Pastoral Letter from the Interim Moderator

Dear Friends

Recent weeks, with mist and showers, have changed our grass from yellowish brown to lush green and....it's getting longer! This used to give me a sinking feeling, as I knew that soon I'd have to haul out the lawn-mower, struggle to fix it (because it would never work right away) get more petrol for the portable can (yes, always just enough in the mower for about half the grass, then it would run out), drag it up and down the slope and round the rocky outcrops, and then start fixing the strimmer for the rough patches and edges. Then last year, the mower finally packed in. A disaster? Yes, but what it actually meant was we "had to get someone in", paying them to cut the grass with their own equipment, at what in the end turned out to be a very reasonable rate. The professional just seemed to breeze effortlessly over the slopes, lumps and rocky outcrops of the garden, barely breaking sweat and accomplishing in a few short hours, what it would have taken me a whole day to do. It was done, and the price duly paid, and every time it was needed, it was done again. So, nowadays I look at the lengthening grass without fear.... because I know it's taken care of. It's a worldly and shallow example of course, but it did make me think about that far deeper and eternal task, the work of my salvation, which I could never accomplish for myself, and which, no matter how I tried, had eventually broken me. But my "breaking down" at last, was the best thing that ever happened in my life, because I invited Someone "in" at last, to do for me what I couldn't do for myself. Like the grass, my Salvation, and the forgiveness of my sin, is an ongoing task, needs constant attention, and is beyond me to do. But it's not beyond Christ. So I don't have to be afraid now, because it's all taken care of. The price is paid, but it wasn't me who paid it, and yet the work is accomplished. Ongoing, and yet complete. It is finished. *"The grass withereth, the flower fadeth: but the word of our God shall stand for ever."* (Isaiah 40:8)

But still, many of us, I imagine, are keeping an eye, day by day, on the news, and the press briefings from both Edinburgh and London, listening for, longing for, any sign that things might at last be coming under control, and returning to "normal". That seems a long way off for now. As was pointed out by the First Minister, there are dangers in exposure to the Coronavirus, but there are dangers too in Lockdown. So, the "phased return", when it comes, is likely to be a balancing act of the respective risks.

This life however has **always been** a balancing act of risks. The Coronavirus has made us all perhaps more **conscious** of our mortality – but the fact is that **any** of us could **always** have ended our days suddenly or tragically by any number of unforeseen circumstances. We are more aware too, perhaps, of our human **vulnerability**, and although our leaders have for the most part stepped up nobly to their responsibilities, they cannot actually do anything to save us. The press briefings are helpful and may even give some of us more hope, but they also underline our vulnerability and helplessness in the face of the virus. So these realities, which were always the case in life, we are now perhaps able to appreciate more accurately.

So whether this immediate threat passes soon or not, we will have to go on taking sensible precautions yes, but we ought not to succumb to any "spirit of fear" – because that is not honouring to the Lord. *"For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind."* (2nd Timothy 1:7) There is no doubt that we are **all** being shaken and tested, each in our different ways. One person's struggle will not be the same as someone else's, but whatever memories, good or bad, we are building at this time of trial, **what** we build **does** matter, yes, but **WHO** we build **upon**, matters not only for this time, but for eternity. (1st Corinthians 3:11)


