Jennifer Armstrong	Treasurer's Report	 Afton reported that concessions made just over \$4,000. Teacher's must turn in receipts by May 1st for reimbursement from their teacher grant funds.
Jennifer Hauser	Principal's Report	 Easley received our allotment. We will likely be down 2.5 positions. Lora Kirse will not be returning & Deanna St. John is retiring. Book Room Update - Examples of some of the materials PTA has helped purchase were passed around.
Ray Alban & Rena Norwood	Book Room Funding Request	 Mr. Alban shared some of the ways the book room purchases have enhanced their teaching and he explained how the materials are utilized by teachers. Over the last few years PTA has helped fund many of the purchases that have helped continue to make out book room such a great resource for parents. Mrs. Norwood spoke about some of the other grants they have done to get things for the book room as well. They are ready to purchase another set of the guided reading materials that come with more titles and guided lessons. Cost of 300 titles and lessons - \$12,246.93 Motion was made and vote made for approval to fund the request for the 300 new titles and lessons. Funds will come from the excess money raised this year thru our Apex Fundraiser.
May 1st Teacher Rally	Teresa Parkinson	 Ms. Parkinson came to share with PTA about the May 1st teacher really in Raleigh. She shared that DPS and the City of Durham are supporting the teachers as they plan to rally. She asked PTA for visible support online thru social media.
