"And he made from one man every nation of mankind to live on all the face of the earth... that they should seek God, in the hope that they may feel their way toward him and find him. Yet he is actually not far from each one of us, for 'in him we live and move and have our being..." Acts 17: 26-28

What's the right way to celebrate? After all this *is* the season of joy and celebration, isn't it? Even though we find reasons to celebrate throughout the year these weeks are, for us, devoted to a very specific observance. Advent and Christmas take hold of the joy intended for mankind in the coming of our Savior and the meaning of his life for ours. What we're celebrating is the closeness of our connection to our God. In Christ we find the divine and the human united in one person, and in that person our unity and fellowship with God. What we're celebrating is that God became one of us so that we might be one with Him.

So how do you do that? Chances are you'll hear a lot this time of year about the meaning of the season and the right or wrong way to observe it. You'll probably hear a lot about the over-commercialization of our celebration and how we've lost sight of what the lights and songs and trees and fellowship are all about. (Can't say I disagree!) And there's a good chance you'll hear more than once the admonition to "keep Christ in Christmas". I've seen that one on signs and stickers and car decals for years. It seems like a simple enough concept and one with which few people I know would disagree. Remember that the birth of Jesus and the fellowship created between mankind and our God are the reason we are celebrating. So why do we often feel so lost when it comes to deciphering how and what to celebrate?

It's easy to say Advent and Christmas have been hijacked by the world and its consumer mentality and have therefore lost their meaning. The world has no defense against that argument. But for those of us who know the promise that comes with the narrative of this season, our joy should not be so easily challenged.

Our Lord came into this world in the most humble of circumstances to bring hope to the humblest of people. He came for the lonely and the frustrated and the broken and the weak. He came to reach out to the poor and the persecuted and the mourning and the confused. When we hear the narrative of our Lord's coming, we find that this celebration has meaning for us in the best and worst of circumstances and that its comfort is our strength wherever we find ourselves.

The peace and joy of this celebration are universal. All mankind cries out for the comfort of Christ, and so all celebrations are opportunities to give thanks for this comfort. The right way to celebrate is simply to celebrate. When you smile and hold close to others in fellowship of any kind, Christ is in your Christmas. When you give a gift that lights up a face, Christ is in your Christmas. And when you quietly call out to God on your own for His companionship and grace, Christ is in your Christmas. Where there is joy there is unity with God's Spirit, and the hope of His eternal fellowship.

May this season and its celebration find you in praise and thanksgiving for your unity with the Lord, and may that unity bring joy to you and those you meet.
