FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK....

Dear Friends,

During the short span of 10 months after his installation, Bishop James Checchio has visited all the 90 parishes of the diocese. He had visited our parish last year for the Confirmation. Since it was a weekday, the larger community of the parish didn't get a chance to meet him. So I'm happy to inform you that Bishop Checchio will be with us presiding at the 10:30 Mass on Sunday, April 2. It is an opportunity for all of us to meet our chief Shepherd in person and listen to his message. I'm sure that as many of you can come for this occasion will.

This weekend our St. John's Community Garden is open for the 2017 growing season. "Laudato Si," the historic encyclical of Pope Francis, has encouraged the world to take a closer look at how we are shaping the future of our planet, that Francis calls "our common home." We have every reason to be proud of our little contribution in translating some of the ideas of Laudato Si, especially these words of the Pope: *"Tilling' refers to cultivating, ploughing or working, while 'keeping' means caring, protecting, overseeing and preserving. This implies a relationship of mutual responsibility between human beings and nature. Each community can take from the bounty of the earth whatever it needs for subsistence, but it also has the duty to protect the earth and to ensure its fruitfulness for coming generations"* (LS #67)

This month is the fourth anniversary of the papacy of Francis. Four years ago on March 13, Jorge Bergoglio inherited the throne of St. Peter with the request, "Pray for me". His teachings and examples of pastoral accompaniment and consultative process are leading the Church on a different trajectory with his focus on God's mercy, the joy of love, ministry to the poor and sensitivity to those who are struggling to live the ideal of marriage. No wonder recent surveys show Pope Francis' popularity has increased to "almost 90 per cent" in the United States during the last few months, stated David Gibson, a Catholic reporter and prize-winning author, who said that many Catholics see in Francis *"a kind of pastor in a parish that so many of us have known. There is something, at once, so unremarkable about it and yet, at the same time, the fact that he's Pope makes him so remarkable."* May we benefit from the invaluable teachings of Francis who is calling us to learn and live the mind of Jesus our Lord.

WHY CONFESSION? SAVE THE DATE WED., APRIL 5TH 7PM

Penance, aka confession, is the sacrament of the forgiveness of sin. You can't beat it for convenience. It's available practically whenever. Tell a priest you want to go to confession and you'll get his attention. One bishop I know was cornered on an airplane. Another passenger figured out what was going on and asked if he could confess too. It must have been an interesting game of musical seats. An interesting question for priests might be: Where was the strangest place you ever administered the sacrament of penance? The answers I've gathered include "in a sports bar, at a graduation party" and "on the golf course, walking up the fairway." Confession has benefits. Here are two:

1. Confidentiality guaranteed. There's nothing like confessing your sins to someone guaranteed not to tell anyone else. Sometimes you need to talk in absolute confidence. Even under subpoena, a priest can't tell anyone what's said to him in confession. He can't even hint at it. Now that's confidentiality.

2. Housekeeping for the soul. It feels good to be able to start a clean life all over again. Like going into a sparkling living room in your home, it's nice when clutter is removed – even if it's your own.

SUNDAY REFLECTION: Modern Spiritual Blindness

Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, because he does not keep the sabbath." The blind man said: "One thing I do know is that I was blind and now I see." John 9:1-41

A country preacher was listening to a seminary professor cast doubt on the core issues of the Faith and the authenticity of the claims of Jesus. When the professor finished his lecture, the elderly pastor got up, took an apple from his lunch bag and started eating it as he said, "Mr. Professor, I haven't read many of them books you quoted." Then he took another bite of the apple. "Mr. Professor, I don't know much about the great thinkers you mentioned," as he took still another bite of his apple. "Mr. Professor, I admit I haven't studied the Bible like you have," as he finished his apple and dropped it back in the bag. "I was just wondering, this apple that I just ate, was it sour or sweet? The Professor responded, "How could I know? I haven't tasted your apple." To which the old preacher replied, "With all due respect, sir, I was just wondering if you had ever had a taste of my Jesus?" The blind man says, "Whether or not the cure was approved by the FDA, *I once was blind, but now I see.*" You all argue and explain all you want, but that's enough for me.

Although the Pharisees have long since disappeared from history, there are still many among us who are blinded by the same pride and prejudice. Spiritual blindness is very common in modern times. Perhaps, the most awful disease in our country today is spiritual blindness. Such blindness refuses to see the truths of God's revelation. This blindness refuses even to admit that God or Christ exists. In their pride, the spiritually blind claim that everything ends with death and that there is no life after death. They propagate their errors and accuse believers of childish credulity and folly. They ignore the gifts of the intellect we all possess. God's revelation through Christ informs us that there is a future life awaiting us in which our spiritual faculties and our transformed bodies will be fully and fittingly glorified. According to Pope Benedict XVI, the miracle of the healing of the blind man is a sign that Christ wants not only to give us sight, but also open our interior vision, so that our faith may become ever deeper and we may recognize Him as our only Savior. He illuminates all that is dark in life and leads men and women to live as "children of the light" (Lenten message-2011).
