Instructor bio: Debbie Peck has been a SFRT Instructor since 1979. She teaches the EMT class for SFRT Area 1. Debbie has been a member of Lone Oak Fire Department for 41 years and was promoted to Assistant Chief in June of 2018.

F001 Fire Investigation for the First Responder (NFA) Saturday & Sunday

This is the National Fire Academy's basic level fire investigation course. The classroom delivery will cover many phases of initial fire scene investigation with emphasis on the firefighter's responsibility in arson detection. This course satisfies the requirement for FRS 2074 in the KCTCS AAS Fire/Rescue Technology Degree Program. Students should be prepared to take an exam at the conclusion of the course.

Instructor: Rusty Todd, Area 5 State Fire/Rescue Training

Instructor Bio: Rusty Todd has instructed for SFRT since 1985 and currently serves as the Training Coordinator in Area 5 – Elizabethtown. He spent 14 years in the volunteer fire service and 27 years with the City of Elizabethtown Fire Department, ending his career as their Chief Fire Inspector and lead Fire Investigator. He is a Certified Fire Investigator through the International Association of Arson Investigators, and a Certified Fire Protection Specialist through the National Fire Protection Association. He has a Bachelor of Science degree in Fire & Safety Engineering Technology from the University of Cincinnati.

F003 Real World Fireground Strategy & Tactics for Smaller Fire Departments Saturday

One of the biggest mistakes made by smaller fire departments is trying to operate like their colleagues in the "Big City" departments, in spite of the fact that they don't possess the manpower and resources that their larger counterparts have at their disposal. This class will begin with an overview of basic Size-Up considerations and standard Fireground strategic priorities and tactical objectives. Then we will discuss these tactical operations given the limited manpower and resources common to smaller fire departments. Lastly the class participants will proceed to a designated location for some scenario-based training evolutions to apply the strategic goals and tactical objectives discussed in the classroom.

Instructor: Nick Morgan

Instructor bio: Nick Morgan is a Captain with the St Louis Fire Department, a 36-year veteran of the Fire Service, and has previously served as a volunteer firefighter, and an Aircraft/Structural Firefighter for the US Air Force. He is also a certified Fire Instructor II, Fire Officer II, Pumping and Aerial Apparatus Operator, and Fire Investigator through the Missouri Division of Fire Safety.

F004 Basic Search & Rescue (BSAR)

Saturday & Sunday

This course is designed to provide guidance to SAR field responders on best practices and techniques. Information about the duties and tasks of SAR field responders, current information on SAR field responder clothing and equipment as well as details on the latest search techniques, information on SAR specialties such as hasty search, grid search, utilizing specialty teams, subject packaging, and transport. There will be an afternoon search all students must have sturdy shoes (no tennis shoes) and are asked to dress appropriately for the weather. If you have a SAR pack, please bring it for the exercise.

This course is open to all Emergency Management, Rescue, Fire, Emergency Medical, and Law Enforcement personnel or any organization having responsibility for searching for missing or lost persons. You must be at least 18 years old to register for this course.

Registration for this course must be done by following the link to www.kyem.ky.gov/training and click on register. You must also fill out the JPFA registration form and mail to the Area 1 office. You are considered accepted as a student in this class upon receipt of your application so you will not receive a letter acknowledging that acceptance.

Instructor: J L Atwill, KY Emergency Management

In this class, students will learn to recognize the hazards associated with vehicles such as bumpers, drive shafts, passive restraint detonation systems, and various kinds of fuel systems. Identification of scene safety concerns, engine placement, and recognizing the challenges of compartment forcible entry to affect extinguishment are discussed. The class also covers line selection and operation, assembly and utilization of a foam stream. Methods to gain entry to engine compartments and trunks for more rapid-fire suppression are also presented. Students will be presented classroom information during the morning and in the afternoon, they will practice Hands-on activitie3s with the Fireblast Car prop and fight a simulated vehicle fire. Students must bring PPE, a full SCBA and spare cylinder. PPE will have to be within the 10-year life span and in good shape.

Instructor: State Fire/Rescue Training

F006 Basic Chaplain

Saturday

The Basic Chaplain Course includes course materials to teach the layperson/pastors skills to assist fire departments in times of spiritual and emotional trauma and/or crisis. Topics included are roles of fire chaplains, how to minister to firefighters, how to minister to fire victims, critical incident stress, fire department funerals, basic fire chaplain operations, etc. Materials are adapted from Federation of Fire Chaplains, Inc. to be taught at Kentucky Fire Schools through the Kentucky Federation of Fire Chaplains, Inc, an administrative fire department under the Kentucky Fire Commission. This course fulfills partial requirement for state fire chaplain certification.

Instructor: Rev. Rebecca E. Brown, President & Chief of the Kentucky Federation of Fire Chaplains

Instructor Bio: Rev. Rebecca E. Brown is President and Chief of the Kentucky Federation of Fire Chaplains, Inc., which is an administrative fire department based out of Louisville, Kentucky. She serves as a chaplain for AMR Louisville Ambulance Service in Louisville, Kentucky. Rebecca has had training with the International Conference of Police Chaplains and the Federation of Fire Chaplains as well as law enforcement training at the FBI headquarters in Louisville, Kentucky. On November 18, 2018, Rebecca became an endorsed chaplain through the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship. Rebecca currently holds a Master of Divinity Degree with concentration in Pastoral Care and Counseling from Baptist Seminary of Kentucky, Georgetown, Kentucky. She is currently working on her Doctor of Ministry Degree with concentration in Pastoral Care and Counseling with Gardner-Webb University in Boiling Springs, North Carolina. Rebecca has worked as a hospital chaplain at Hardin Memorial Hospital, Elizabethtown, Ky for five years. Rebecca, also, serves on the Board for Kentucky EMS Memorial Foundation, Inc., which is currently working on establishing a memorial for Line of Duty Deaths in Kentucky. Rebecca is currently employed by

AMR Louisville Ambulance Service as an Advanced EMT and American Red Cross as a First Aid Service Team member.

F007 Drivers Training

Saturday & Sunday

This is a 16-hour class including a cone course and classroom instruction. Classroom will cover safe driving practices and KY KRS and how this affects the First Responder. Students will drive a vehicle in a cone course. POV's may be utilized for the driving course. Students will have to possess a valid Divers License the day the course is challenged.

Instructor: David White, Area 1 State Fire/Rescue Training

Instructor Bio: David has been a LT. Paramedic at Mayfield FD since 2012. He has worked as an SFRT Area 1Instructor since 2017. He started in the Fire Service 17 years ago. David is also an Industrial/Marine Instructor for the Industrial program at Area 1 SFRT.

F008 Farm Rescue

Sunday

This course is designed to help the Firefighter/Rescuer understand responding to Farm Emergencies. This course is designed to familiarize firefighters with special techniques required to successfully coordinate and execute an agricultural rescue. Topics include Rural vs. Urban Farm Accidents, common types of farm accidents & special challenges, understanding farm equipment mechanics, special situations when responding, extrication and disentanglement techniques & management of farm related incidents.

Full protective clothing required with safety glasses or goggles.

Instructor: Dale Dobson, Kentucky Department of Agriculture- Safety Administrator

Instructor Bio:

- Grew up a grain, hogs, dairy and tobacco farmer
- Became a volunteer firefighter in 1989 to help his community
 - -Started seeing deaths and accidents and injuries from a different point of view
 - Created and hosted the first ever farm safety program on his farm in 1994
 - -Started growing and it eventually became a state-wide program
- Started working for the Kentucky Department of Agriculture in 1998
- Still farms today working with grain and beef in Hodgenville, KY
- Married with two kids, five grandkids
- Has a passion for safety, enjoys traveling the country, and over the past 30 years has seen agriculture progress and make safety a top priority
- Life is good

F009 Grain Bin Rescue

Saturday

This class will focus on safety in & around grain bins for farmers, and also cover grain Bing rescue for emergency personnel.

Helmet, gloves, long sleeves/pants & boots are required.

Instructor: Dale Dobson, Kentucky Department of Agriculture-Safety Administrator.

F010 Firefighter Survival

Saturday

This course was developed to train firefighters on how to use tools and techniques to assist in self-rescue when the primary escape route is blocked, and the situation is rapidly deteriorating.

Turnout Gear and SCBA Required

FC1000 - 8 hours

Instructor: Brent Francis, Chief of Princeton Fire Department

Instructor Bio: Brent is currently Fire/Rescue Chief of the Princeton Fire Department and the Caldwell County Fire Department. He has served forty-two years in the fire service, 8 years as Firefighter, 4 years as Asst. Chief, 30 years to current as Fire Chief covering the City of Princeton KY and all of the unincorporated area of Caldwell County, 348 square miles serving 12,900 population. He has been an Instructor with Area 2 S.F.R.T. for 22 years. He is the Past President and hosting county of Hazmat-2, 9 county regional Haz-Mat WMD Response Team. He is a current member of the KY 911 Advisory Council representing KY Firefighters. Brent is also the past 1st Congressional District Representative to the KY Association of Fire Chiefs.

F011 Firefighter Rescue

Sunday

This course will concentrate on safely removing a trapped or unconscious firefighter. The student will also review the OSHA requirement of the 2 in 2 out rule and how to set up a rapid intervention team in their own department.

Turnout Gear and SCBA required

FC20000 – 8 hours

Instructor: Brent Francis, Chief of Princeton Fire Department

This course is designed to provide the fire service with a safe and secure method of flashover training. Firefighters are taught to recognize the signs of flashover and provided techniques of possibly escaping impending flashover with the goal of saving firefighters from injury or death.

FC40000 - 8 hours

Turnout gear and SCBA required

Prerequisites: You must be at least 18 years of age and a member of a Fire Department or an Industrial Fire Brigade recognized by the Kentucky Fire Commission to participate in LIVE FIRE delivered by State Fire Rescue Training. All Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) of the above referenced student is less than ten (10) years from the date of manufacture. Any student with facial hair that impedes the seal of the face piece will not be allowed to participate in accordance with NFPA Standards.

The student should be proficient in the following subjects to participate in the class:

- Safety
- Fire Behavior
- Portable Extinguishers
- Personal Protective Equipment
- Ladders
- Overhaul
- Water Supply
- Ventilation
- Forcible Entry
- Building Construction
- Fire hose, appliances, & streams

A form will be emailed to the student upon registration that will need to be signed by the Chief of the fire department being represented and will need to be sent back in or brought to class. Please provide a valid email address when registering for the class. If the student does not have this form, they will not be able to participate in the class.

Instructors: Area 3 State Fire/Rescue Training

F013 Hands on Firefighter class

This Class will be an 8-hour class focusing on the hands-on skills of Forcible Entry, Ceiling and Wall Breach, and Ventilation.

Instructor: Clint Hudson, Area 1 State Fire/Rescue Training

Instructor Bio: Clint Hudson has been in emergency services for 22 years serving as a firefighter and paramedic. He currently serves as the training officer and lieutenant for the Grand Lakes Fire Department. After years spent working as an EMT both in Paducah and Livingston County, he recently went to work for Healthworks Medical as an industrial paramedic located at the paper mill in Wickliffe. By taking advantage of the Kentucky Fire Commission's free instructor 1 and instructor 2 class he was able to obtain his IFSAC credentialing and go to work for State Fire Rescue Training.

F014 ICS 300

Friday, Saturday & Sunday

This class is intended to serve as a vehicle to share proven incident management strategies and practices as well as to enhance teamwork and coordination among the agency's mid-level managers and command staff directly responsible for emergency response to incidents of all types in which the Incident Command System (ICS) will be employed. The course utilizes scenarios and exercises to highlight key issues and facilitate discussion. The concluding tabletop exercise is intended to allow participants an opportunity to apply the information provided during the course in a controlled environment.

This course is open to all Emergency Management, Rescue, Fire, Emergency Medical, and Law Enforcement personnel or any organization having responsibility for incident management.

<u>Pre-requisites include ICS700, ICS800b, ICS100 & ICS200. You must provide</u> completion certificates before the class.

Registration for this course must be done by following the link to www.kyem.ky.gov/training and click on register. You must also fill out the JPFA registration form and mail to the Area 1 office. You are considered accepted as a student in this class upon receipt of your application so you will not receive a letter acknowledging that acceptance.

Instructor: David Elliott, KY Emergency Management

This 2-day course, 16 hours, is intended for firefighters who are considering challenging IFSAC accredited certification. Students will get a brief overview at what the IFSAC is, its purpose and intent, how it works and how it can be beneficial to every Kentucky firefighter.

Over the course of the weekend, students will interact with instructors while they lecture in the classroom explaining the ins and outs of a testing site. Students will then have the opportunity to take multiple written practice exams of questions pulled from previous test versions. Lastly, the class will participate in hands on skills. During the skills section of the weekend students will be able to observe the instructors perform the skills, practice them with each other, and lastly be evaluated on their individual performance during the last evolutions.

*completion of this course will NOT result in certification. This course is for preparation only.

*Due to the limited time constraints, only certain skills will be practiced and/or performed.

Instructor: Chris Peeler, Area 1 State Fire/Rescue Training Chris Newton, Area 1 State Fire/Rescue Training

Instructor bio: Chris Peeler is a Captain at Hendron Fire Department. He has 23 years in the fire service. He has been an Instructor for 12 years and an Instructor for Area 1 State Fire/Rescue Training for 4 years. "I've been to a fire before."

Chris Newton serves at the Hendron Fire Department as Lieutenant and Training Officer. When not leading the training division or running emergency calls in the Land of Lime Green, he also serves as a firefighter at the Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant located in West Paducah, Ky. Chris has been an instructor for State Fire/Rescue Training for 3 years.

F016 Officer class

This Class will be an introduction to the concepts covered in IFSTA's fire officer 1 class. Subjects will include:

Transitioning to the role of company officer, Leadership, Supervision, Logic, Ethics & Decision Making, Legal Responsibilities & Liabilities, and Interpersonal Communication.

Instructor: Dickie Walls, Area 1 State Fire/Rescue Training

Instructor Bio: Dickie Walls is an instructor with State Fire Rescue Training Area 1. He has 26 years in the fire service. He retired from Murray Fire Department and currently serves as a Captain with Calloway Co. Fire Rescue.

F017 Rescue Task Force: Active Shooter / Hostile Event Response Saturday & Sunday

This course provides the student with: a history of active shooter /hostile events response, differentiation between RTF /TEMS, an overview of recommended equipment, a review of ICS related to AS/HE events, RTF team composition and movement, establishing zones, threat review, a review of START Triage, MARCH assessment, direct threat care, indirect threat care, casualty collection points, patient management, team movement, communications, scene preservation, and post-incident care for responders.

The course will encompass classroom, hands-on, individual, team-based, and scenario-based skills. Participating students are encouraged to bring department-provided PPE such as: ballistic helmet, flashlight, gloves, body armor/plate carrier, safety glasses/goggles, IFAK, and hydration system. Students should wear comfortable clothing that can get dirty. You will get dirty, sweaty, thirsty, and mentally/physically challenged. NO WEAPONS ARE ALLOWED FOR THIS COURSE! Course content will be based on current TCCC/TECC guidelines.

Instructor: Ted Deecke

Instructor Bio: Ted Deecke is a 38-year veteran of the fire service, and is currently a Fire Captain / Training Officer for Four Rivers Nuclear Partnership at the US Dept. of Energy Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant in Paducah, KY.
