

## **Taking the Narrow Way**

"Enter through the *narrow gate*. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is *the gate* and *narrow* the road that leads to life and only a few find it."

Matthew 7:13-14, New International Version - NIV

**People are presented with two ways, represented by two gates—one gate** is narrow, the other is wide. \*Jesus commanded his followers to enter God's Kingdom only through the narrow gate. This gateway is small, and the road is narrow, but it alone leads to life—eternal life. \*Through the wide gate, however, the highway to hell is broad and it seems to be the easy way. There is plenty of room for many people to wander in and continue in whatever direction they wish - This road leads to hell, and eternal separation from God. \*The gateway leading to life is small not because it is difficult to become a Christian but because there is only one way and only a few decide to walk that road. Believing in Jesus is the only way to eternal life because he alone died for our sins and made us right before God, in Love.

So <u>Love</u> is the *narrow way*, but *some* believers seem to think that walking *in love* is optional. Sometimes, we act as if we have the right to take offence if we want to...or act rudely and unkindly when we aren't in a good mood. And we do it without ever realizing we are in sin. "Sin?" you might think that's a pretty strong word." And I know it is, but it's the right word. In short, sin is when we exercise our will - over God's. And if we are going to walk in the blessing and the abundant life of God, we'd better quit making excuses for it, and call it what it is, or we will be 'weak and whiny'.

<u>Love</u> is God's *commandment* to us - It's *not* His suggestion. It's *not* His preference - It's *a* command. When we're *not* walking in love, we're in disobedience to that command - In *other* words, we're in sin. **Jesus said in John 14:15 KJV** <sup>15</sup> If ye *love me*, keep my commandments.

We don't have to go kill someone or commit adultery to be in disobedience to God and we don't have to swear or cheat on our taxes. All the devil has to do to get us into sin; is to convince us to walk in selfishness, to put ourselves first and ignore others. To put us on the road of destruction, all he has to do is get us to walk another way—any other way—than love. I know that keeping the Command of love sounds difficult, and if we were doing it in our own strength it would be - In fact, it would be impossible.

But you're not doing it in your own strength - You're born again — You're a <u>new creation</u> in Christ, right? You have a Savior who shed His blood so you can have the *life* and *love* of God inside you - You have been <u>empowered</u> by God Himself to <u>love</u> as He loves. Ephesians 6:10 NLT says; here is a final word: Be strong with the Lord's mighty power.
