Member Profile - Stephen Bunney

Bermagui George Bass Marathon Competitor

Bermagui Patroller, Steve Bunney, took part in the recent George Bass Marathon. A veteran of 4 GBM races in a surfboat and one on a spec ski, Steve took on the challenge this year on a surf ski. In a testament to his character and perseverance Steve battled through a couple of tough days healthwise early on to take out 4th place overall in an incredible achievement in what can be a long, lonely race for the ski paddlers. The reception he received when coming into his home club beach at Bermagui certainly gave him a lift so thanks to everyone who came down to cheer him home.

Chatting with Steve after the race, he wanted to express his "sincere thanks and gratitude to everyone involved and who gave their time and support to the race". He also made in important comment on something that we sometimes lose sight of when there's a race or competition involved. "I strongly believe that events like the GBM demonstrate the capacity and competency of local people volunteering through their local surf clubs to engage in co-ordinated, complex, multi-day, multi-craft all weather operations in the Pacific and Southern Oceans. This is no small thing and I think that it's just marvellous". Steve's comment was spurred by the realisation that if there were boaters who got into trouble anywhere near the GBM there was certainly no shortage of skill and expertise out there able to respond.

In his long involvement with Surf Life Saving (when Steve renewed his membership with Bermagui three years ago the database said he'd first been a member in 1901 but we're pretty sure he's not quite that old!) spanning over 30 years, Steve has also competed for Narooma and Broulee Surf Clubs (check out his Broulee Member Profile on the right from many years ago).





Although still living in Dalmeny, in recent years he and his son, Harrison, found a good fit at Bermagui SLSC and we're thrilled to have him on the team.
