The minutes for August 27, 2018 were presented for review. Approved as corrected

No new ordinances presented.

CORRESPONDENCE: Monthly bills presented. Motion to pay by Tony Flood II, second by Tony Flood, 5 years, motioned carried. Tony Flood II motioned that the audit papers be signed and sent back with no conference, 2nd by Steve Heider, 5 years, motioned carried. It was decided that nothing needs to be done about the First Energy Bankruptcy.

SAFETY COMMITTEE: New officer Kyle Toedtman was sworn in. Officer qualifying will be Oct. 10 at 10:30 a.m. The officers will need ammunition. Motion for the mayor to buy 3 xl rain coats for the cruisers and truck by Tony Flood, 2nd by Tony Flood II, 5 years, motioned carried.

FINANCE: The budget will be submitted at the next meeting. Chief Nelson has requested a gas budget of \$10,000 since it is the fall back for the rest of their needs.

BUILDING COMMITTEE:

STREETS, SIDEWALKS, DRAINS, AND DITCHES COMMITTEE: Many of the potholes around the village have been filled thank to Tony Flood, Tony Flood II, Sergeant Chad Duncan, and Mark Sanders.
