SAINT ITA - JANUARY 15TH (A.D. 570)



Who was your favorite teacher? Perhaps it was your first-grade teacher who taught you to read and instilled a love of books. Or your grandmother who taught you how to bake a pie or sew a straight seam. Or a mentor who taught you how to survive the rigors of your first job.

Anyone lucky enough to have been profoundly influenced by a teacher owes a debt of gratitude. Teachers do more than instruct; they change lives. They help us see the world in a new way. Most of all, they help us see ourselves and our potential in ways we might never have seen without them.

St. Ita lived in Ireland in the sixth century in what is now the county of Limerick. Among her other ventures, she founded a boys' school. There, for five years, she taught a young lad

by the of Brendan. He, in his turn, grew up to become famous in his own right as an abbot, missionary, and saint. In Brendan's biographies, St. Ita is cited as one of the primary influences of his early life.

One of the greatest gifts we can give those who have taught us is our thanks.

The wedding gift

Among the many gifts Brandon and Kathy Gunn received at their wedding was a white box from Kathy's Aunt Alison. The card on the box read, *Do not open until first argument.*

So they dutifully placed the unwrapped gift on the top shelf of their kitchen pantry.

Sure enough, there were moments of tension and disagreement, but Brandon and Kathy refused to open the gift. Despite the hard words and slammed doors, the couple saw opening the box as a sign of failure - they believed that their love for one another could handle whatever life threw at them. The white box became a challenge.

In May, the couple, now the parents of two children, celebrated their ninth anniversary. That's when they decided to open Aunt Alison's box. Not because they needed to but because they were convinced they would never have to.

What they found in Aunt Alison's box was remarkably unremarkable: some money for flowers, pizza and take-out, a bottle of wine, some bath salts - nothing that could really end a fight at all, just bring a moment to stop and regroup.

And that's when it hit them, that the real gift wasn't anything in the box - that the real gift, the priceless gift, had been staring at them all along.

By not turning to the box, Brandon and Kathy were forced to learn tolerance, compromise and patience.

That was the real gift. And they possessed it all along.

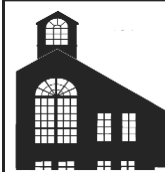
The little voices shouted out, "Heaven!"

SUNDAY REFLECTION: "ARRIVAL"

The new movie **Arrival** is not your typical sci-fi, alien-invaders film. It's much smarter than that.

Twelve spaceships - immense black monoliths - have descended at points around the world. The news coverage is predictably hysterical. Each major nation has its UFO to contend with, and there is fractious squabbling between governments: while scientists want to share information with their colleagues around the world, each nation's generals want to keep what they know classified as they prepare to launch missiles on their own terms. Humans seem to be fighting a non-existent war on two fronts: with the aliens and with each other.

Dr. Louise Banks is a linguistics expert brought in by the United States Army and the CIA to try to make contact with the aliens in the vessel hovering over Montana. The aliens want to communicate with us but the military types have no idea how to go about it. Dr. Banks enters the black egg-like structure and meets the aliens. Their first meeting is both wondrous and terrifying, but soon the gentleness of these creatures edges out Dr. Banks' fear and contact is established.

The "heptapods," as they are called, begin making circular symbols in response to Banks' hand-lettered signs. Over time, Dr. Banks manages to decode the symbols and begins to understand not only why they have come but how they think and perceive. While the world has been plunged into fear, panic and crisis, Dr. Banks and the aliens go about their work calmly and patiently.

Not to give the story away - and be warned, there are some surprises in this puzzle of a movie - but the visitors have come to seek help from the people of earth. They come, not with weapons to destroy, but with a "gift" - a gift of insight and understanding that Louise Banks, with patience, openness of heart and compassion, manages to decipher.

The film *Arrival* is a parable about communication and understanding, about the power of humility and generosity of heart. Dr. Banks is challenged to do what John the Baptist challenges his hearers to do in today's Gospel: to keep our senses, our intellects and our hearts open to realize the presence of God in our midst; to "behold the Lamb of God" in the conflicts and complexities of our lives; to realize and lift up God's mercy and compassion in times and places that seem devoid of God; to perceive the light of God's grace in the life's darkest moments and hopeless storms. May we reflect the light of Christ's compassion within us, enabling us to illuminate new ways of understanding and reconciliation in this time and space we share.
