COST OF TREATMENT

The cost of all services rendered will be based on a sliding fee scale in accordance with the current resident income eligibility criteria. A co-payment is expected from all residents who have an ability to pay. We will accept third party payers and/or insurance.

NO ONE IS DENIED SERVICES DUE TO HAVING AN INABILITY TO PAY.

Admission Policy

All residents will be accepted or denied admission to this level of care based on the utilization of the established ASAM Patient Placement Criteria, LEVEL III.I.

Prior to admission a biopsychosocial assessment is conducted to ascertain the resident's current functioning level. This evaluation includes physical, medical, psychological, emotional, behavioral, nutritional, and environmental factors.

This initial assessment is the first part of an ongoing process that is continuously updated to ensure that our residents will receive the most appropriate placement through the continuation of care and / or a referral to a more beneficial level of care.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Residents must be 18 years old.
Residents must meet DSM IV criteria for substance abuse / dependence.

Residents must be assessed as being at minimal risk of severe withdrawal syndrome from alcohol and / or drugs.

Resident must be medically stable.
Resident must be psychologically and emotionally stable in order to permit successful participation in treatment.
Resident must demonstrate sufficient cooperation and motivation to be able to respond to treatment at this level of care.
