Pastoral Letter from the Interim Moderator

Dear Friends

As you will know, we recently held a congregation-wide Consultation about the future use of our buildings. These things **do matter**, but we are all, I'm sure, very conscious that "The Church" is neither about buildings, nor is it **contained within** any building, since "The Church" is the people of God. Jesus said, *"For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them."* (St Matthew 18:20). We have always known this in **theory**. But we live now in strange and testing times when we are compelled to live out the "two or three" rule in **practice**, indeed for many of us, (perhaps for most of us) there may not even <u>be</u> two or three people at home with us, much less two or three who are fellow believers.

What if we are alone in the house? Are we still part of the Body, The Church? We need never worry on that score. Our Lord Himself often sought out opportunity specifically to BE alone with His Father, so that He would be free, without distraction, to pray to Him and draw strength from Him. Was His Father less with Him, because Jesus was not in company with others? *"Am I a God at hand, saith the LORD, and not a God afar off? Can any hide himself in secret places that I shall not see him? saith the LORD. Do not I fill heaven and earth? saith the LORD."* (Jeremiah 23:23,24) Some of our brothers and sisters in Christ have been housebound for months or years. In one sense now, we are ALL "housebound". But we do not cease thereby, to BE the Church of Jesus Christ, provided we continue to maintain that fellowship with the LORD Himself and, as far as we are able, by safe means, with His people.

Although everything just now is a bit strange for all of us, the Word of God says "To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven." (Ecclesiastes 3:1) If we think, for example, about the sufferings and death of Our Lord - at the time, it all seemed like a disaster to those who loved Him (St Luke 24:21). But on the road to Emmaus, and many times throughout His earthly ministry, Jesus showed His disciples that nothing is ever for nothing. Nothing is wasted. And just as His sufferings were not for nothing, neither will ours be, if we are trusting in Him. These times of trial are for a purpose and in the meantime we must each do what we can. ALL of us can pray – and perhaps many of us have more peace, and less distraction, in which to do so, than we have had in a long time. As you will know, the Presbytery has appointed **Every** Monday from 8.00pm to 9.00pm as a time to pause and to pray. It doesn't mean you have to spend the whole hour in Prayer, but at some point during that hour, pause what you are doing, lay it aside, take up your Bible, read a short portion, and pray for our country, for the world, for the Church, for the afflicted, the frightened, the sick and the bereaved (see separate arrangements for Zoom prayer meeting) Also, ask the LORD to show you something that you, personally, might be able to do to help. We have been all been much frustrated by the restrictions which dictate what we can't do. But I think we will each become surprised and perhaps amazed by how much we still CAN....and perhaps **should**.....be doing. Remember the words of Jesus about the woman with the alabaster jar of ointment: "She hath done what she could." The LORD will never ask more of us than that. He will never blame us for what we couldn't do. But I think He might want us to rediscover just how much we CAN. Let's try and make that part of our focus for the week ahead.

In the meantime, please look after yourselves, stay safe, but above all, keep your faith in Christ and put your trust in Him.

We have been monitoring the situation very closely, following Government advice and consulting with our partners. Over the past few days, the national and local picture has changed immensely. It is also now clear that whatever the situation is in the summer there will still be significant restrictions in place.

Please pray for FCYC as we go through the more practical aspects of cancelling the camps and for those whose livelihoods are affected by this decision.

FCYC would like to express a personal note of gratitude to all the leaders and cooks of the camps for their support and dedication to the young people of our church over the years. The work and prayers they have already put into this year's camps will not be wasted; nothing ever is in God's economy.

We would also like to thank those who had booked to go to camp. FCYC will be looking to arrange some kind of event as soon as practical, later in the year. These are unprecedented times. We are praying for the many who are affected in different ways during this crisis, and especially the youth of our church for whom we run the camps each summer.
