Some dates for your diaries:

The Angel Festival is on the weekend of 29th and 30th September. On the Saturday evening, the Langcliffe Monthly Strummers will be performing a selection of Angel songs in Church and there will be refreshments—details to be announced. We are serving Teas in the Institute on the Sunday. Harvest Festival is on Sunday 14th October and we are planning a concert for Remembrance on Saturday 17th November.

On Sunday 4th August 1918, the 4th anniversary of the declaration of war, King George V and Queen Mary joined members of parliament in the Church of St Margaret, Westminster. The King had asked that 4th August 1918 should be a Day of Prayer. One hundred days later, on 11th November 1918, the war ended.

This year churches and cathedrals in villages, suburbs and cities will start 100 days of prayer for reconciliation. Remembrance 100 is being promoted by the organisation HOPE Together, supported by the Church of England, the Methodists and other denominations.
