



# BAPTISM OF THE LORD: At the river's edge

John tried to prevent [Jesus from being baptized, but] Jesus said to him in reply, "Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness..."

... a voice came from the heavens, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

Matthew 3: 13-17

What would be the last thing you would give up?

What would be the last possession you would cling to before you had to let go? Some of us would hold on to our phones or laptops or tablets for dear life - our entire lives are on that chip!

Or: They'll have to pry my credit card from my cold, dead hand!

Or, though we would never admit it, we would cling to our pride: our professional credentials, the reputation and respect that we have earned over a long career, the expertise or craft or art we have worked so hard to master. To the bitter end, we would refuse to surrender those things that make us better than others (at least in our own eyes), that justify our standing apart and above those of lesser accomplishment, that put us (so we believe) in a position to judge those we consider lesser lights.

Maybe the last thing we would give up is our identity as a spouse or a parent or a grandparent. No one could ever take that away — could they?

But that is exactly what happens at the River Jordan. Jesus leaves everything at the river's edge — including his very divinity. John, the fiery preacher who presides at those baptisms, is embarrassed by Jesus' coming forward for baptism. But Jesus insists. He empties himself of all that he is. He becomes the slave, the poor laborer, the leper, the forgotten man or woman he is standing next to in line. He plunges headlong into the dark, dirty water of the human condition.

And, as Matthew the Gospel writer notes, some remarkable things happen.

But the most remarkable of all: God is in our midst. God plunges with us into the turbulent waters of our days.

It's just a matter of what we're willing to surrender — and in what amount.

To be baptized into Christ requires, first, that we let go of those things that we place ahead of the holy; to empty ourselves of our self-importance and pride in order to embrace the life of God that is manifested in the self-less compassion of Jesus — but, because of such humility, something new is possible, not just for us but for all of humanity: justice for the poor and enslaved can be imagined, reconciliation among the estranged and divided becomes a reality; our compassion can heal the broken-hearted. Hope that gives birth to new life, light that shatters the darkness of despair, love that lifts the fallen all become realistic possibilities-if we follow the lead of Jesus and let go and surrender our interests and needs for something greater.

In 2003, Bill Harrison and Judy Wade took 8 teens to Catholic Heart Workcamp in Rockford, IL. Our son, Zach, was one of those brave kids who said "yes" to serving others. When he returned home, he said that he wanted to go again the following summer asked, "Mom, will you help?". I freely admit I was hesitant to commit to one more thing, but his enthusiasm convinced me to step up. One of the most impactful decisions I have ever made. Now I am asking for you to step up. # YOU ARE INVITED TO SERVE AT MASS

At Mass, Christ is present in the Readings and the Eucharist and Christ is present in all Ministers. The "action" of Ministry brings Christ present to the assembly. The Ministers are the conduit to Christ's presence at the Mass. God invites all of us to His table, to the Eucharist to receive Him. And we come, all of us, with our weaknesses and struggles, to hear the Word of God and receive his strength and forgiveness in the Eucharist. Father Rick and parishioners, who serve at Mass, are doing what Jesus taught us – serving others. We ask you to consider serving at Mass, in whatever way suits you.

#### ALTAR SERVERS

Altar Servers can be a family or a couple or a single person. The tasks can be modified to accommodate the amount of participants. Altar serving involves leading the procession in and out of Mass with the cross and setting the altar at the offertory time.

#### **EUCHARIST MINISTERS**

Ministers of the Eucharist assist Father with the distribution of Holy Communion. Serving the Host or the cup is special as you are blessed to bring Jesus to others as well as connect with parishioners individually.

#### **MUSIC MINISTRY**

We so appreciate those parishioners who share the gift of song that God has blessed them with. With three different Masses the music ministry welcomes more people to be involved as a musician or a singer. For anyone who has a talent of music we hope you will consider participating.

#### **READERS**

We want readers who feel comfortable being in front of the congregation and have the talent to speak with inflection, slowly and audibly to proclaim scripture.

Please consider being an Altar Server, Reader, Eucharist Minister or part of Music Ministry. With any position, you will be trained and instructed so you feel comfortable in your service. You also have complete control over what Mass time and how often you serve.

Scheduling is tailored to our personal availability. Every minister has easy access to the schedule on line. Each of us provide specific dates when we are available. We also can limit how often we serve. Even once a schedule is active, and a conflict arises, it is a simple matter to request a sub.

# THE HUNGER FOR BLESSING

In his book Against an Infinite Horizon: The Finger of God in Our Everyday Lives, Father Ronald Rolheiser writes of preaching on Jesus' baptism one year and remarking that the words God speaks over Jesus — "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased" — are words that God speaks over us, every day of our lives.

Father Rolheiser was later approached by a young man who had heard the sermon and was both moved — and distraught — by the priest's words. Father Rolheiser writes:

"[The young man] had not been to church for some time but had gone on this particular Sunday because he had, just that week, pleaded guilty to a crime and was awaiting sentence. He was soon to go to prison. The sermon had struck a painful chord inside him because, first of all, he had trouble believing that God, or anyone else, loved him; yet he wanted to believe it. Secondly, and even more painful, he believed that nobody had ever been pleased or delighted with him: 'Father, I know that in my whole life nobody has ever been pleased with me. I was never good enough! Nobody has ever taken delight in anything I've ever done!' This man had never been blessed. Small wonder he was about to go to prison."

Then Father Rolheiser recalls how different his own family experience was:

"When I left home as a seventeen-year-old boy, my father and mother blessed me. They made me kneel on the old linoleum floor of our kitchen, placed their hands on my head, and said the ritual words of Christian blessing. In effect, however, what they were saying to me was: We love you, we trust you, we are proud of you, and we send you off with our full spirit. You are our beloved child and in you we are well pleased. I suspect that had the young man I spoke [with] had been blessed in the same way by his parents, or by anyone else significant to him, he would not have been on his way to prison. To be unblessed is to be bleeding in a very deep place.

"So much of our hunger is a hunger for blessing. So much of our aching is the ache to be blessed. So much of our sadness comes from the fact that nobody has ever taken delight and pleasure in us . . . When has anyone ever made you the object of delight? When has anyone taken . . . delight in . . . your beauty, your intelligence, your person? When have you last felt that you are someone in whom others, and God, take pleasure and delight?"

In Baptism, God claims us as his own, expressing his delight in us as his own beloved daughters and sons. From the waters of our baptisms, God then sends us forth to be a source of blessing to others: the work of reconciliation and forgiveness revealing to others that they are loved by God; the work of justice that honors the dignity of every human being as made in God's image; the work of peace that realizes God's vision for the world God so lovingly fashioned. On this feast of the Lord's Baptism, may we hear the Father's expression of joy in his beloved Son as addressed to us, as well and, with gratitude, may we seek to be God's "blessing" to all.

OFFICE OF THE BISHOP

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

Last month we consecrated our Diocese to Our Lady of Guadalupe with the intention to live our faith more boldly and to use our Blessed Mother as an inspiration to accomplish great things. We now take a step forward together with a renewed sense of mission and commitment to live the Gospel message.

The work of our Catholic schools is a living example of the Gospel message. To see the students, our teachers, administrators and our principals, dedicated to education and service gives me great joy and hope that we can provide a future for our children. A future that is a demonstration of God's kingdom at work, where disciples are formed and our youth are prepared to serve the community under God's blessings of mercy and justice.

There is a special collection next weekend (January 18/19) that supports the Foundation for Catholic Education's annual scholarship program. This program provides needs-based grants to children attending a Catholic elementary or high school in our Diocese.
