The minutes of the July 23, 2018 meeting approved as corrected. Minutes for the special meeting on July 30, 2018 approved as corrected.

**CORRESPONDENCE:** Bills presented to be paid. Flood II motioned to pay the bills, Nichols 2<sup>nd</sup>, 6 yeas motion carried.

**SAFETY COMMITTEE:** The police department would like council to look into a time clock for use by the department. The cost would be \$118.99. Tony Flood II would also like council to look into funds for a new spotlight for 561. The cost would be \$145.00. The fiscal officer will looking into funding for both and report back at the August 27<sup>th</sup> meeting. School is starting Wednesday and the mayor would like an officer to be at the municipal building for bus loading/unloading.

**STREETS, SIDEWALKS, DRAINS, AND DITCHES COMMITTEE:** The mayor is going to look into getting estimates for cold patch for potholes around the village. He will also get estimates from Mechanicsburg Sand and Gravel for gravel for Owner's Drive. The county painted street lines on Main and Mulberry. Tony Flood motioned for the bill to be paid upon arrival, Tony Flood II 2<sup>nd</sup>, 6 yeas, motion carried.

**FINANCE:** Proposed budget is due to the county by November 1<sup>st</sup>. It needs to be presented to council by Sept. 10. The fiscal officer is still waiting for balances due on the cruisers. Bank Reconciliations will be caught up by the Sept. 10<sup>th</sup> meeting to help with making the budget.

**BUILDING COMMITTEE:** Still trying to find a permanent solution to getting the bats out of the park building.

**PARKS & RECREATION:** The current Christmas tree needs to be removed. The meeting on August 27<sup>th</sup> will be extended to handle business pertaining to the hog roast and car show. The playground portion of the community park will be closed until necessary repairs are completed. Steve Heider motioned for the closure, Tony Flood II 2<sup>nd</sup>, 6 yeas, motioned carried.

**CITIZENS COMMENTS:** Mayor Smith let council know the block party held by the events committee was a success with 30-40 people showing up.
