Poplar, Prairie Sky			65'-80'	Fair	Fast	Fair	N	Should be the first choice on sites requiring a tall, long lived tree
Rose, Hansen Hedge			4-6'	Fair	Medium	Good	N	Rose shrub adapted to ND, suckering
Rose, Woods			1'-9'	Fair	Fast	Good	Y	The hips are dried for use in flavoring teas, jellies, fruitcakes
Seaberry			10'-18'	Fair	Fast	Good	Y	Both male and female plants are needed for fruit production
Snowberry			4'6"	Fair	Medium	Good	N	Important browse for many types of wildlife, poisonous to humans
Silverberry			5'-9'	Good	Medium	Good	N	Would be popular, but it suckers profusely
Sumac, Aromatic			3'-9'	Fair	Medium	Good	N	Good for bank stabilization
Sumac, Staghorn			10'-15'	Fair	Medium	Good	N	Borderline hardiness, may regularly freeze back in winter
Walnut, Black			35-60'	Poor	Medium	Fair	Y	Large oval to round open crown, hard shell nut
Willow, Golden			40-50'	Poor	Fast	Fair	N	Large, spreading, young stems are bright yellow
Willow, Laurel Leaf			25-40'	Poor	Fast	Good	N	Good for wetland wildlife
Willow, Sandbar			5-10'	Poor	Fast	Good	N	Suckering, good for wet areas
Willow, Sharpleaf			15'-20'	Good	Fast	Good	N	Aggressive root system, do not plant near homes
Winterberry			5'-15'	Fair	Medium	Good	N	Good provider of wildlife food, fruit is poisonous to humans.
