's email address or if desired postal address so that no one is left out. Please be sure to confirm your contact information with the NMI secretary before you leave.

Thank you NMI presidents, local councils and pastors for the efforts you put forth to make missions a priority.

When the call went out on a short notice asking for volunteers to go on a W&W trip to the Philippines, 6 people responded, 3 from our district and 3 from Word of Life Church in Billings. When you were asked to give for the Philippine Typhoon Disaster response W&W team, the response was incredible. The district NMI allocated \$5000 from the NMI account. This was your money that you gave in the past to be spent on missions. We spent it. Churches on the district also contributed another \$10,365. Donations from off of the district, by friends, and family, as well as funds contributed by team members for their portion amounted to \$9575.00. This brought the total of funds raised for this W&W trip to \$24,940.00. After the cost of fare, food and lodging was deducted, \$10,649.00 was left in the Philippines for building materials and a concrete mixer. The church in Balagiga thanks you.

Let's look to the future. I want to partner with you around two goals for NMI during this next year. This does not replace the outlined ministry focus clearly outlined for NMI. These goals are companions to all that NMI works for. I hope you will adopt them as yours.

1. Capture a younger generations heart, mind, passion and energy for missions by focusing

on Children and youth involvement in mission. By intention think creatively on how to incorporate mission into every aspect of children and youth ministry via SDMI and NYI. Find ways to think outside the NMI silo and partner with SDMI and NYI in mission. If we wait until our young become adults and then try to challenge them to mission, we have missed our greatest opportunity to impact them for the greatest adventure of their life.

Many of us began our spiritual journey as child or a teen. Now, for many, the hair has turned gray and person we see in the mirror looks more like our parent or grandparent. NMI must capture the hearts of our young now if we expect them to be passionate about mission when their turn arrives to replace us.

I am a product of a missionally minded church. I grew up thinking missionally through what we did in our children and teen ministry. Maybe you are too. However, are our children, youth and young adults embracing a passion for mission through what they see in us? Let's make a change this year on how we think and approach involving our young in NMI.

In the Jewish tradition, a young man would have received the basic training to begin following a rabbi sometime after he turned 12. Most probably before he turned 20. Some would argue that many of the disciples were teens when they began to follow Jesus. Mary the mother of Jesus, most agree, was probably a young teen.

Some of the patriarchs of the faith became God followers early, such as Samuel. The kingdom of God is given into the hands of the young too. We must not deprive them of their obligation as Christians to understand and be involved in the Great Commission. The great commission is for every generation. If they are Christians then they have a responsibility of obedience to the command of Christ to go and make disciples as do all Christians. Missions must be more than a Christian National Geographic moment or a benign and senseless story time. We must do our part in capturing their heart for the task God is calling them toward. We too must capitalize on the strength and passion youth bring to the church. There is something in youth that desires doing something heroic and to be able to give their lives to something worthy of who they are. The mission of Christ is the best chance for them to find fulfillment in their obedience.

Think, pray and ask God to show you ways in which you can make missions be real and alive for our young.

I told our youth leader that I think that a rock-a-thon is unacceptable for our youth. It communicates that trivia and laziness are acceptable for those who are following the one who said to follow him to the cross.

However, a work-a-thon at widow Smiths house is a valuable mission and an excellent means to train our children and youth for being adults with a mission. Teach them early that being on a mission for God is a cause worthy of who they are.

This year let's rethink what role our children, youth and young adults are playing in missions. The cost of waiting until they are old is too great to pay.

Tony Campolo says that "Youth despise a church that seeks only to entertain them." This year I want to partner with you to emphasize missions for children. Janet Carr has generously agreed to head up children's missions on the Rocky Mountain District.

At the recent general assembly I met with the Fiji District Superintendent. He told me they now had 88 churches. These churches sprang from the first 5 churches that were started the first year after we arrived in Fiji. Those five churches sprang from the first church we started in our home. That church grew around people like Sandia, who came to Christ because...(tell story), Ashika, Roko, Mala, Akesa and Tomasi, Lote, James and Darrell... They believed in missions.

Introduce Martella and her mission project.

If you're passionate about missions so too will be your children.

2. Aiming for 100% participation in mission giving.

A recent report on American's charitable giving indicated that although Americans were very generous last year, giving for religious causes was down 1.6 percent. World Mission Division Director Vern Ward said, "In Asia, there are over 100 cities of over 1 million people that have a Christian population of less than 3%. Of the approximately 2.5 billion people in Asia, less than 5% are Christian. He said he could deploy 100 missionary couples today, one in each of those cities if he had the financial resources to do so." The need for full participation in giving could not be greater than it is now. What difference could it make in our giving if we raised the bar of expectation and participation in giving for missions. I am not unaware of the multitude of financial demands that your church wrestles with every week. I know that the last thing you want to be asked is to take another offering. I know you have to prioritize and make a choice on whether or not you promote yet another offering. However, if and when a cause strikes you as worthy, aim for 100% participation in giving. John Wesley said that no one is too poor to give a penny. If people don't contribute a penny then it is not a financial problem, it is an attitude problem or they haven't been convinced that it's worth a penny.

My challenge for you this year is if a request comes your way for mission giving and you don't believe in it, tell me. If you do believe in it, send in at least a penny. Is your giving worth it?

On January 8, 2007, a Nazarene missionary was the first missionary and first white man to put foot on the land of the Talasea, a tribal people on the island of West New Britain Papua New Guinea. These were a people who for unremembered generations had fought with their neighbors and were known as a warring and murderous tribe. Because you and others like you supported missions through giving, this Nazarene missionary had the opportunity to represent Christ to these people and saw the first of their tribe, Joseph, kneel before the savior and experience what it means to be born again. Lives of others were changed and the church of the Nazarene was established amongst the people of the Talasea.

You went to work and earned you pay by the sweat of your brow and when the opportunity to give to missions came, you gave. In doing so, this missionary was there to represent you and Jesus Christ. This missionary was there because you gave to missions. Was your giving worth it? If you ask Joseph and the others of the Talasea, I am sure each one would say "thanks" for sending your missionary to us. Our lives are now at peace because we heard the story of Jesus.

This video clip was filmed one year later. Watch this and then tell me whether or not your giving was important. (show video).

Was your sacrifice in giving worth it? I know it was because I was that missionary. How many more are waiting for a missionary to come with the story of Jesus? They will continue to wait for us. How long depends on how successful we are in developing an atmosphere of giving where 100% participation is the norm. They wait for us to be faithful. Don't you agree that everyone in your church should share the joy in knowing that because they gave, missionaries were sent and lives were changed.

I believe 100% participation is a reachable and worthy goal for our church. Lets do it. This year let's focus on our children and everybody being involved in giving for missions.

To say that this year has been a year of transition for our district SDMI leadership would be an understatement. We elected a new chairman last year, and late this fall he moved off district. It is our desire to build on that discussion and greatly increase the return on investment for each local church. Our mission must drive our activity, and our mission is clear—we must *be* disciples of Jesus and *make* disciples of Jesus. We are aware that the local church is the connection point between those interested in following Jesus and those capable of guiding them in that adventure. Therefore, it is with a great sense of stewardship and accountability to the local church by which we minister together on this district.

4. District NYI President

Rocky Mountain District Friends,

It has been another busy, but great year of ministering to and with teens here in Montana and Wyoming.

Our events for the last year began even as the new year was kicking off. While District Assembly was taking place on the weekend of July 12, 2013, Ben Finch was leading a small group from our district to participate in a 10-day mission trip to Baja, Mexico. On the trip, our group helped build a house, led VBS, and participated in street evangelism. Everyone who went on the trip returned with lives changed and eager to return.

SuperCamp 2013 was held, once again, at Yellowstone Alliance Adventures outside of Bozeman. Our speaker was Carly Bartlett of Woods End Ministries, and Woods End also led the music. We had a significant price increase (from \$190 per student to \$225 per student), but our attendance stayed about the same. We dropped from 135 campers in 2012 to 130 in 2013. The price increase allowed us for the first time in several years to stay in budget.

In October 2013, we had six teens and two adults participate in The Call Conference. This is a conference that takes place every fall on the campus of Northwest Nazarene University, and it is put on by the Northwest Field NYI Council in conjunction with NNU's Religion Department. It is for juniors and seniors in high school, and it is designed to help them determine God's call on their lives. This year our district had the most participants in this conference that we have ever had.

The Bible Quiz season also began with holding tournaments in October, and these continued on through REJOICE in March. RMD NYI Bible Quizzing Ministry is currently under the direction of Ben Finch, our District Quiz Director.

Our annual youth conference, REJOICE, was held in Billings, MT March 14-16, 2014, with the District Bible Quiz Tournament beginning the evening before. Our speaker this year was Tom Henderson of Restoration Generation. We had 174 students in attendance at REJOICE this year.

It has been an honor to have served this first year in the capacity of District NYI President of the Rocky Mountain District. I look forward to seeing how God will use us and how lives will be changed this next year!

1. Finance

Finance Committee

The Committee on Finance submits the following recommendations:

1. Our people use the Scriptural method of church finance: the faithful giving of tithes and offerings (Malachi 3:10).

2. Each pastor/church accept their allocations as a fair share of the total church program. Recognizing it is the responsibility of pastors and congregations to support our denominational ministries, we recommend they develop and work a systematic weekly or monthly plan to fully fund their allocations.

3. Our churches consider benevolent gifts to other churches on the Rocky Mountain District who might need assistance in meeting in their allocation responsibilities (Romans 12:1; Acts 20:35).

4. That allocations accepted by the district assembly be as follows:

- a. World Evangelism Fund is 5.5% of church income.
- b. Education is 2.25% of church income.
- c. Pensions and Benefits is 2.25% of church income.
- d. Rocky Mountain District is 8.5% of church income.

Allocations are percentages of current year church income. Churches report income and calculate allocations for payment at the www.fundingthemission.org website.

5. Each local church fund each allocation proportionately as they are able with a goal of fully funding the mission of the general and district Church of the Nazarene. We recommend that payments be made due by the 21st of each month on the previous month's income. Local churches may apply to the District Superintendent and DAB for a one time exemption from the Rocky Mountain District allocation on special gifts for capital improvements or developmental projects.

7. The total District Budget of \$2449,722.00 will be allocated as above, subject to the receipt of allocation payments.

9. Travel expense reimbursement for authorized district business by board members and officers be set at 50% of the IRS allowable published mileage rate regardless of mode of travel, plus other approved expenses.

10. The local church set aside funds to assist its pastor(s) and department heads in attending the General Assembly.

11. In light of the inflationary cost of living that all salaries be reviewed as per current *Manual* paragraph 129.8. March is the suggested month for this annual review. It is further recommended that an annual cost of living increase based upon the consumer price index be the minimum increase for both the local pastor(s) and the district employees.

12. Every pastor be given a paid vacation each year, the terms to be determined after a consultation of the pastor with the church board; that this vacation policy be established in the written understanding between that pastor and the board. It is further recommended that the following formula be used as a minimum guideline based on years of ministerial service to the Church of the Nazarene as credited by the Pensions and Benefits Department:

1- 3 years	2 weeks
4-10 years	3 weeks
11-20 years	4 weeks
20+ years	5 weeks

A policy on accumulation of vacation benefits will be developed at the beginning of each written understanding. The absence of such a policy expressly implies no accumulation will occur from year to year. Church activities whether local, district or general, are not to be counted as vacation time. We strongly urge pastors and the district superintendent to take one day a week away from church duties, and to take vacation time based on the above formula.

13. Each individual church should report on a regular basis their allocation payment progress to their congregation.

14. The District Auxiliary Budgets are to be set as requested by the District SDMI, District NYI, and District NMI respectively.

Financial reports for each month, including a detailed balance sheet and budget-versus-actual report, will be sent to the District Finance Committee chairman by the 10th of the following month. Forms for these reports will be provided by the Finance Committee. The Committee chairperson will forward these reports to the District Office each month.

15. Every church subscribe to *Church Law and Tax Report*, a bimonthly newsletter, and purchase the annual edition of the *Church and Clergy Tax Guide*. These may be purchased from: Church Ministries Resources, P.O. Box 1098, Matthew, NC 28106. *Compensation for Church Staff* by Cobble and Hammer (*Christianity Today International*, Resource Dept., 465 Gunderson Dr., Carol Stream, IL 60188) is highly recommended as well.

16. In view of the retirement needs of pastors, each church is encouraged to contribute to its pastor's tax-sheltered annuity as provided by the Pensions and Benefits Department (www.pbusa.org).

17. In view of the complexity of ministry in our day and desiring to invest in both the clergy and the local church, and in light of the historic wisdom of the general assembly of the Church of the Nazarene, it is heartily recommended that every local church follow the provision of paragraph 129.10 of the *Manual*:

“In order to encourage a healthy pastoral ministry and the lifelong learning of the pastor, the church board, in consultation with the district superintendent, should provide a sabbatical leave for the pastor following each seven consecutive years of service in one congregation. The timing and duration of the sabbatical shall be determined in consultation with the pastor, church board and district superintendent. It is strongly urged that the pastor's salary continue in full and the church board provide for pulpit supply during the sabbatical period.” (*Manual 2009-2013*).

18. As established by the District Advisory Board, the local church financial year is May 1 through April 30. To receive credit for allocations paid, all payments must be received by the district treasurers no later than May 15 following the close of the local church financial year.

19. The district superintendent, NMI, SDMI and NYI must submit their annual operational budget requests to the District Finance Committee chairperson no later than two weeks before the Pre-Assembly Finance Committee meeting.

20. Operational budget expense items D-100, D-200, D-300, D-310, D-330, and D-600 are the district superintendent's salary and benefit package and may be allocated between those items as necessary by mutual agreement between the district superintendent and the District Advisory Board.

21. Operational budget items D-610 and D-630 are to be reimbursed at actual or IRS allowable cost based on an accountable reimbursement policy as set forth by the IRS and established by the District Advisory Board.

22. Since an operating budget is essential to good church financial management, it is imperative that every local church annually adopt an operational budget with these considerations:

- a. A systematic plan for paying allocations
- b. Feasibility of the adoption of Faith Promise giving
- c. An adequate salary for all paid staff
- d. Keeping local bills paid to date
- e. Maintaining their property in good condition
- f. Financing outreach ministries

23. It is required that pastors and church boards give careful attention each year to the filing of non-profit corporation registration with the secretary of state. All state nonprofit corporation requirements must be met. Confirmation of this is to be forwarded to the district office.

24. It is required that each church carry a multi-peril insurance policy. Said policy needs to be reviewed in light of the potential local liability with consideration given to the limits that are carried. Confirmation of this policy being in force is to be forwarded to the district office annually. It is strongly recommended that directors' and officers' liability and malpractice insurance also be considered.

25. This Finance Committee report shall be presented to the local church board at its first meeting, or as soon as practical, following the district assembly.

26. We encourage every church to utilize The Church of the Nazarene Foundation to facilitate planned and deferred gifts from their members to any Nazarene ministry, including gifts to the local church, and to use the Foundation to manage investment accounts, endowments, and charitable trusts. Visit www.nazarenefoundation.org or call 866-273-2549 to contact the Foundation.

27. Allocation payments are to be sent to the following treasurers:

c. Education—**Payable to: Northwest Nazarene University.** Send to Office of University Advancement, Northwest Nazarene University, 623 S. University Blvd., Nampa, ID 83686

Friday Morning, June 27, 2014

Congregational singing led by Rev. Larry Spicer.

9:14 AM - Prayer by Rev. James Johnson.

We had one young person from Libby, Hannah, that has expressed her desire to become a missionary. Rev. Johnson asked Evelyn Mewes, retired missionary, to come and pray over and for Hannah.

Our special missionary guests are Rev. Kevin, Regional Finance Coordinator for the Asia Pacific Region, and his wife Joan, missionaries to Singapore.

Singapore is an island that is its own city, state, and country. What the people there want most is harmony and peace. The problem is that harmony and peace keep us from telling others about Jesus. There are many people groups in Singapore. There are Buddhists who are of Chinese decent. They are mostly a modern people with a few traditionalists. Next are the Indian people who are guards. They are mostly practicing Hindus. The Malay people are Muslims. The question to ask is “Who is my neighbor”? Rev. Kevin reviewed the story of the Good Samaritan. The answer to the question is “The one who showed him mercy”.

There are eight holidays celebrated in Singapore. The goal is to not leave out any of the religions. Everyone celebrates each holiday. We divide the world by religion, and geography. How does God divide it...by buckets. There are two buckets, one is reached people and the other is unreached people.

Rev. Kevin and Joan demonstrated “who is my neighbor” by a group participation event. The “Reached” people include active Christians, nominal Christians, and non-Christians who are within reach of a church or place where they can hear the gospel. Then there are the “Unreached” people. These include atheists and Chinese, Muslims, Hindus, Buddhist monks, and Tribal groups. Missionaries go to the reached and the unreached and they come from all over. The better question is not “Who is my neighbor?”, but “Where is my neighbor”?

Our offering this morning will go toward Emergent Young Leader Development. Raised today was \$1827.50.

Rev. Eric Oguda, District Superintendent from Tanzania, gave a brief report of what was happening there. He expressed gratitude for the Work and Witness team that came. They are hoping to complete a Child Development Center.

Thanks was given to our 2013-14 NMI council.

Mission packets were reviewed with instructions for the NPH order forms.

10:51 a.m. Rev. Bill Carr called the 87th NMI Rocky Mountain District Convention, 2014 to order. Convention time and parameters were set. Motion made and seconded to accept the treasurer's report. Adopted.

Child Sponsorship by Sheryll Hampton.

1:10 - Morning session dismissed. Convention to resume at 1:30 p.m.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON

Convention resumed at 1:41 p.m.

Trista Roberts, Mission Call Coordinator, gave highlights of her report. The written report is in the missions packet.

A Work and Witness report from the trip to the Philippines was given by Rev. James Johnson and Johnny Kinosky.

Johnny Kinosky challenged us with an offering match. He will match dollar for dollar our offering up to \$5,000 for further work in the Philippines. The deadline will be July 27th. The goal is 100% participation from each church no matter the size of the offering. Offering taken for the matching fund. Offering received \$895.34.

A report from the Sun Valley Indian School was given by August Ketterling who has been with the school for six years.

Rev. Johnson showed a video that gave descriptions of the mission books for this year.

Rev. Kevin hosted the first round table discussion. We need to keep people in the field. When a budget cut occurs, some missionaries have to go home. Other ways missionaries can go is to raise their own support. We still need more, not less! We have a political aspect to consider. How to get them in? Work, universities (students), compassionate ministries. Who else can come? Build relationships, communicate through the internet, smart phones, cell phones.

The 100th Anniversary Project was presented by Dr. Beck Morsch of Nazarene Compassionate Ministries, Inc. She served in Papua New Guinea for 11 years as a nurse. The emphasis of the project is community based health care. This would support traveling nurses in

rural areas and they in turn would train the villagers so they could help themselves. The approach would be holistic in nature. The needs of the people would be met on practical health, spiritual, mental, physical and relational levels. The goal of the Rocky Mountain District is to get the information to the churches that we would like to raise \$10,000 this year for the project. The council recommends that each church set their own goal, basing the goal on the number of people it has, at \$10 per person. We are asking each one to think outside the box and if they cannot reach the \$10 goal, at least participate. We would like to see 100% participation.

Rev. Bill Sunberg, missionary in Toronto, Canada, presented the second workshop. He asked us to consider that anywhere we meet the Holy Spirit and he meets us is Holy Ground. He reviewed with us the story of the lame man and his four friends that lowered him through a roof so he could be healed by Jesus. The relative lesson has to do with:

1. The Kingdom is a “hole in the roof”. The priority is on others. Thinking about their friend that would never get to see Jesus if they didn’t help.

2. You need to go where the people are.

3. Recognize that missions and ministry is messy. That hole in the roof made a mess.

NOTE: You will have people that complain! If you stop at the mess, you miss what God’s doing.

4. It’s all about being relational.

Ideas for outreach in our cities. Find out which countries are represented. Make a friend of one of them. Send that friend back as a missionary. It could get messy. They are NOT going to come to your church. You will have to go to them. It takes time!

Remember, missions isn’t a program, it’s a passion of the heart.

1. Nature of Activities and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The Rocky Mountain District Church of the Nazarene is an entity made up of interdependent local churches throughout Montana and Wyoming organized to facilitate the mission of each local church through mutual support, the sharing of resources, and collaboration.

The majority of revenue comes from local churches who give a predetermined percentage of funds to the Rocky Mountain District. This percentage is voted on yearly at the District Assembly by delegates from each church. The churches are expected to fund its allocation with a goal of fully funding the mission of the District Church of the Nazarene.

This summary of significant accounting policies of The Rocky Mountain District Church of the Nazarene is presented to assist in understanding the District's financial statements. The financial statements and notes are representations of the District's management, which is responsible for their integrity and objectivity.

Basis of Accounting - The District's policy is to prepare its financial statements on the modified cash basis of accounting; consequently, revenues are recognized when received rather

than when promised or earned, and certain expenses and purchases of assets are recognized when cash is disbursed rather than when the obligation is incurred.

Property and equipment – The District capitalizes property and equipment with a cost or fair value at date of receipt of \$250 or more and an estimated useful life greater than one year.

Property and equipment have been capitalized at cost if purchased, or at fair market value if donated. Depreciation is provided using the straight-line method over the following estimated useful lives:

- Buildings and improvements 15 - 31.5 years
- Automobiles 5 years
- Office equipment 7 years
- Land improvements 15 years

Income taxes – Rocky Mountain District Church of the Nazarene is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Service Code Section 501(c)(3), and is treated as a publicly supported charitable organization.

Tax penalties and interest, if any, would be classified with income tax expense in the financial statements. No tax penalties or interest have been incurred or are recognized in the financial statements. Generally, three tax years remain subject to examination by tax jurisdictions.

Estimates - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with the modified cash basis of accounting requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

Subsequent events – Management has evaluated subsequent events through the date the financial statements were available for issuance, which is the same date as the independent accountants' review report.

2. Investments

Investments are composed of cash, certificates of deposits, and mutual funds and are stated at fair value.

Management is in the process of refinancing this note. They intend to refinance the note for an additional three years and at an interest rate of 4.9% with a balloon payment due in 2017.

Management expects to have the refinancing completed by August 1, 2014.

4. Restricted Fund Balance

Restricted net assets of \$2,709.08 represents assets held for future use.

5. Operating Lease – Lessor

The Church rents out the District Center in Billings, MT. During the year ended May 31, 2014, the Church leased the District Center on a three-year lease requiring rental payments of \$5,000 per month the first year; \$6,000 per month the second year; and \$7,000 per month the third year. The lease also provides an option to purchase the property/first right of refusal for \$1,200,000.
