INTRODUCTION TO MTFOA HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL OFFICIATING

You must accept constructive feedback from your trainer and mentors.

You must deal with criticism from everyone.

All this and more provides you with the opportunity to learn who you are, how you deal with pressure, and how you learn new things.

You'll also discover how you handle mistakes. While being a high school football official, you will make mistakes and some of them will be very big mistakes.

After making one, will you go into the tank (as we like to say), or will you forget about it and continue officiating like nothing happened?
