

Opening Hours 10am to 5pm, Wednesday to Sunday from March until October. We are open every day during Sussex school holidays. Please see our calendar of opening dates (on reverse).

Catering Our Limeburners Cafe serves hot and cold food, with outdoor picnic areas available around the site.

Education We offer workshops and talks to educational groups on topics including transport and inventions for all ages/key stages. Email education@amberleymuseum.co.uk.

Membership Join as an annual member for entry to the Museum (except evening events, Ale Festivals and Christmas events) also receive discounts in the shop and Cafe. If you join on the day of your visit we will refund your standard day admission.

Accessibility We are accessibility friendly with mainly flat surfaces and some gravel paths. With free wheelchair hire (subject to availability, please enquire in advance). We also have designated disabled parking in our car park, and disabled facilities available.


Amberley Museum is an independent Museum and a Registered Charity that doesn't receive Government or Local Authority funding, so we depend heavily upon donations.



Amberley Museum was established in 1979, and seeks to reflect the industrial and transport heritage of Sussex. The Museum is not set in a particular period of time, but allows you to explore exhibits from around 150 years ago up to the present day.

The site of the Museum was once a large and busy chalk quarry and limeworks, and its buildings and kilns are now preserved alongside buildings that were rescued from other locations, and erected within the Museum to house and display our exhibits.



Covering 36 acres with over 40 exhibits, the Museum is home to a unique collection of listed buildings and scheduled ancient monuments, many of which were rescued from the Sussex area.

Amberley Museum resides in the heart of the South Downs National Park with outstanding wildlife and nature trails which provide the perfect setting for walks and picnics.

Please note the Hillside Trail is very steep in places and not recommended for pushchairs. In bad weather it may be closed for safety reasons.

Visit the De Witt Kilns and quarry buildings and see the 'Life and Lime at Amberley' exhibition to discover more about working life at the chalk pits.



The narrow gauge railway and bus services provide free transport to explore the site, offering many opportunities to get up close to commercial vehicles, rail and road steam engines. We aim to have both the train and bus running every day we are open but due to the age of the vehicles this is not always possible.

Age old skills are kept alive by craftspeople and volunteers working to traditional methods. Meet the woodturners, wheelwrights, potters, blacksmith, printers and greenwood workers. We aim to have at least three crafts demonstrated each day we are open, but this is dependent on the schedules of the independent craftspeople. If there is a particular craft you would like to see, please contact the Museum Office in advance of your visit.

Amberley Museum is a registered charity, and we aim to preserve the Museum and the heritage it contains for future generations. We are always looking into ways to help fundraise and support the Museum.
